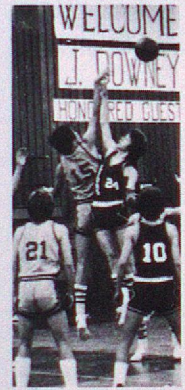
Before going to Kelowna the boys participated in the Wesmen Classic at the Convention Center and the Shanley Holiday Basketball Tournament in Fargo N.D.

## SISLER DEBATES

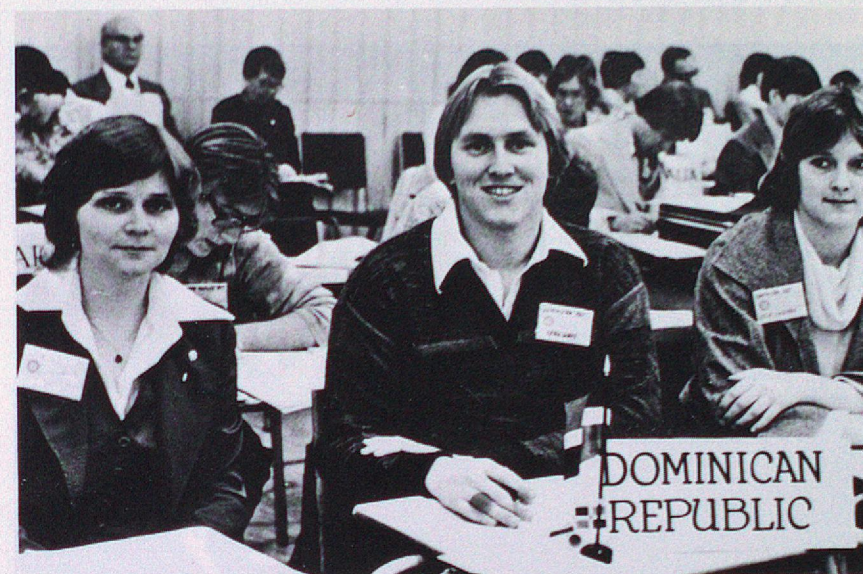

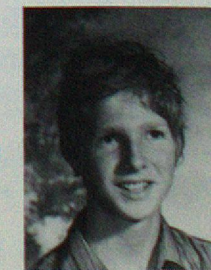

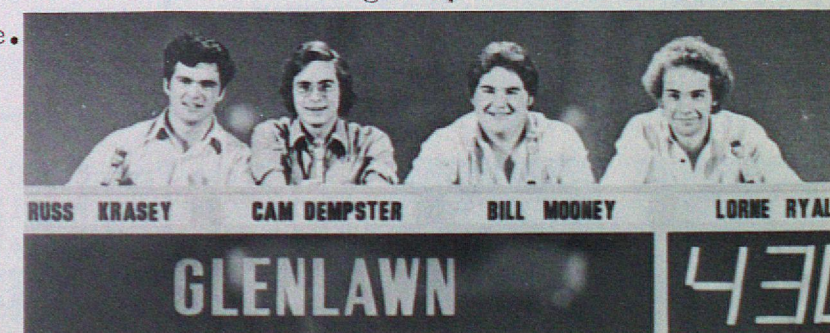

## '76-'77 REACH FOR THE TOP TEAM

In May, 1977, Glenlawn's '76-'77 Reach for the Top team of Russ Krasey, Cam Dempster, Bill Mooney, and Lorne Ryall, coached by Mr. Wilf Entz and Mr. Leo Hlynka, won the Provincial Championship and the right to compete in the National Championships in Calgary, Alberta. This was Glenlawn's first provincial title, and it set the stage for a tremendous week in Calgary.

After overcoming the Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and Southern Ontario teams, Glenlawn met Northern Ontario in the finals and defeated them 340-315 to win the Reach for the Top National Championships. This was, of course, a first in Glenlawn's history and only the third time a Manitoban team has won it all. The team also set a record for the highest game point-total in the Nationals when they amassed 595 points in the game against P.E.I. The team was undefeated in ten games, which is indicative of their fine performance.
