The Lions finished the regular season capturing first place in the tough Cloverleaf conference. The Conference










finals were all exciting, well played games of which the team can be proud.

This fortunate group of Glenlawn students participated in a cultural and linguistic exchange program during the summer of '78. The project is organized each year by an association of Winnipeg business called the Canadian Council of Christians and Jews.

The visits provide an ideal combination of vacationing and learning. They are designed to encourage bilingulaism and develop understanding and goodwill between English and French-speaking high school students and their families.

The students in this photo spent a wonderful summer in and around Quebec City learning about the French-Canadian Quebecois. The primary purpose of the exchange is the immersion of the visitor into the home and language of the partner. Aside from the educational and cultural benefits of the exchange, these Glenlawn students had a truly unforgettable summer.

These French 300 students spent six weeks of their 1978 summer holidays learning some advanced French at the University of Winnipeg's French Immersion Summer course. They lived on campus for the duration of the course to accentuate the immersion aspect of the program. There were formal classes in the morning, and during the remainder of the day, a full program of activities was organized to allow them to practive speaking and understanding spoken French. There were workshops in theatre, music, arts, crafts, journalism, video tape conducted entirely in French. Excursions to local places of interest, and to parks and beaches were a regular part of the program. A condition of enrollment was to speak only French at all times during the course.

Activities scheduled after 6:00 pm. on Saturdays and Sundays were not compulsory. Aside from gaining fluency in spoken French, they also earned a university credit, and all at no cost to them.
