



















A Message From The Principal...

This year has been another outstanding one for our bands. Six different bands have performed over 50 concerts and festivals with more than 7 000 people hearing them. In October, Intermediate Jazz played at the Provincial Music Educators Conference, and later in November the Symphonic Band played for 1 000 delegates at the Manitoba Health Organizations Conference at the unearthly hour of 8:00 a.m. The usual Christmas concerts played to packed houses, and the Symphonic Band was the first ever concert band to play in the Legislative Buildings, for the members of open house.

February saw all three jazz bands travel to Bemidji to play in the BMSU jazz festival. Later in the month at the Optimist Festival all concert bands won gold awards, and jazz bands were awarded two gold and one silver. In April Mr. Bruce was involved in a demolition derby on St. Anne's Road, but fortunately Mr. K was able to take over the bands, and at Musicfest Canada in Edmonton they were awarded four gold medals.

In the final concert Krystal Kastes summed up the significance of her six years of music education by quoting Dr. Frank Bencriscutto. "Music offers a phenomenon wherein may be expressed the highest feelings to which humanity has arisen. The destiny of music education is to teach us to love this great force not as an amusement, or merely an ornament, but for its enobling energy, for its power of making us better by arousing within each individual a perception of what is good, just, and beautiful."




















Glenlawn Curling Club




















































Valedictory Address

At present we are witnesses to many changes in society. Womans equality for instance, who would have thought even 10 years ago that Canada would have a female Prime Minister?


