



Congratulations are due to our girls' basketball team, the "Glenlawn Lionesses", who once again wear the crown of Suburban Supremacy.



#### JOHN SPRINGER



### Inter-High Council

On behalf of the Inter-Hi Council—the organization of Presidents and Vice-Presidents of all Greater Winnipeg high schools, I would like to extend warmest thanks and appreciation for the enthusiasm with which Glenlawn students have reacted to the various Inter-High projects undertaken this year. Outstanding of these was, as usual, the Variety Concert at Tec-Voc, held Jan. 29-31, three evenings instead of the two of former years. Glenlawn was topped in ticket sales only by Daniel McIntyre and Tec-Voc—two much larger schools.



Unfortunately our Blood Doners Drive did not go over too well. At the same time


