
























Editor's Message

ALLAN CRAIG: "The love you make is equal to the love you take." Unquote. Well, he warned us we wouldn't understand it.








GREG GOOCH: Another Physics whiz?? Pet peeves reading translations in French class. Admired for his Bronx accent.




DAVID HUNTER: The little boy with the big bike. He'll be good when he gets those coaster wheels off. Looks really tough in that leather jacket.


SUE MADDEN: We like Sue. If we were guys, however... we'd probably like her more, (chuk-chuk), (abbreviation for chuckle-chuckle).


President's Message

In conclusion, I would like to extend best wishes for future success and happiness to all students at Glenlawn, and especially to the graduating class.




Anthropology Club








Chess Club






Psychology Club



Girls Cross Country






Girls




Boys
