





In addition the word includes the idea of wholeness or completeness, "An integrated personality" is an expression associated with people who have "grown up". A surprising number of students manage this happy state right here. The third concept inherent in the word integrity is that of "perfect condition or soundness". Perfect condition is the athlete's goal but it would be stretching 'integrity' considerably to cover that state of preparation. However a man having this quality will not be set back by adversity or turn mean in harsh company. He has established his own acceptable standards and maintains them even though it is inconvenient or socially uncomfortable to do so. The development of this personal integrity seems a very sound educational end which staff and students can seek, staff by precept and students by practise.
