Saint Vital—City

When the fifth session of the twenty-sixth legislature has passed Bill 33, Manitoba will have a 'city' called Saint Vital. It may be a little pretentious for a suburb with 27,000 people and \$35 million in property to aspire to such a title, but as Mr. Groves has averred in the solemnity of the provincial legislature, "City" sounds much better."

People have always lived in St. Vital, in a steady parish-farming sort of way, so that it is perhaps only just that a charter be granted here, when the residents around Catfish Creek, Sturgeon River, and Frog Plain all feel important enough to be cited. Surely the people living between the Main Branch of the Red River and The Little River, called by the French-Canadians 'le Seine', are as couth and pompous?

In 1908 the lists of parish lots, or River Lots were turned over to the official Land Titles Office. Property then was owned by: McIver, Jetté, Allard, Sansregret, Nault, Beaudreau, Carriere, Dumas, Perriault, Jolicoeur, Gaudry, Reid, Hamlin, Racette, Morin, Laurence, Larocque, Canada, Ducharme, Pepin, Beauchemin, Bruce, Deschambeau, Plouffe (alias Batisse Gervais), Sauve, Louis Riel (senior, lot 51) Larimer, Marion, Duissian, Dubois, Flodieux . . .

Back then, the third generation of Lagimodieres were itching to get at spring planting, and Louis Riel, the miller of the Seine, was checking the grist stones . . . (or was he playing out his putt on the fifth green of Windsor Golf Course?)

In either case,, his Irish temper would be flaring. The Reverend J. M. Lestanc, O.M.I., claimed Riel's family name was really O'Reilly. In any case, he terrified the 'Company' men. His son, Louis, of the rebellion business, terrified them more.

St. Vital earned its name from confusion. A new school and chapel erected by Bishop Tache in 1860, was named after Bishop Vital Grandin, his coadjutor. The Red River split the territory, and split the name. Today we have Grandin school with the refugees west of the river, and St. Vital on the east.

In the the same era, a group of market gardeners bought land from some of the early buffalo hunters, to form a close knit community near the present junction of the two Roads. Hulton, Todd, Mager, Guay, Hack, Pauls, Racete, were some of these early ones. Among them, Victor Mager, who earned pennies as a boy picking peas and beans behind uncle George Emmerling's hotel downtown, became the first mayor of St. Vital. He lived in a spacious home where the Elm Park Apartments now stand. The offspring of the gardeners flourished in the early 1900's.

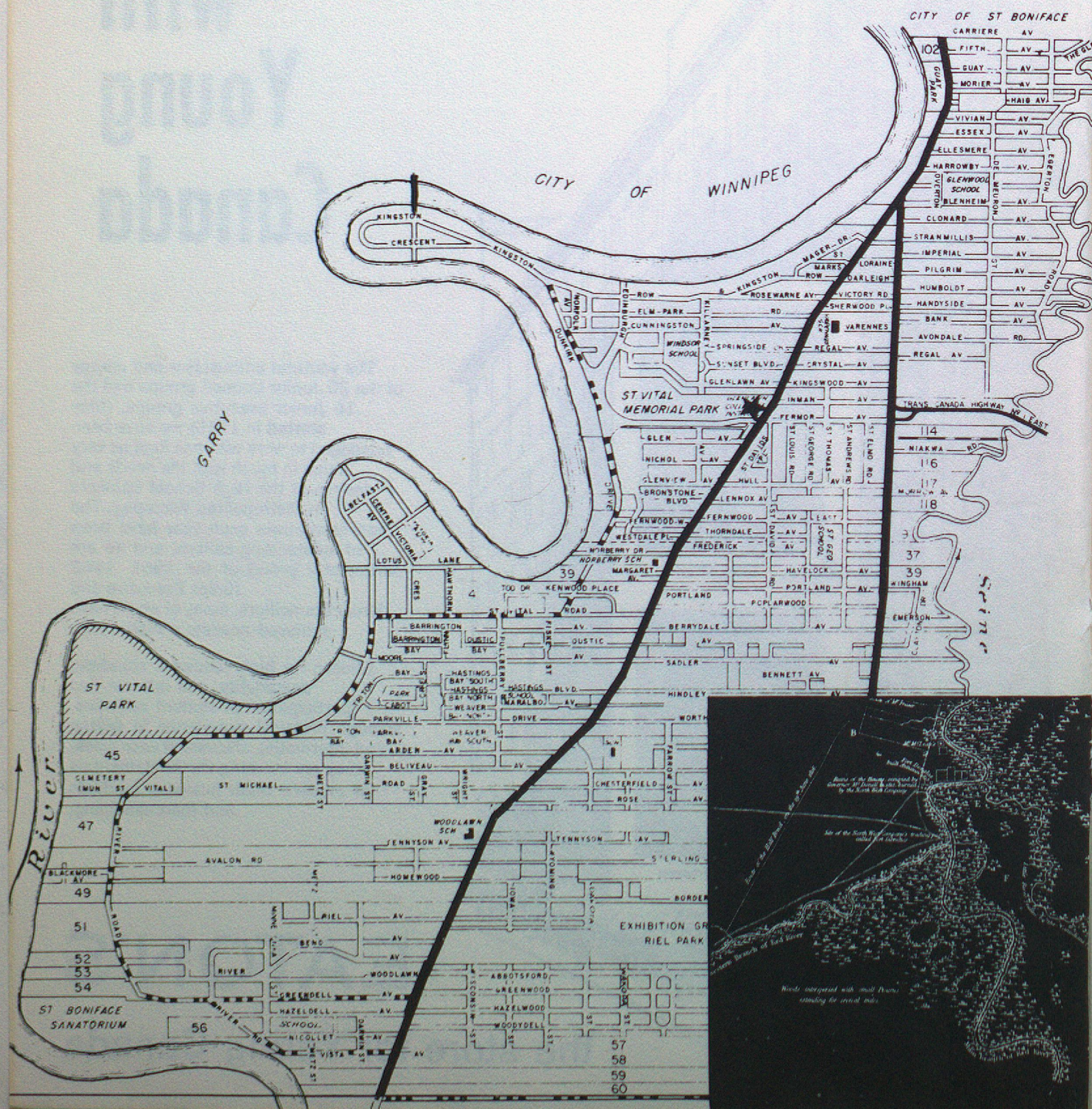
St. Vital was growing so quickly by the 1920's that several real estate firms were convinced it would soon spread south to the American border. They bought tracts of land, levelled brush, graded roads on empty prairies, drained sloughs, put little markers in the ground to show lot lines, and waited for customers. They waited and waited. Gibbs, Macrae, Norton, Berry, Pulman . . . and others, bankrupt themselves believing in St. Vital. The latest Pulberry development has fared better as 300 new homes sprout from the old Todd estate.

The entire Red River Settlement in 1855 . . . "was scattered on the two Rivers . . . there might have been at the time, five or six thousand French Halfbreeds, and about the same number of Scotch, and Scotch halfbreeds, and about seven hundred Indians . . . that was all."

The new "city" will boast housing developments in Pulberry, Bronstein, and Mager areas—twelve recently built apartment blocks—eight churches—a new motel—another soon-to-be-built collegiate—a new library—perhaps even a new bridge—a new family Y.M.C.A.—a home for the aged—a new shopping centre.

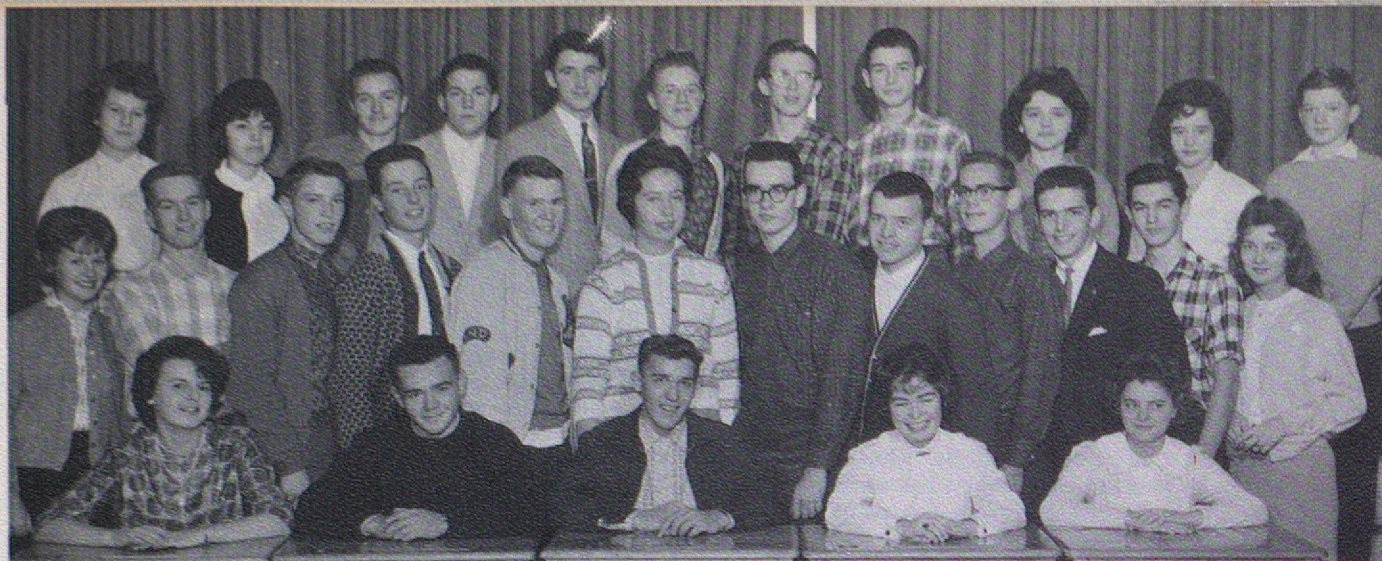

Students' Council Report

The Executive and the Students' Council of Glenlawn Collegiate sincerely hope that they have helped to make the 1961-62 semester an enjoyable and memorable one. We would also like to take this opportunity to thank both the faculty and the janitorial staff, without whose co-operation few extra-curricular events this past year would have been possible. Especially deserving of our appreciation was Mr. Carsted, our staff advisor, who worked extremely hard to guide our council this past year.

As President of the Student Council this year, I would sincerely like to thank each and every class in Glenlawn for the people they chose to represent them in 1961-62. Also, each committee is to be praised for the chairman it elected. These people have certainly worked unflinchingly to make their enterprises the successes they were.

As president of the Student Council this year, I would praise for the way in which they engineered Glenlawn's first Fall Graduation in several years. Their efforts were rewarded with such a success that "Fall Grad" is ensured for several years to come.

This year was the first in which our Sports Council was financially independent for the whole semester. Under the chairmanship of Dennis Alvestad, it successfully organized many activities, among them a badminton club, a curling league, and a tract meet. The Sports Council purchased new uniforms for both basketball teams, and contributed half the cost of new skirts for the cheerleaders, the other half being put up by the Students' Council.

The Social Committee, under the capable leadership of Carlisle Wilson, organized four dances this past year. They can well feel proud of the success of each affair.

Glenlawn's journalistic talent has also been in great evidence. Though working under a financial handicap the "Roar" staff, headed by Liz Burch, published many successful editions. Also, I am confident that comparisons of this yearbook with past editions will show that the hard work of our Yearbook Committee has made this issue one of the best in the history of our Collegiate.

For the first time in several years, Glenlawn has enjoyed the benefits of an active Publicity Committee. The efforts of this group and its chairman, Bob Devlin, have provided much-needed promotion for our school activities this past year.

Several clubs have also operated energetically in Glenlawn during this school term. A few of these were the United Nations Club, the I.S.C.F., the Drama Club, the Glee Club, and the Chess Club.

This past year has seen a change in the structure of the Students' Council brought about as outlined in our Constitution. Whereas, formerly the Council consisted of both class presidents and vice-presidents, now only the presidents are Council members. This reform was necessitated by the increased size of the school. However, though the Students' Council was smaller than in previous years, it was certainly no less active. Primarily due to the efforts of the Council, the Yearbook Committee was allowed to collect two dollars per student for our yearbook. It is the genuine wish of the Students' Council that the added investment in our yearbook will prove worthwhile.

In 1961-62, the Students' Council again sponsored the sale of rings and pins to the students. This was capably handled by Fran Pfeffer and Brian English. Instead of selling school jackets as in previous years, however, it was decided that school sweaters would be offered. Margie Gallagher and her committee did an excellent job of designing and distributing these sweaters.

Glenlawn's Variety Show experienced another outstanding success this year, due in the most part to the efforts of the Variety Show Committee and its co-chairman, Barb Bellamy and Janet Pfeffer. I am sure that in extending my hearty congratulations to this committee and all who were concerned with it, I echo the sentiments of the whole student body.

In conclusion, I would like to express my genuine hopes for the happiness and prosperity of all the students of Glenlawn. It is my sincere wish that none of us who are leaving Glenlawn this year will ever forget the good times we have had here the last few years. May Glenlawn's students next year maintain and improve upon our standards so that 1962-63 will be as rewarding a year as was this past term.

Principal's Message

It is quite obvious that examples of very important changes are all about us. These changes are most spectacular in the field of technology and communication. They are also creating pressure for modification of our educational system. It is the response to this new demand on schools that I would like to bring to your attention here.

The first major effect of the increased application of new science and mathematics to production, is that students find grades eleven and twelve are minimum standards for employment. I have noticed that all students are most serious about completing their high school course, and many more do so than was true even five years ago. There is also a great increase in the number of young people arriving at high school age. New accommodation will have to be built. What teachers will staff these new classrooms? The supply is *completely engaged now*. Who will here the voice crying in the wilderness?

Changes in the courses being offered at the collegiate are quite fundamental and extensive, although not at all obvious to students or to parents. As the student population grows it has more diverse needs. The matriculation-commercial course has been taught for the past two years. Next year there will be a third year of commercial training available because of the needs of this course. The honors course has been diversified to offer biology, as well as Latin, which has always been the extra subject. This year one class of chemistry was taught in grade ten in preparation for the new general course. Next year two classes will undertake the entire new curriculum which involves new texts taught with this aim—a rounded (finished), useful education at the end of grade twelve.

There is another change of course that is very evident to me which has always gone on. Students graduate and new ones come to more than fill their places. Success to those leaving and welcome to their replacements! I trust that we will do well by you and that you will leave thinking well of us.

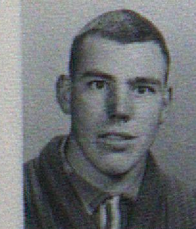
GRACE O'MORROW

That's Alvestad, our boys' sports rep.



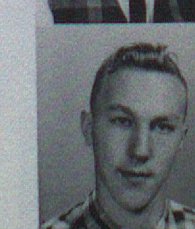
JIM ATKIN

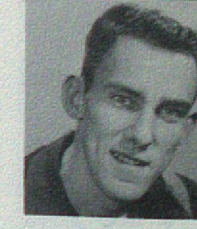


GRACE KENNINGTON

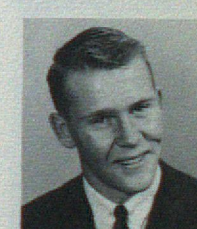

His future should be very bright.



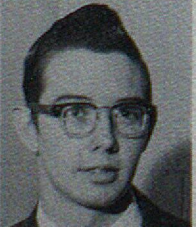

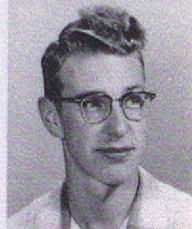
MYRNA SMITH

Customs Of The Iroquois

Myths

The Iroquois believed that the earth was carried on the back of a water monster and that Dehawenajawa was the earth-holder. Beside his lodge grew a tree with luminous white flowers which made a soft, warm twilight where Wind, Night, Winter, Thunder, Bear, Beaver, Springtime, and others lived in peace all having been created in man's likeness. Below the dwelling place of these spirits, lay a black, islandless, waveless, and shoreless ocean. In it lived other manlike and gigantic beings, while above it flew bird-like bodies. This was the universe, according to the Iroquois belief.

At one time Dehawenajawa became suspicious of his wife, Awehai, his jealousy being fed by the wicked Fire Dragon. Dehawenajawa became furious and uprooted his tree of light. The white flowers died, turning black. The universe became dark.

He threw Awehai and the man-like images of corn, bean, wolf, deer, and others through the hole in the floor of the sky where the roots of his tree had been. Soon his anger died. He replanted the Tree of Light and the flowers began to glow again.

As Awehai fell through the darkness, great winged creatures flew up to meet her and brought her down upon their backs. The sea creatures brought up earth from the bottom of the ocean and placed it on the Great Turtles back. The wet earth began to expand. Then Awehai took handfuls of wet mud and threw it in all directions. This earth also expanded, in fact, so much, that she could no longer see its bounds. Thus Awehai was pictured as Mother Nature.

Not long after her expulsion from the sky, Awehai gave birth first to a daughter, then later to twins. The elder of the twins was called Leharonhiawagon, the younger, Lawiskaron.

The Iroquois came to believe that Awehai was resurrected and became the moon.

Grandmother Awehai took charge of the twins. She preferred Lawiskaron, even though he was deformed in both mind and body. He became the symbol of evil, death, war, and darkness. At the same time, the grandmother believed Leharonhiawagon had caused his mother's death. The grandmother cast Leharonhiawagon from her lodge, but the underworld beings took care of him. When he was full grown he was instructed by the Master of Life to transform the place of darkness into one of life. First, Leharonhiawagon made green grass to cover the earth, then created birds, animals, and plants. The wicked Lawiskaron thought that he, too, could create life. He produced bats, the symbol of evil and darkness, nature's other face, one of cruelty and hate.

What Leharonhiawagon had feared, soon came to pass, for the humans' minds became infected with sin and hatred. The sky turned black and three days rain poured down. 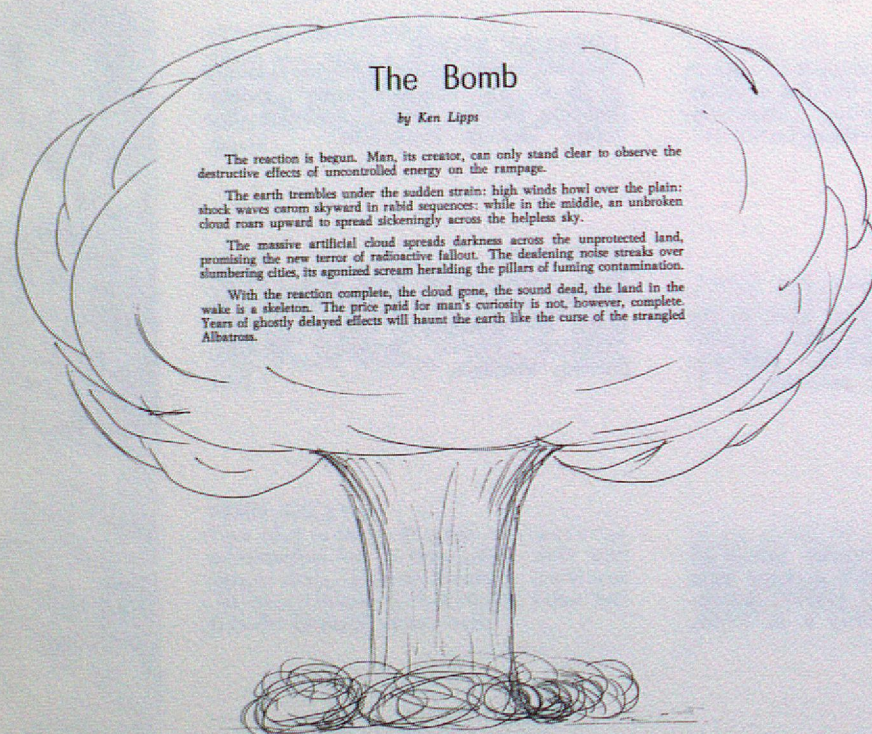

The Iroquois' world had ghosts which lived forever, and supernatural monsters which lurked everywhere. Enormous serpents, with horns like moose hid at the bottom of deep rivers, lakes, and springs. These serpents could take on human form, and even marry among men. Indians spoke of them only in winter, when they were hibernating, so that they could not hear what was said.

The Fire Dragons also lived in the bottoms of lakes, for if they did not, their sparks would set fire to the earth. Hino, the thunder god, could destroy the serpents, but only when they were basking in the sun. Another feared creature was the Great Bear. 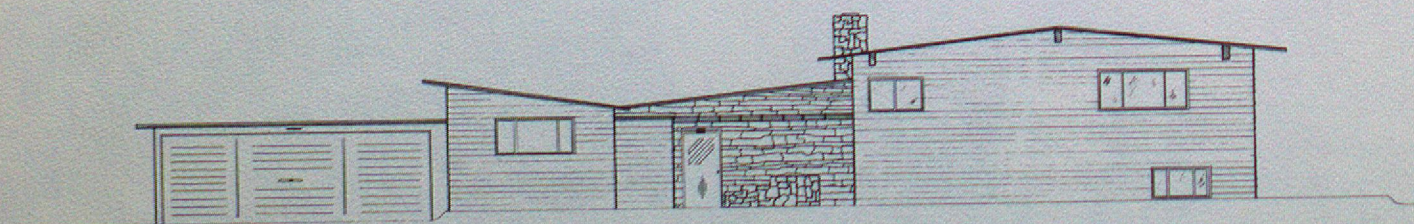
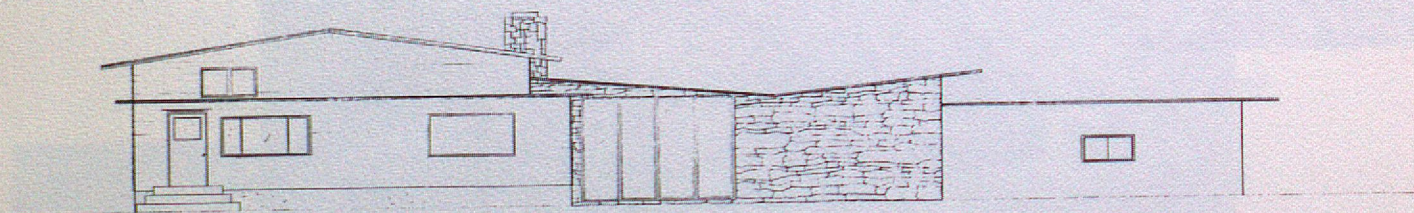

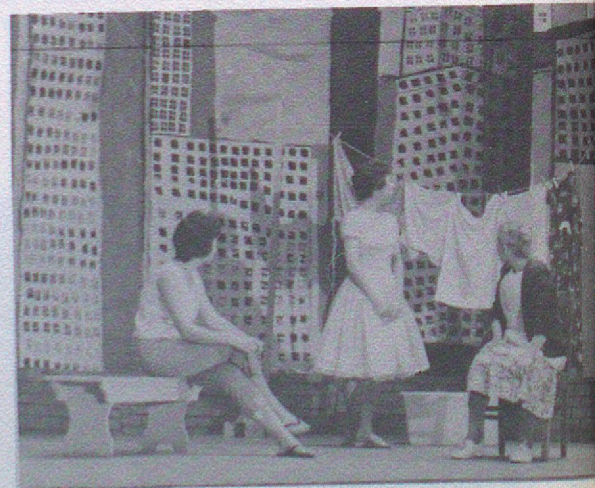

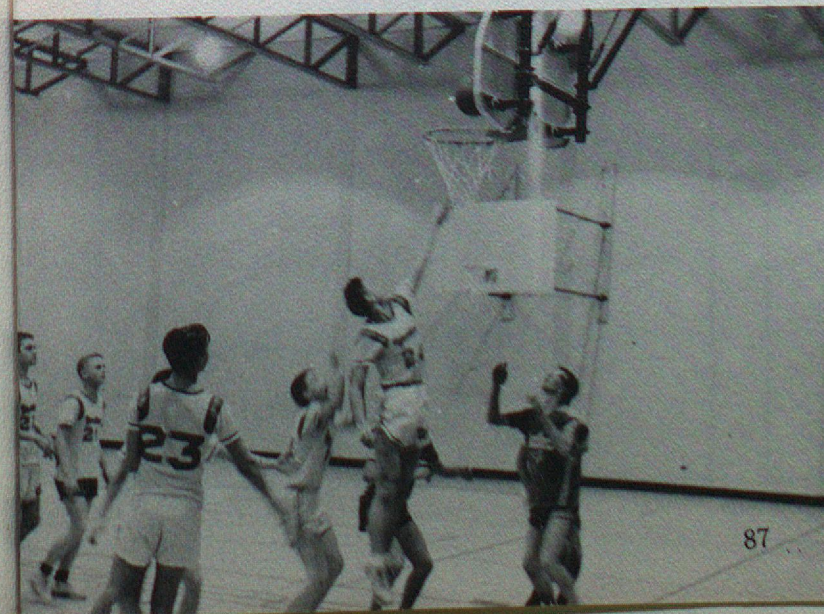

This year the auditorium was the scene of many enjoyable dances and also of our successful Variety Show. The basketball teams, as usual, brought honor to their school.

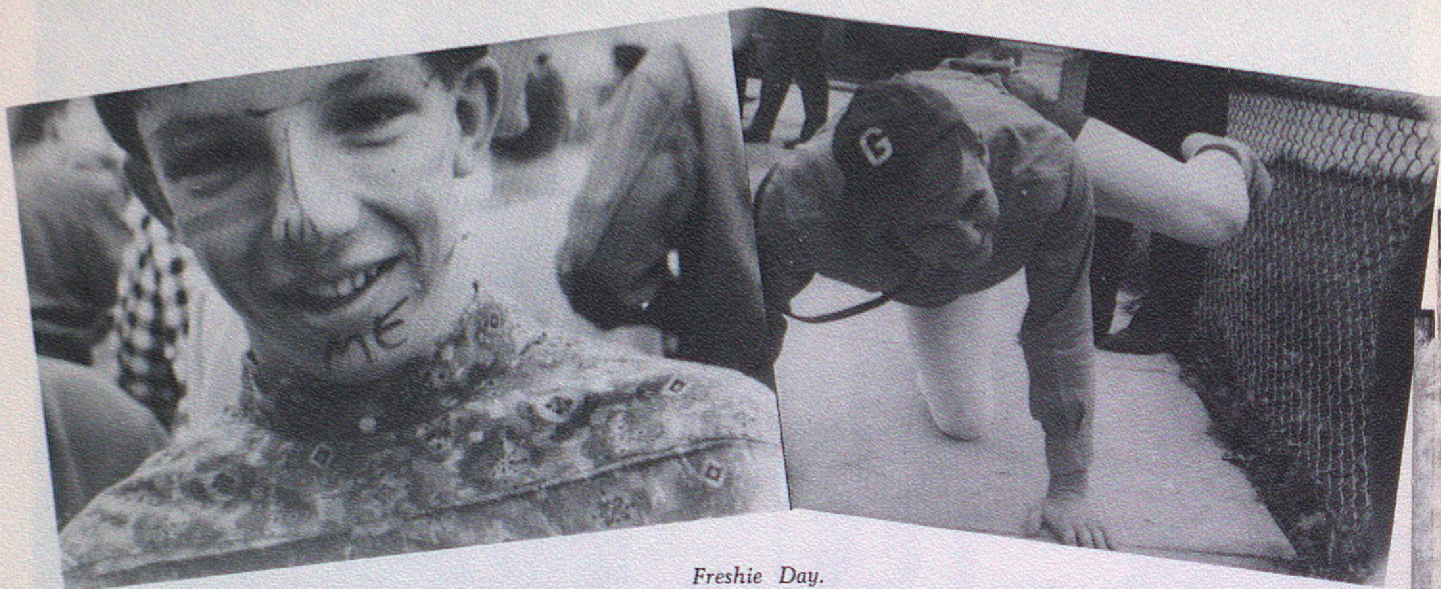
We would like to extend our thanks to the advertisers. Without them this book would not have been published.
