I would like to take this opportunity to thank and congratulate all those connected with producing this great yearbook. I'm sure that it will be a valued possession in future years to all students who own one.

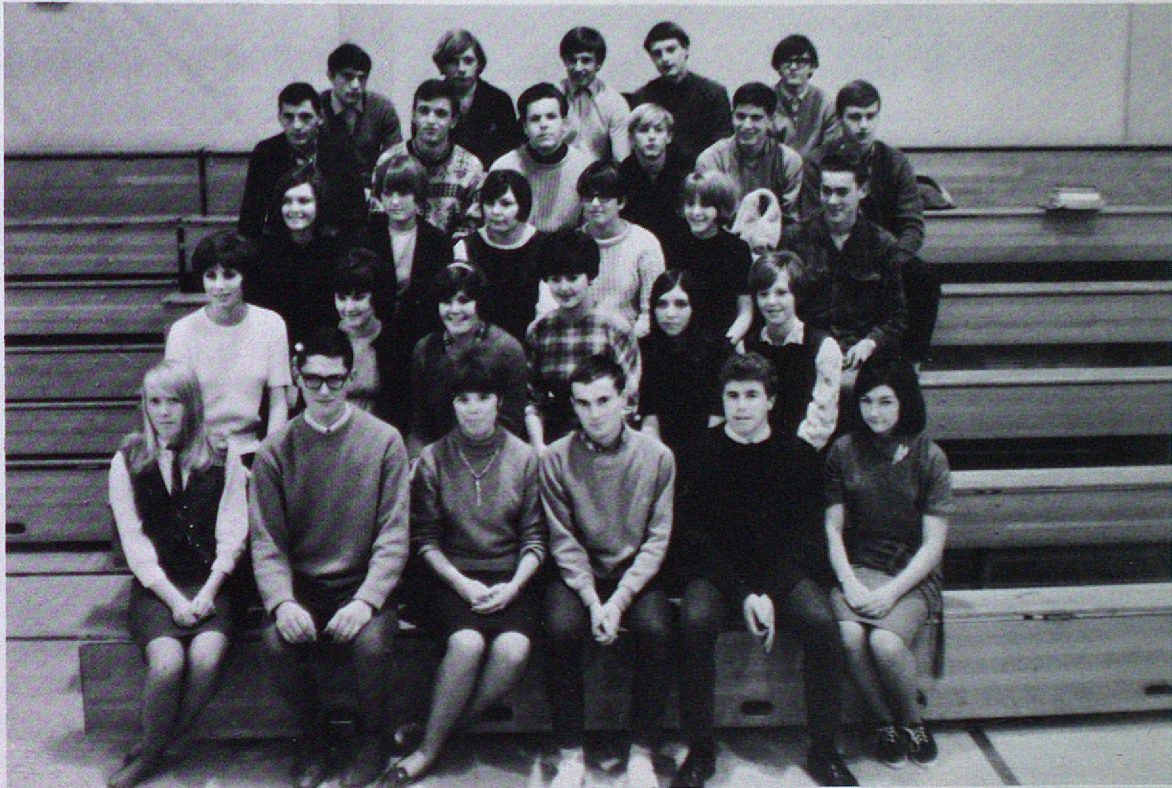

J.T.'s JOTTINGS

In this Centennial Year the history of our Canadian way of life is receiving more public notice. A long time ago I ran across the origin of part of Glenlawn's name and, since then, I have had a little more pride in it that students might like to share.

A Bill of the Ontario Legislature passed in 1871 abolished the term "Grammar School" and substituted that of "High School." In addition provision was made for a **superior class** of High School to be known as Collegiate Institutes. These schools were to have at least four 'masters' (High Schools could get by with two!) and an average of not less than sixty boys studying Latin or Greek and were to receive a special grant of \$750 a year.*

THE CENTENNIAL STUDENT TRAVEL PLAN

To be a Centennial traveller is an exciting experience, one that you will never forget, and an opportunity that will never come your way again. We are all familiar with family holidays, but how many of us have travelled with 23 others of our own age?

Upon being chosen you are filled with anticipation, and reservation: anticipation of things to come, and reservation about the people you will meet. With these thoughts in mind, I boarded the train. At first we felt quite contented with our own company. This, however, was not to be so, or allowed. Our escorts made us mix, and to the surprise of all we found each other human! With the ice broken we spent the next 36 hours, singing, talking, playing cards, and we even found some time for sleeping.

Upon arrival in Montreal we were introduced to our hosts, the people with whom we would be living for the next week. In a very short time we were made to feel right at home, and you wouldn't believe what we learned. That night there was one of the many parties held during our stay. We found out that you don't have to speak the language to have a good time.

The next morning we started touring Montreal. First on our agenda was a visit to the site of Expo, then the St. Lawrence Seaway, St. Joseph's Oratory, the University of Montreal, Place D'Armes, and Notre Dame and Bonsecour Churches. Thus ended our first tour of Montreal.

Early the next morning (too early) we left for Quebec City. Now to help pass the time on the bus we sang. You are given a Centennial Song book, but you are not told you have to use it. Apparently though, you are not a Centennial traveller unless you do sing! Even I joined in, which is quite remarkable since I have a hard time keeping on tune to "O Canada!" But I enjoyed myself.

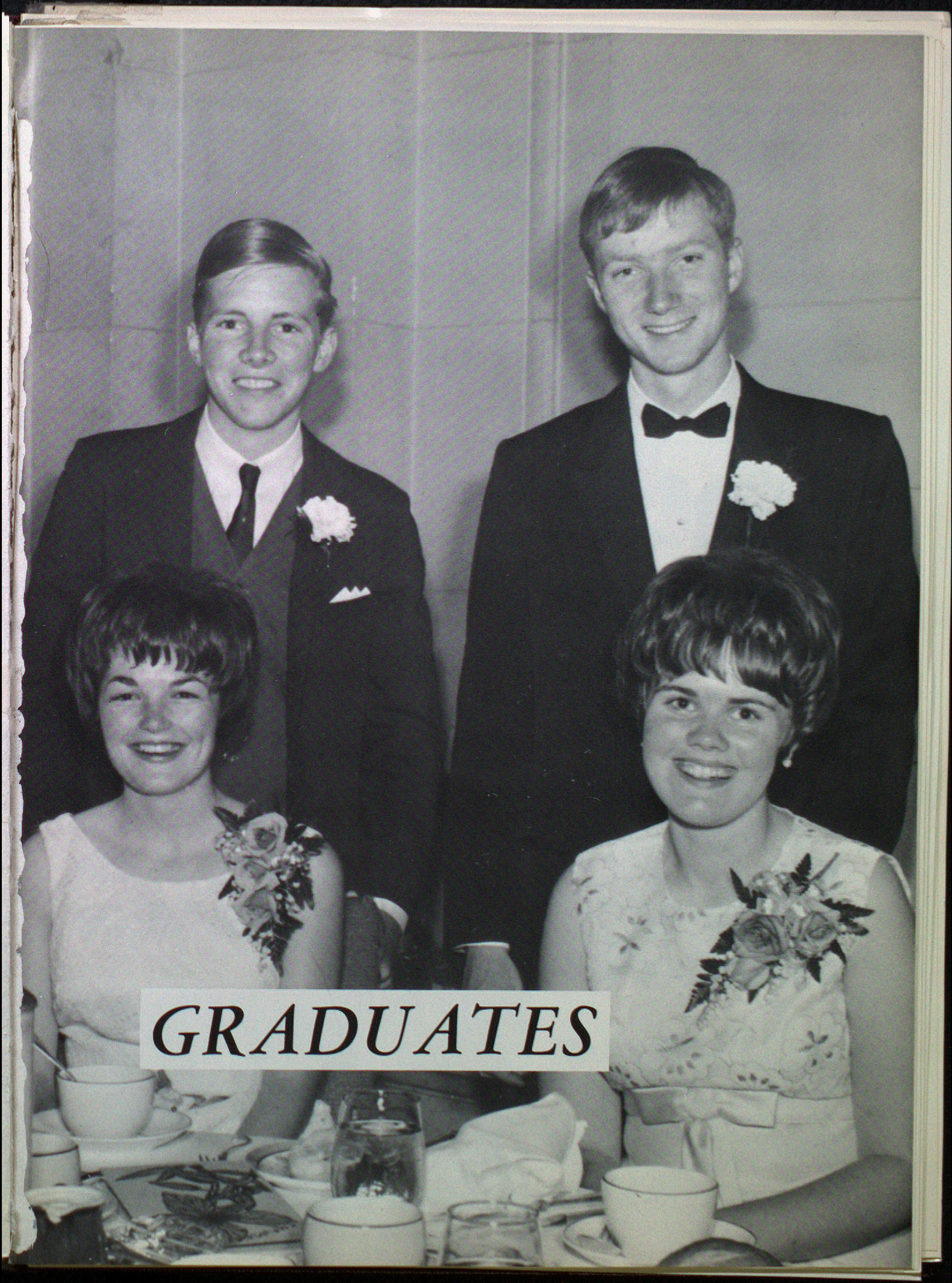
In Quebec we toured Laval University, the Plains of Abraham, and Quebec's zoo. At this point one chap learned a valuable lesson, that is, that Quebec is a truly French centre. He discovered this when he washed his hands, mistaking the "C" on the tap for "cold" when in reality it stood for "chaud."

In the evening we toured the Fortress surrounding the city, watched the retreat of the Royal 22nd Regiment, and a table-sized reenactment of the battle for Quebec. Afterwards we toured the old part of the city, and watched the celebrations of "Bastille Day." The next day before we left for Montreal we toured the Provincial Legislature, a museum, a shopping centre, and an aquarium, and took a ferry ride to Levis.

The weekend was also given to us as free time. Some decided to see more of the city, while others went camping in the Appalachians. The following Monday we once again toured Montreal and ended the day with a party that continued into the wee hours of the morning. That same morning we left for Ottawa. In Ottawa we received a comprehensive tour of the city, that lasted some eighteen hours. Tired and exhausted, after swimming, walking, etc., we boarded the train for home.

It is really impossible to put into words all that we did and what a fantastic time we had. It gave us a deeper understanding of what other Canadians are like. When we pulled into Winnipeg no one wanted to go home, and given the chance, we would have all headed straight back. Of all the Centennial projects I think the Youth Travel program is the most beneficial.

VARSITY BOYS' BASKETBALL

This resume covers the Varsity Boys' Basketball season to February 10, 1967, because a publishing deadline does not allow complete season coverage. Ahead — hopefully — for us are the league playoffs and the Provincial Tournament, March 27th and 28th.

The Lions this year are blessed with veteran talent. Returning starters are Phil Smith, George Johnson, Ron Pelletier, John Manning, Dave Booth, Bob Sinclair, and Rudi McCowan from the 1965-66 Varsity. Jan Kreutzer, three years a stand-out at rival Dakota Collegiate, moved over to Glenlawn to finish his high school education, giving the Lions exceptional experience for a high school squad. Rookies Brad Craig, Art Brown, Brian Johnston, and Harv Dick filled out the twelve-man roster.

The basketball season began with the Fort Garry Invitational in late November. Glenlawn, defending F.G.I.T. champions, were favored to repeat but fell just short of this goal. An impressive opening round win over Daniel McIntyre, 69-54, gave way to a razor-thin loss in the second round to host Vincent Massey, 42-40. Glenlawn regained its stride with a 56-26 win over St. John's Tech to capture the 3rd place trophy.

Exhibition play continued through December, and the team was involved in the Cloverleaf Pre-Season Tournament to decide Manitoba's Rep. to the Canadian Centennial High School Tournament in Regina in late January of 1967. The Lions started off with a flourish, cutting down Brooklands 101-22, and Silver Heights 66-39. The final saw the red-hot Lions avenge their earlier loss to Massey, as the Trojans fell 54-29. The final obstacle on the road to Regina was city champion Daniel McIntyre Warriors. Glenlawn was not to be denied, as they displayed their best

ball of the season running rough-shod over the Maroons by a score of 68-30.

The Regina Tournament has to rate as "The" High School Tournament as teams from six provinces, British Columbia to Quebec, gathered to contest what was unofficially billed as the Canadian High School Championships. In the opening round, Glenlawn drew the top Saskatchewan team, and local high school favourite, Sheldon Williams Collegiate. After a slow start in front of T.V. cameras and 1,500 exuberant fans, the Lions, led by George Johnson, pulled away and defeated the Spartans 57-42. The second round found Glenlawn facing the Raymond Comets, four-time Luther Tournament champions since 1962. The Comets featured extraordinary height (6'7", 6'6½", 6'4"), starting forwards, and good ball-handling guards to work their vaunted fast break. Glenlawn rose to the occasion, coming from behind to push the Comets all the way, finally succumbing by a score of 77-62. Guard Phil Smith kept the Lions close with his outstanding shooting and ballhandling. The Tournament concluded for Glenlawn as they fought the Victory Totems from British Columbia, finally emerging with a 35-31 victory and the 3rd place trophy.

In league play as of February 10th, the team is 3-1 with wins over St. James (2) and Massey. Our only loss was to Dakota. All league games have been very close with a good brand of basketball on display.

The team's objective at this stage is first the league championship, and beyond that the biggest goal in Manitoba high school basketball — the Provincial Championship!
