
As I thought about the past year and the many events that stood out in my mind as notable I reflected on a quotation I recently read by William Henry Hudson.

I have to believe that jointly staff, students and parents in the Glenlawn Community have worked together to make our school a caring place full of enjoyable and interesting activities.








#### FRESHMAN GIRLS' BASKETBALL






















































Parents, teachers, and the graduating class of /88.






