

- IN MEMORIAM -

The students and staff of The St Vital School Division lost a valued friend and adviser in the death of Inspector Eldon Simms during the summer of 1964. Mr. Simms was born in New Brunswick, but came to Manitoba at an early age and was educated in Winnipeg Schools, and at the University of Manitoba, obtaining his Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Education, and Master of Education degrees. He taught in Manitoba for many years, including terms as Principal in John Gunn, Governor Semple, and Victory Schools and West Kildonan Collegiate. He was school inspector ir. Portage la Prairie from 1940 to 1955 and in St. Vital from 1955 until the time of his death. He was a very capable man, with a wide range of interests, who will be particularly missed because of his happy disposition and pleasing personality.



I often feel a real sense of privilege that I live in Winnipeg. I would like Glenlawn students to share this pride in our city and appreciate the opportunity they have to contribute to the growth of Manitoba. This province has resources which are truly rich—soil, minerals, forests, power, wild life and natural beauty. Their diversity gives possibility for endless combination. Their development is only now beginning to gather strength and direction. Such names as Grand Rapids, Snow Lake and Thompson should excite every Manitoban! The fine capillary network of roads is reaching into our north to nourish and drain off the blood of these rich resources to support the expanding industrial activity of the southern urban and town communities where our human resources are growing too. Bumper crops with buoyant sales abroad have also helped to make Manitoba the most favourable province in Canada for sustained employment. Indeed we can be proud of our province, our city, and our opportunity.

The place of this vignette at the beginning of my message to Glenlawn students may need



I am continually pleased with the orderly, responsible behaviour of the students and I am sure that this stems from a satisfactory sense of accomplishment.





THE CENTENNIAL STUDENT TRAVEL PLAN

The strange, dark youth held out his hand, with a broad smile. He was from Newfoundland, two thousand miles from the rocks, pines and crashing seas of home. A stranger to this broad prairie, he seemed a traveller in a foreign land but was greeted by countrymen in an echoing railway station in the flat, sprawling city of Winnipeg.

One of thousands of teenagers obtaining the education of experience, he, like me, had a part in Canada's centennial drama. All of us had the privilege and the honour of being chosen by schools from coast to coast, to participate in the Government sponsored, Centennial Student Travel Plan.

Many groups, each consisting of twenty-four students, were travelling to different provinces, familiarizing themselves with conditions and customs of other regions. Staying at my house for eight days in July was this Newfoundland lad, with a strange accent and budding curiosity about the 'prairies'. With forty-six others we toured Manitoba, visiting such usually untravelled places as Pinawa Atomic Power Station, and Seven Sisters Falls.

As a result of these visits, we knew more about our own provinces, through conversations and the reality's of actual visits. Not the least of the benefits occurring from the four were many resulting friendships, spanning the miles to bring Canadians closer.

On July 15, three days after the departure of our visitors for their island home, twenty-four apprehensive but excited Manitobans boarded a train for Prince Edward Island. How that car reverberated with raucous noise after the first few minutes! Gathered in the confined space of one train car were farm boys from small rural communities such as Gilbert Plains, girls from Mennonite settlements of Western Manitoba, residents of northern mining towns like Flin Flon, and deizens of the suburbs and city streets.

The flat land had gone; slipping past glinting windows were the pine and spruce forests, wild rivers and solemn granite out-croppings characteristic of the wild rugged Ontario shield. Cameras flashed, clicked and whirred as some particularly interesting scenes sped by.

Came isolated Sioux Lookout—night—then Ottawa—then dirty, vast Montreal—then Quebec twinkling on the heights — then night again. Pounding out of the morning mist through the picturesque landscape of New Brunswick, a trainfull of eager faces peered at the approach to Moncton. A change, a speeding bus, then Northumberland Strait lay before us!

The blue haze that was Prince Edward Island grew and sharpened into a green outline as

the chugging ferry ploughed through choppy rolling waves and fresh sea spray.

Over the top of a hill, the bush valleys were turning purple in the distance. Red and grey streaks that were dust and hardtop roads, trailed to the sea. The immediate feeling was one of awe.

At the homes of our island hosts, we adjusted to the almost alien accent. Some said "Irish", others "Cockney", while still others declared, "Welsh"! All agreed that whatever the intonation, it was refreshingly different, and Canadian!

As we wandered the tilting streets of red bricked Charlottetown, or strolled through a quaint fishing village with a sea smell filling the air, we Manitobans were amazed at the diversity of our huge country.

In one short week, the island had been travelled from end to end, from side to side. The laughter of a beach party still rang in our ears at a windswept lighthouse. The tantallizing smell of oysters lingered as we visited a grey monument to that first meeting of Canadians, a hundred years ago.

A myriad impressions crowded our dazzled minds. The old Provincial Legislature, scene of so many historic meetings, stood in solemn contrast to the cleancut, new Fathers of Confederation Memorial Center. The thrill of flying water from the roll of a navy launch was compared to the excitement of an open lobster boat bearing twelve eager teenagers as it crashed through breakers on the way out to sea. The new taste of lobster and the familiar succulence of fried chicken mingled in many happy memories. A ringing speech by Premier Shaw or the roar of laughter leaping through a lighted door into drizzling darkness conveyed vastly different images.

On the way home, we stopped for a few hours at Ottawa. The national capital stood in glistening sun, still dripping from a summer shower. The grey grandeur of the Chateau Laurier block seemed out of place among the spires and gothic elegance of parliament hill. Green roofs gleamed above green trees and shimmering river. The National Gallery, with its Rembrandts, Van Goghs and assorted Canadian paintings, notably by Thompson and Jackson, took all too little of rationed time. A tour of the hill, lunch, leisurely walks; it was over.

Suddenly, sadly, we were home again.

This has been a glimpse, a few monents' glance at a trip that was too good to end and friendships that haven't.

You have a chance to see Canada as I have seen it, in the company of Canadians. The future is as great and vast as the land that stretches "from sea to sea".


ELECTRONICS CLUB








