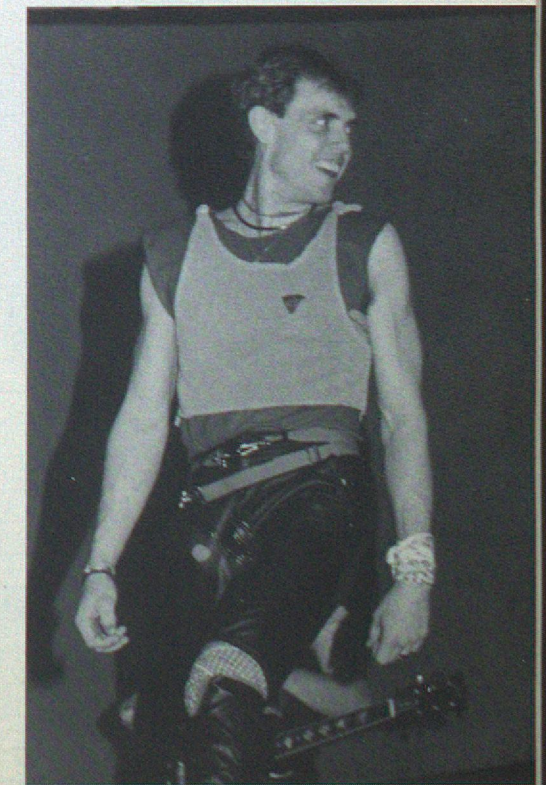
# Drama Club

# Vice-Principal's Message

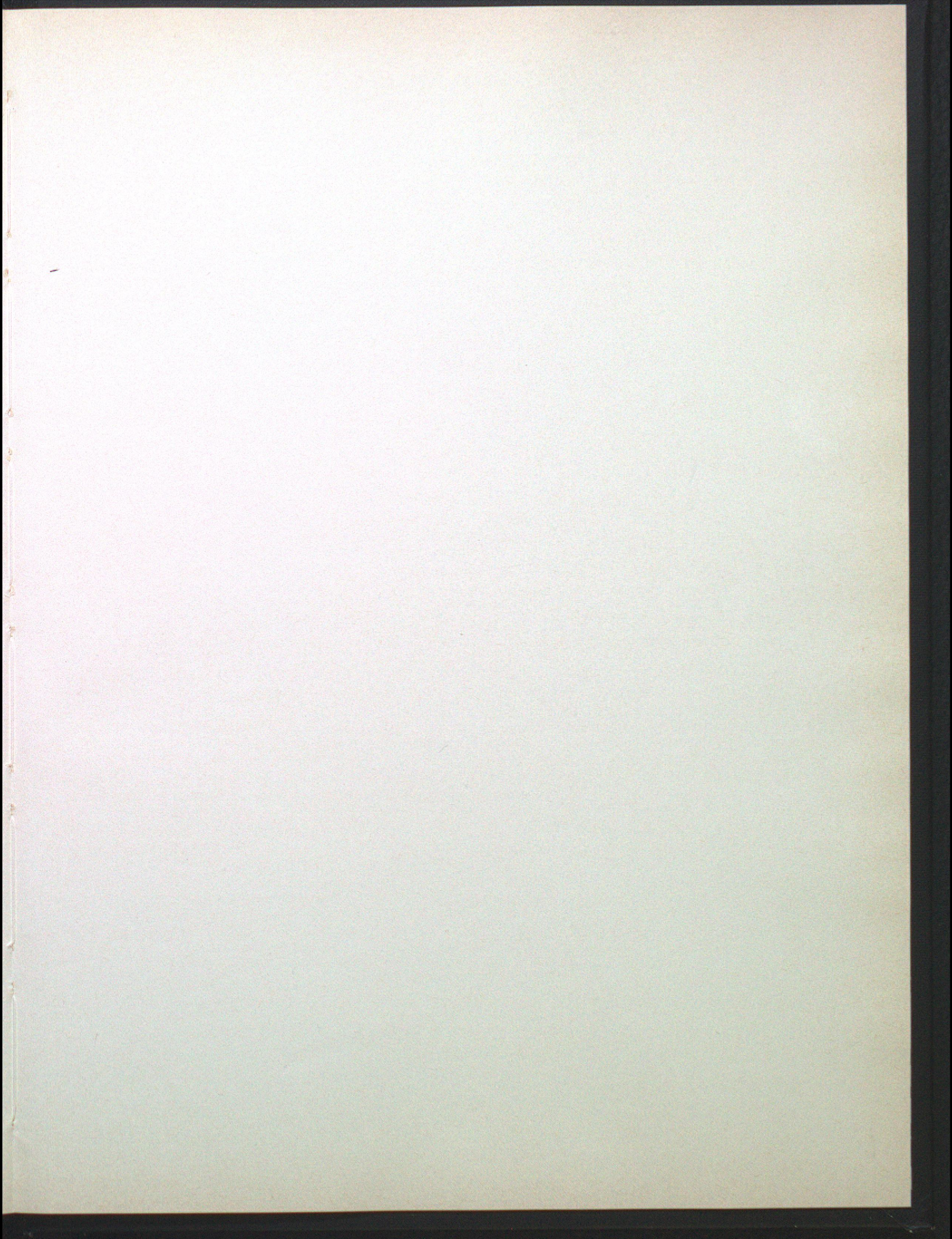
