Terry Fox Run

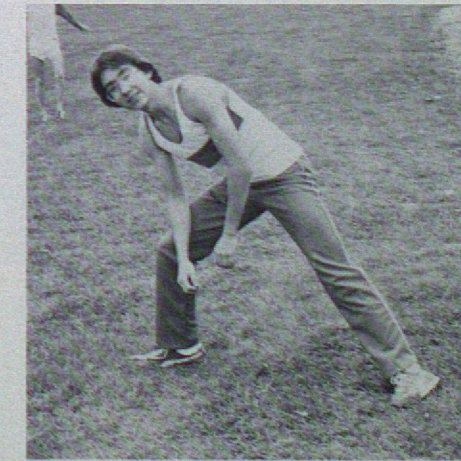

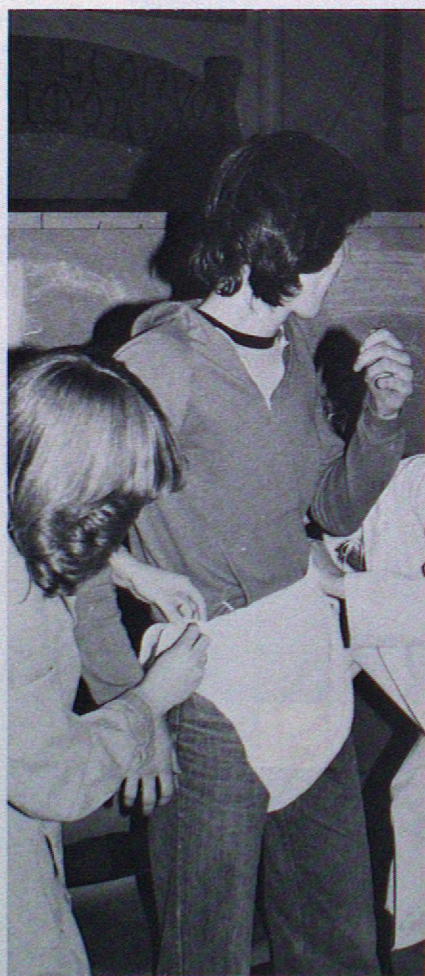
Lisa Eagleton received an award for Academic Excellence in Grade 10 from Vice-Principal Mrs. Olchowecki.

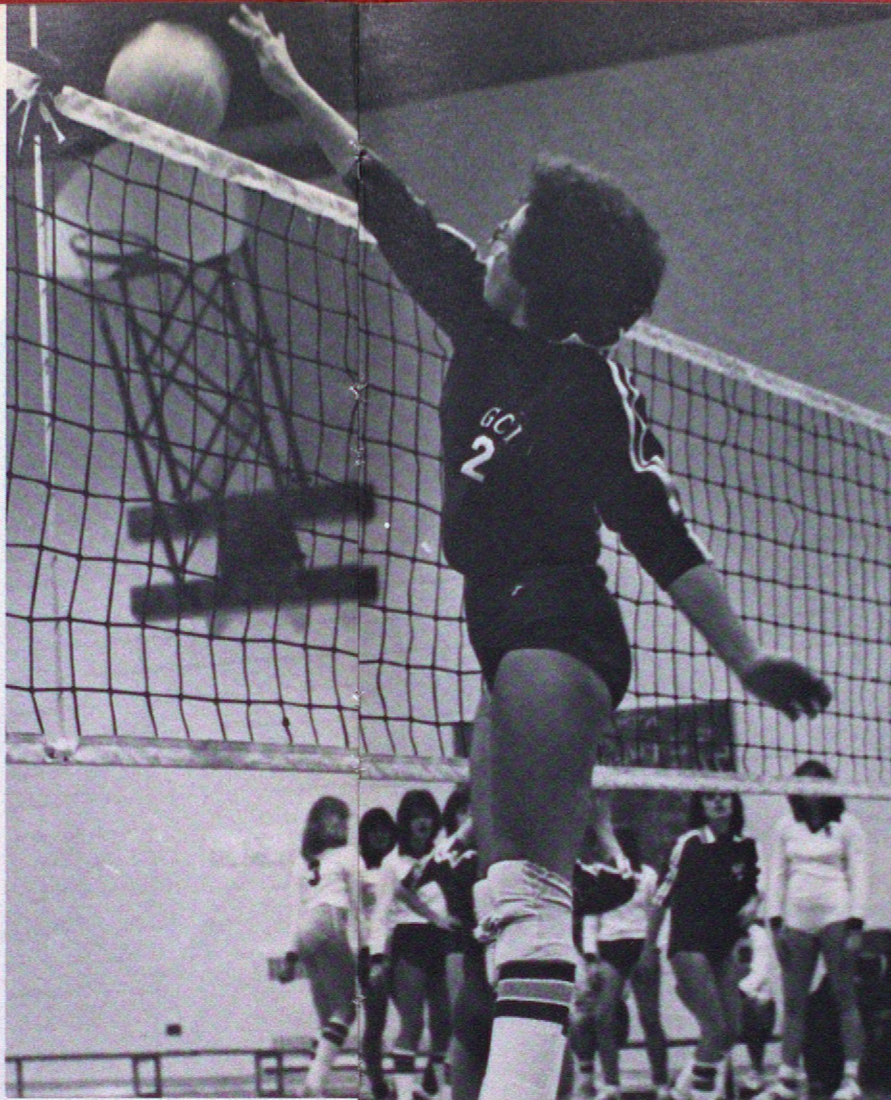

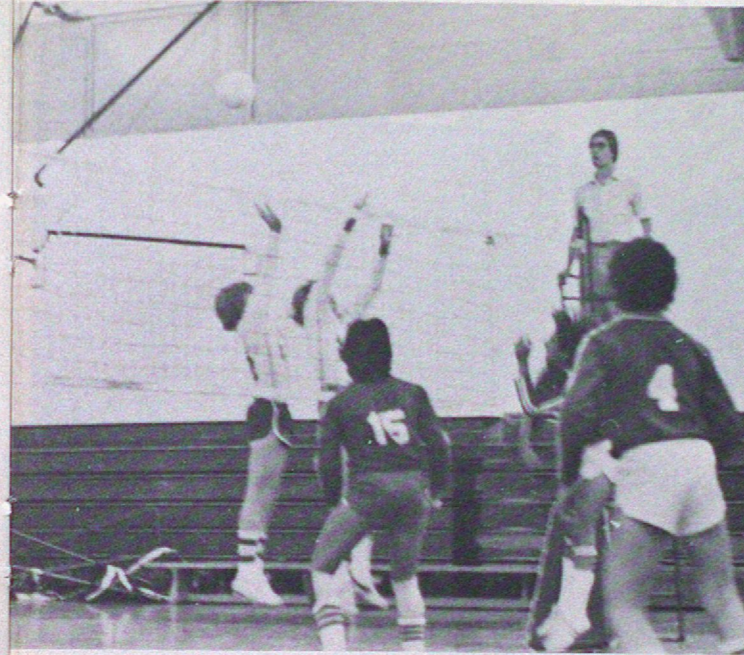
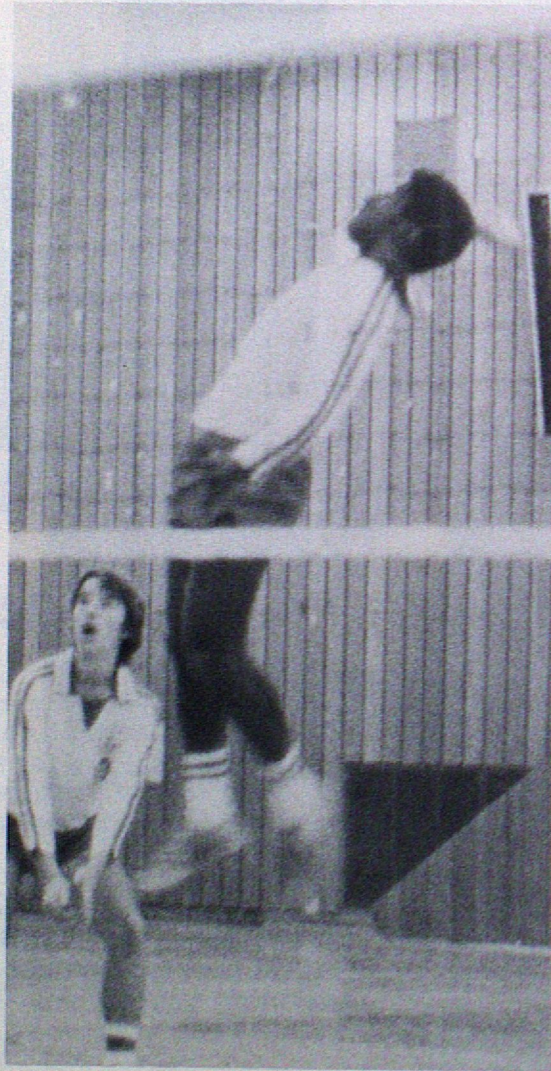


Fresh. Girls' V.B.

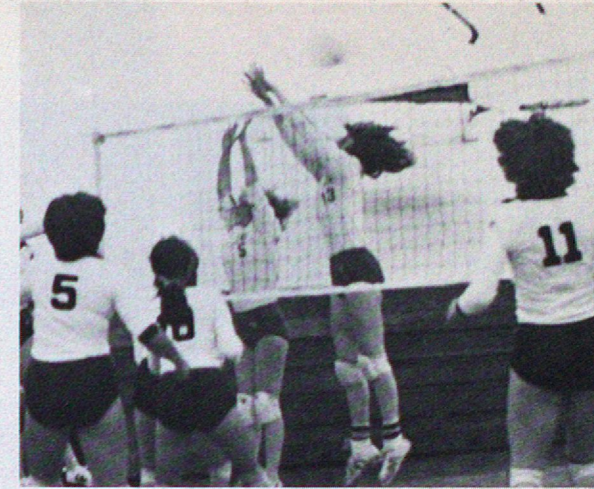
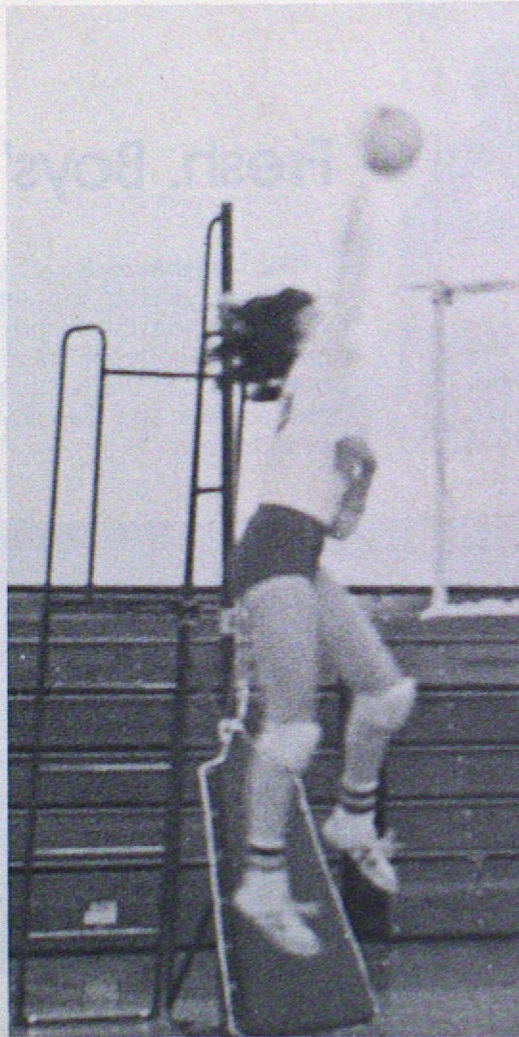




Fresh. Boys' V.B.

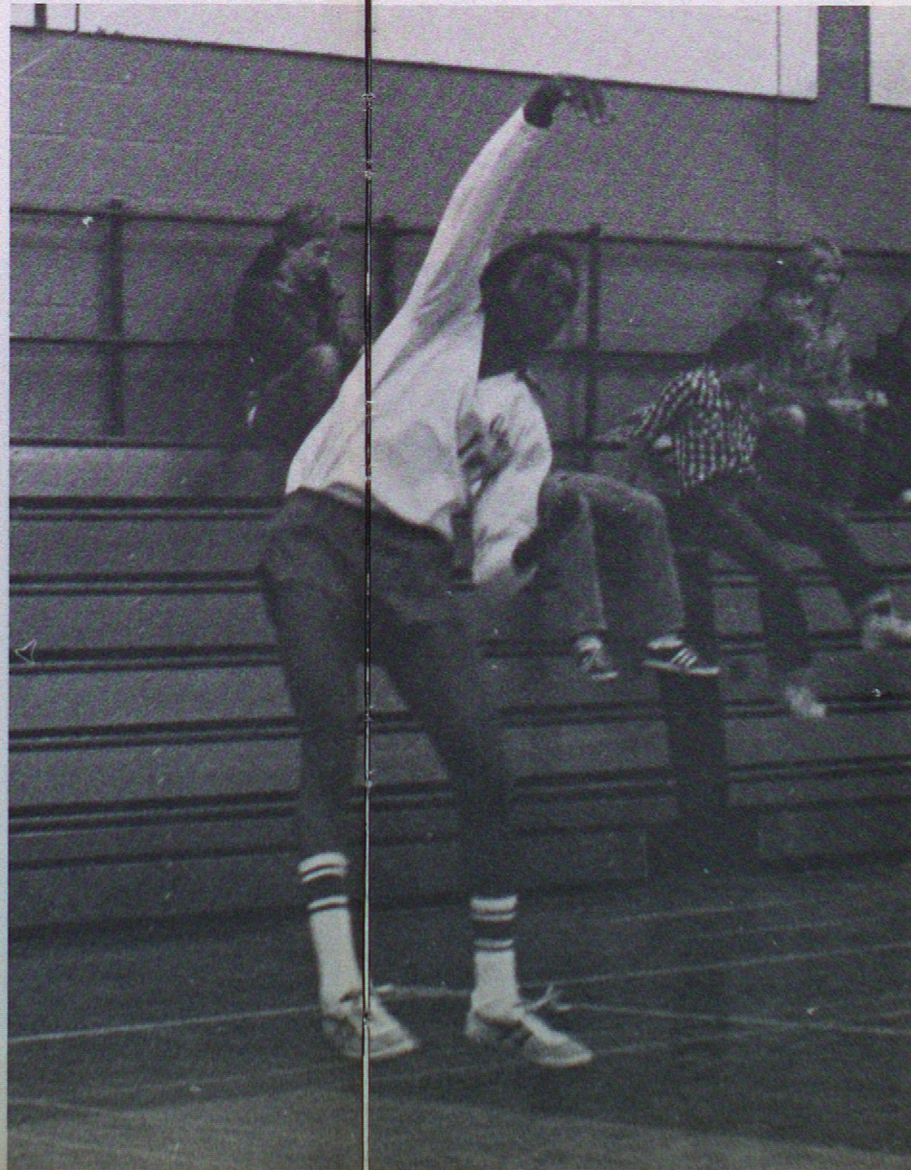
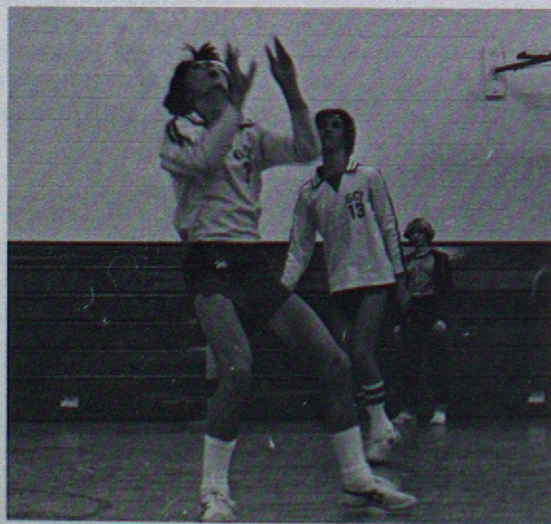
Var. Girls' V.B.

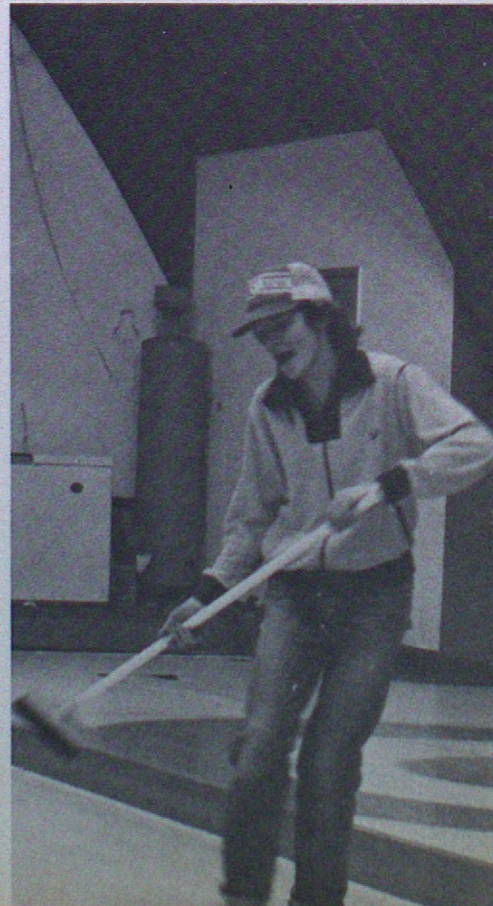
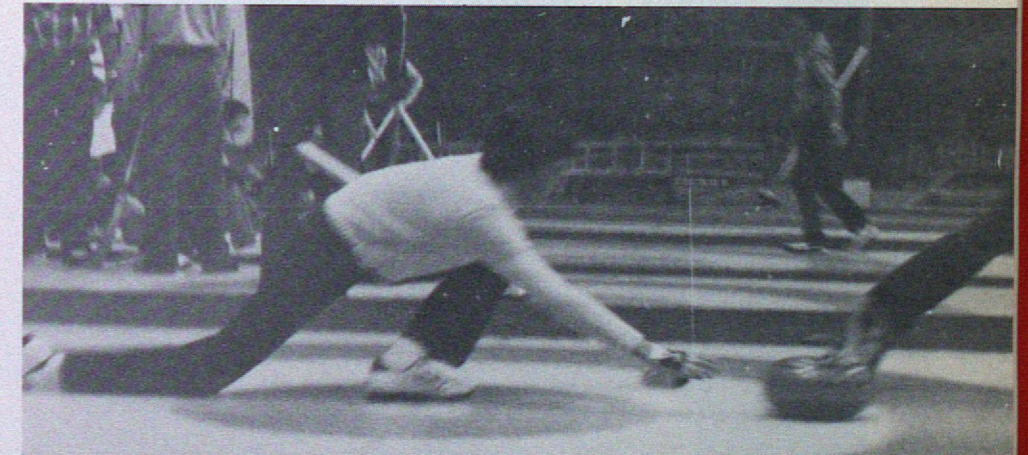
Var. Boys' V.B.

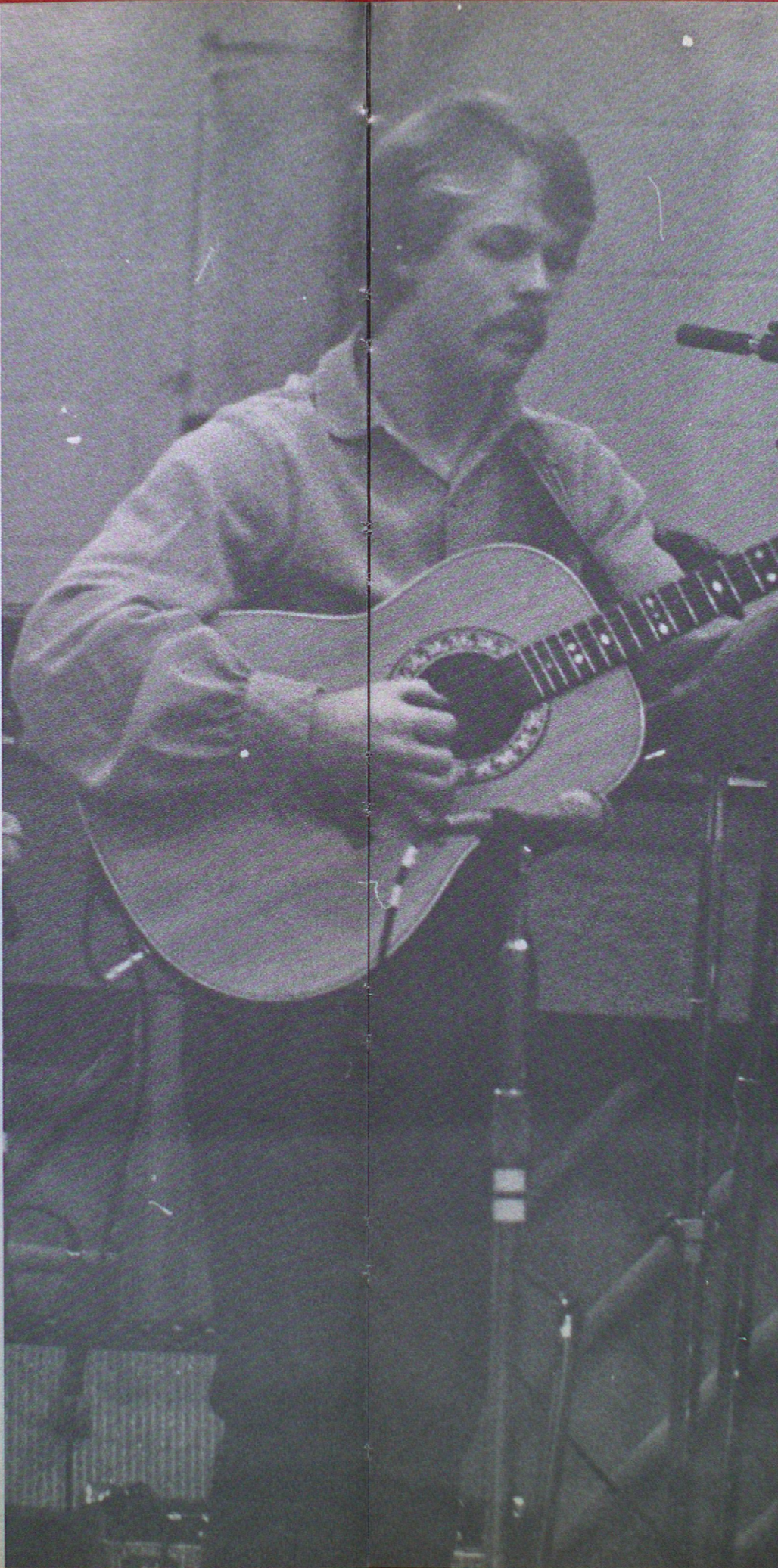
Curling

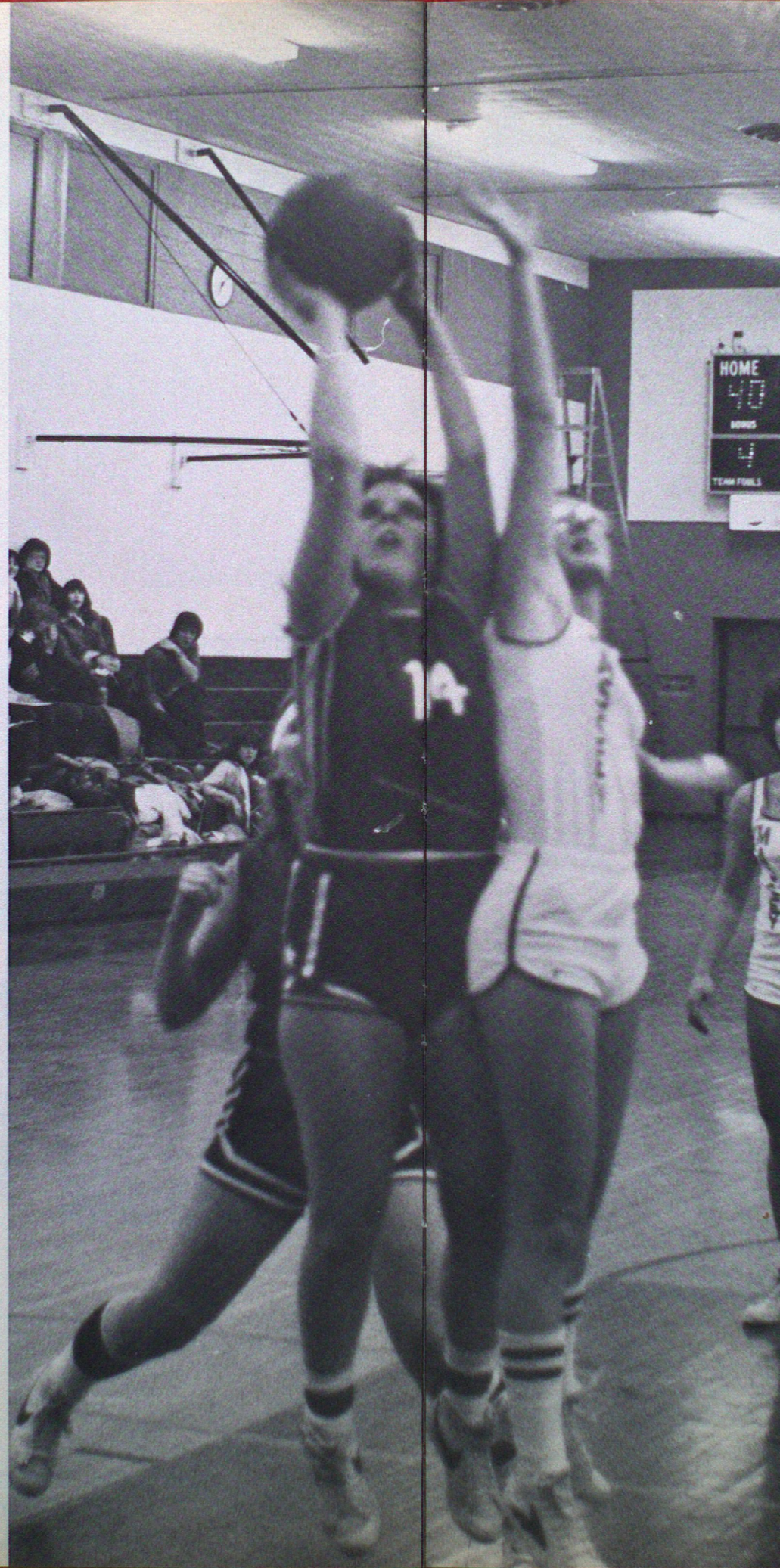




Freshman B.B.

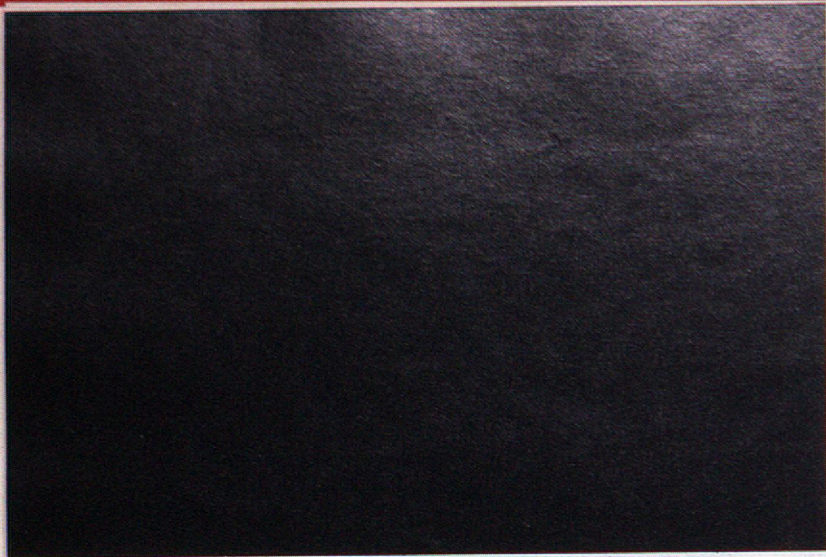
Season highlights consisted of a championship at the Garden City Tournament in early January, and a trip to Chilliwack,

Most team members will be returning for 1982-83, and the Lions look forward to a successful season.

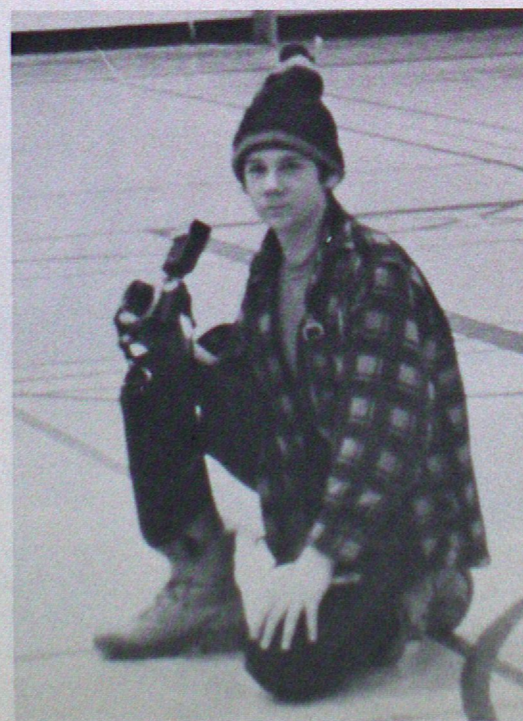

Points totalled, it was found the Grade XI's came in first, with the Grade XII's close behind in second, and the X's in last place.

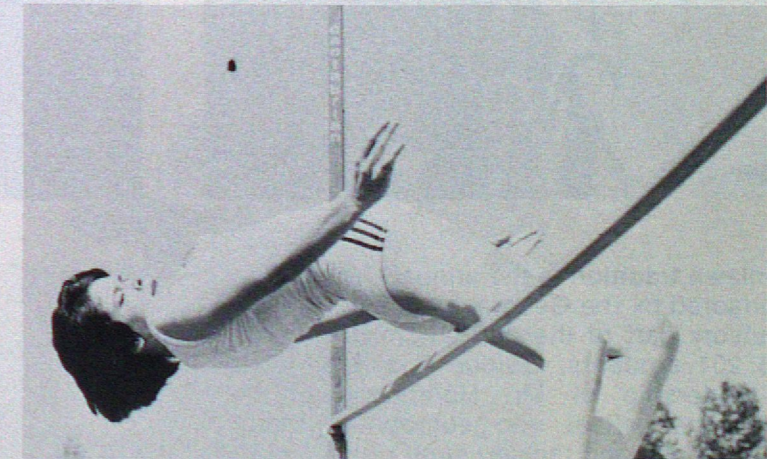


Pain Rewarded

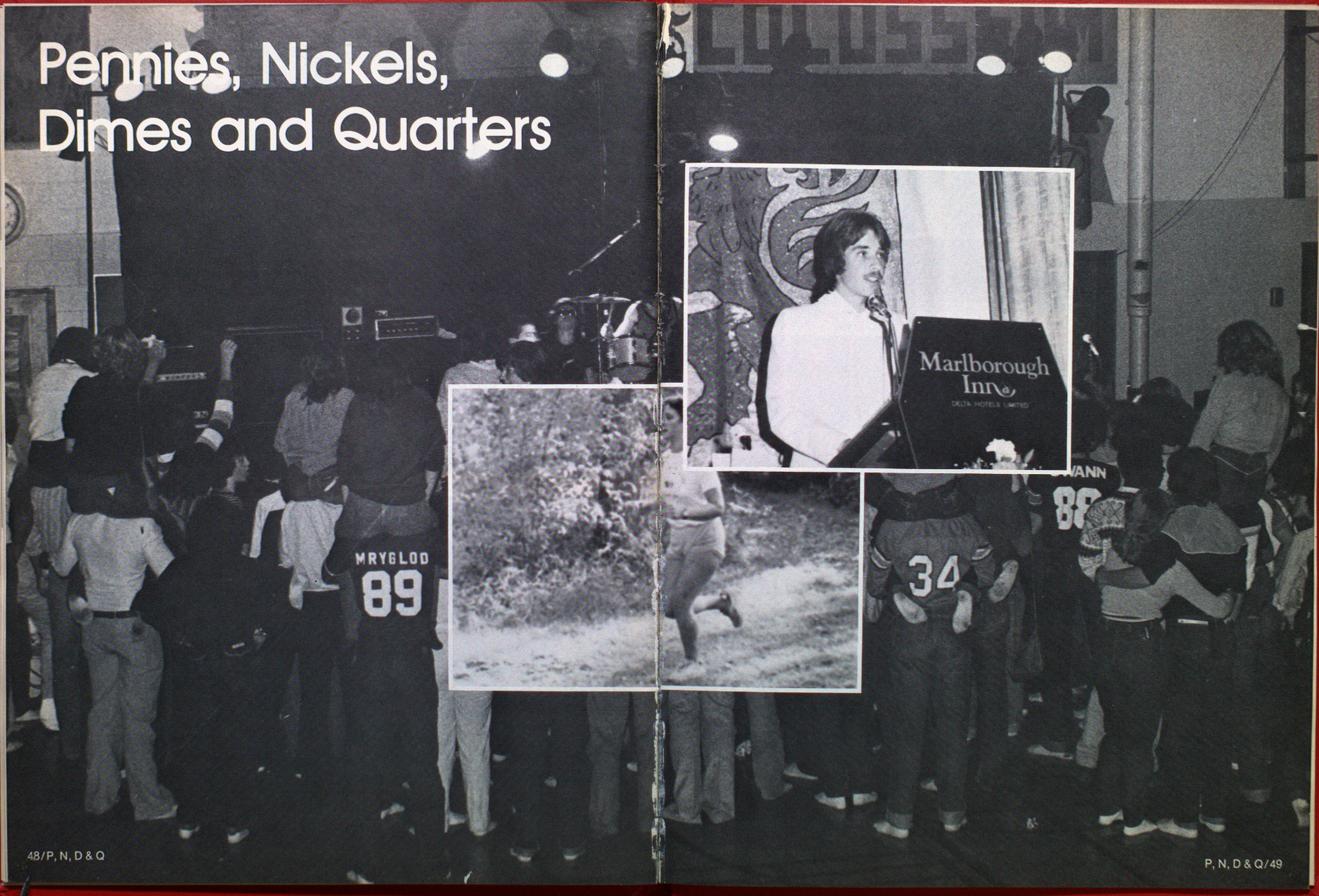
Cashing in
