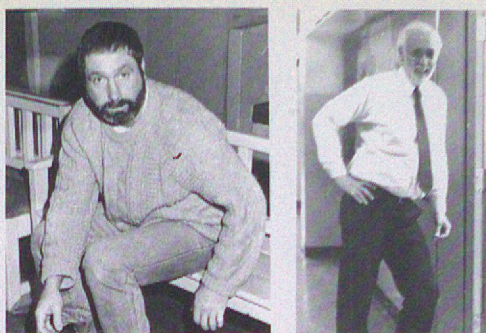
We hope that our graduates will use these special talents in social, academic, athletic and artistic areas to challenge the 90's with confidence.

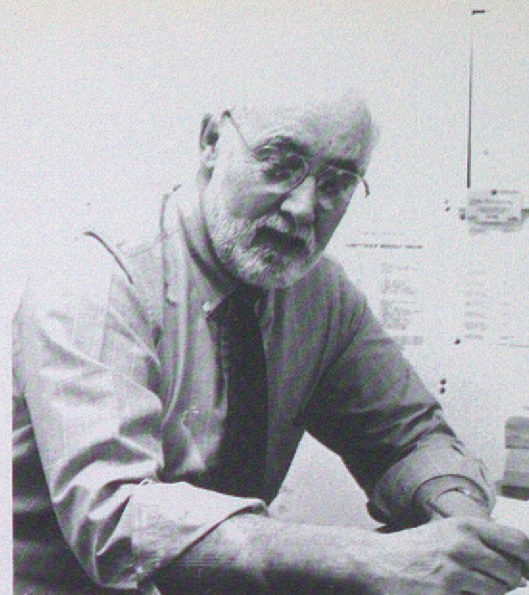

The great thing about a vice-principal writing a brief "message" for a high school yearbook is that one can say practically anything and get away with it - nobody ever reads the

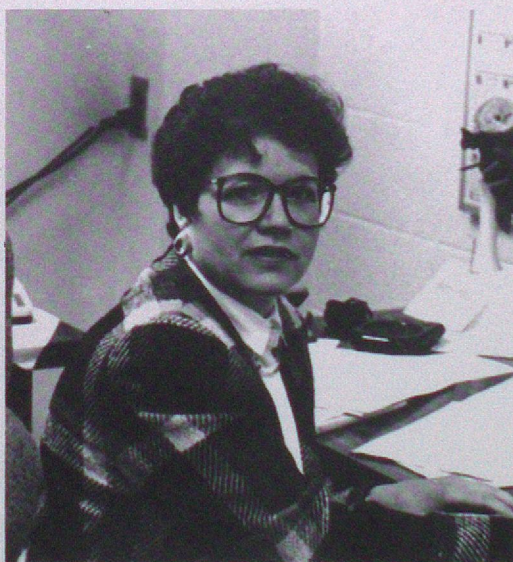


message in any case. But just in case this is read, I'll suggest that the students at Glenlawn have gone through a year unlike any in living memory, in terms of significant world events. They have seen democratization of a number Eastern Europe states, the crumbling of the

Berlin Wall, demands from a number of Soviet republics for freedom quite unthinkable a very short time ago, the freeing of Nelson Mandela from twenty-seven years of imprisonment in South Africa, and many other astonishing occurrences (My own favorite event of 1989/90, though, concerns the high school teacher in France who quite literally killed a student for failing a history test.)

In any case, from about events, a message should come through loud and clear for students at Glenlawn - *almost anything is possible*. Things have happened this year that one could not possibly have predicted, in terms of global occurrences. Similarly, things can happen in an individual's life that are quite predictable. My advice, therefore, is simple: prepare yourself for the unpredictable. How? Don't limit your hopes don't constrain your dreams; don't confine yourself to conventional thinking; don't be narrow in your friendships; don't prejudge people or events. Finally, be prepared for things to change for the better, and who knows? - it just *might* happen. I sincerely hope it does for you.

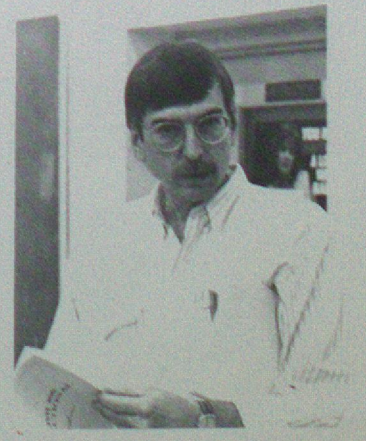
FROM THE PAST TO THE FUTURE

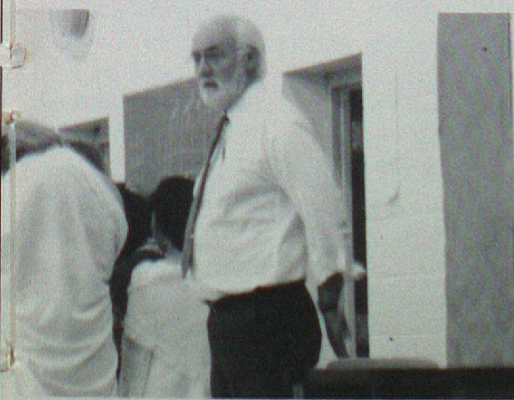
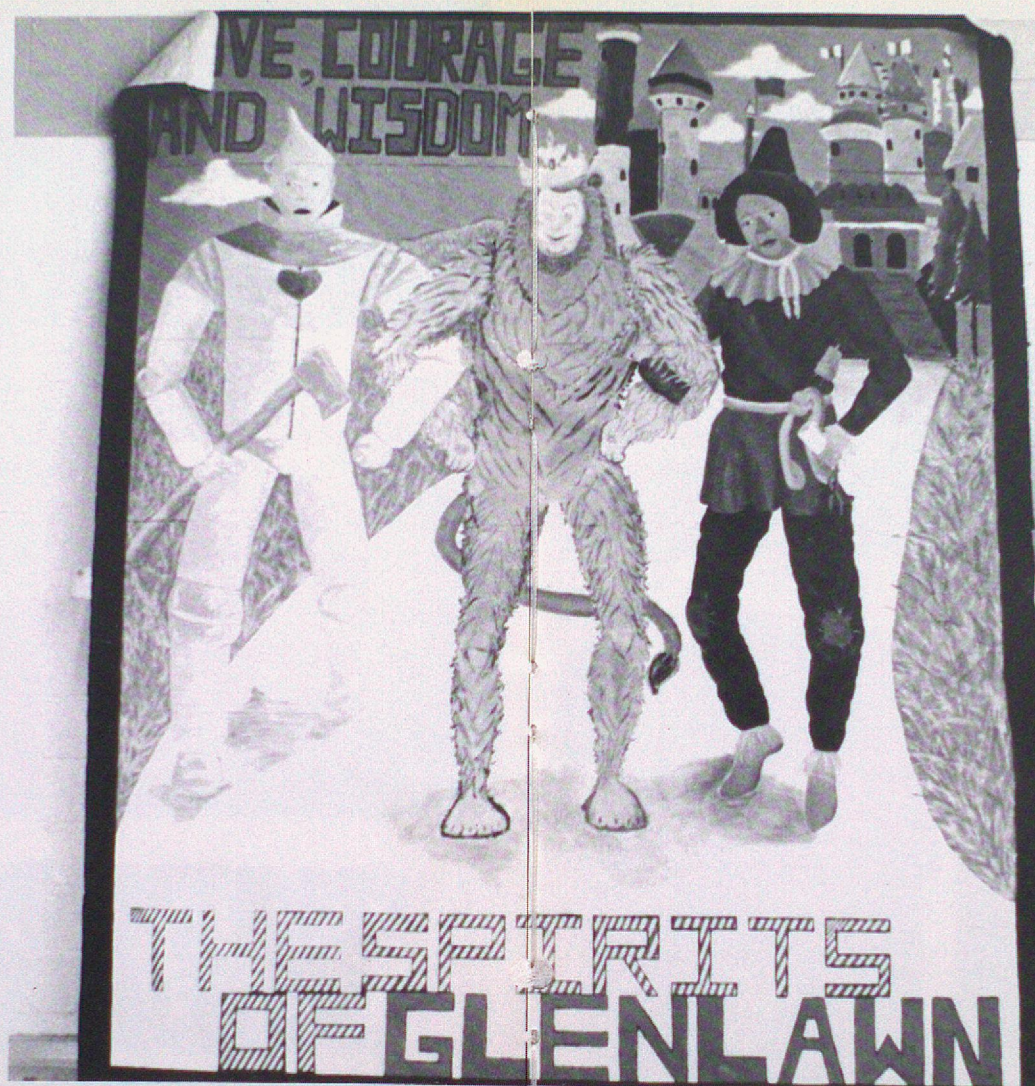
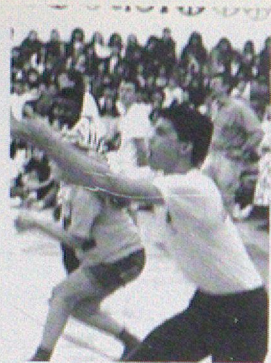


SPIRIT WEEK 1990

In February all five bands were trophy winners at the Optimist International Band Festival.

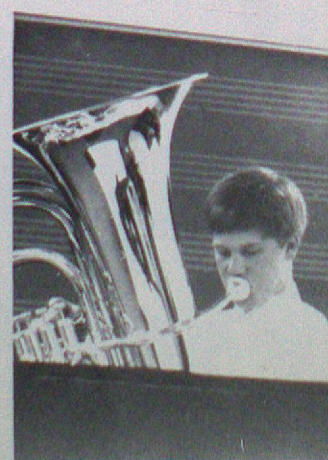
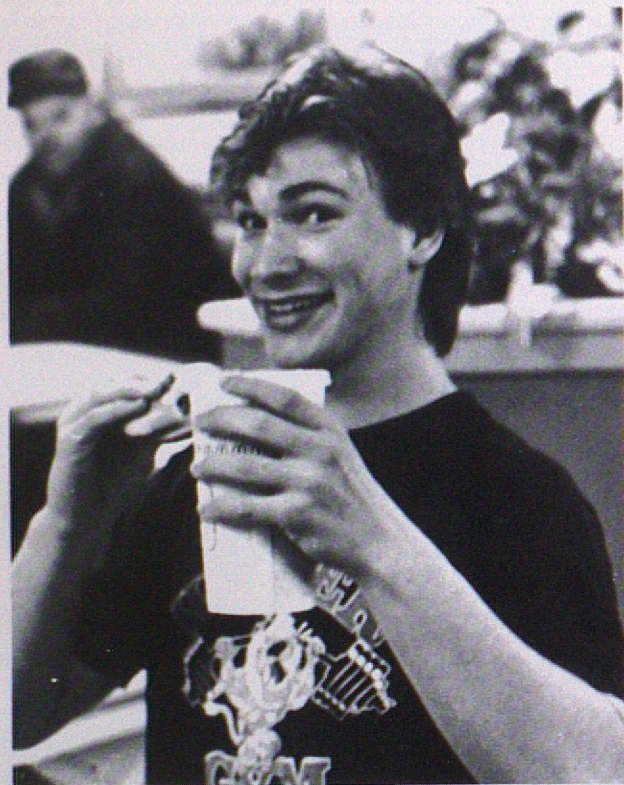

Coached by Mr. Thoroski and Mr. Poulter, the players are expected to contribute to a strong varsity boys' team next year.



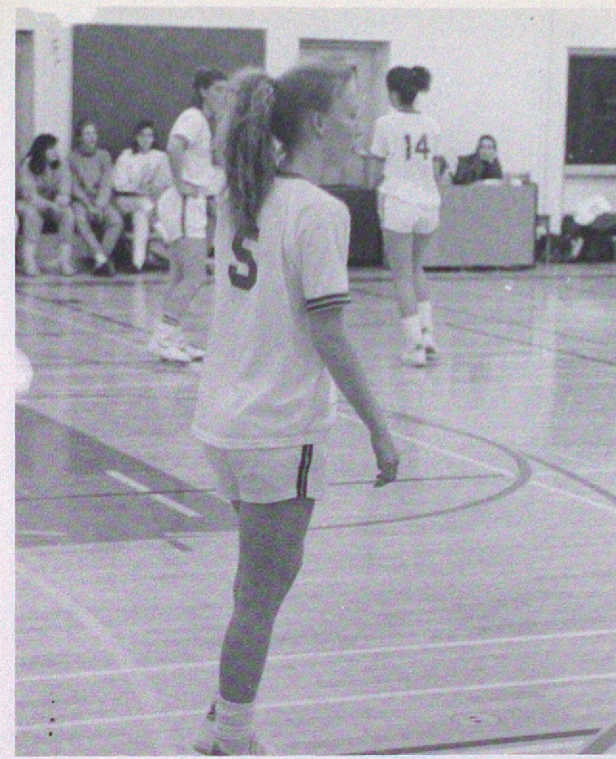

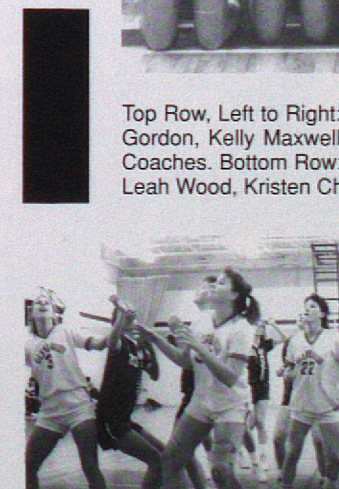
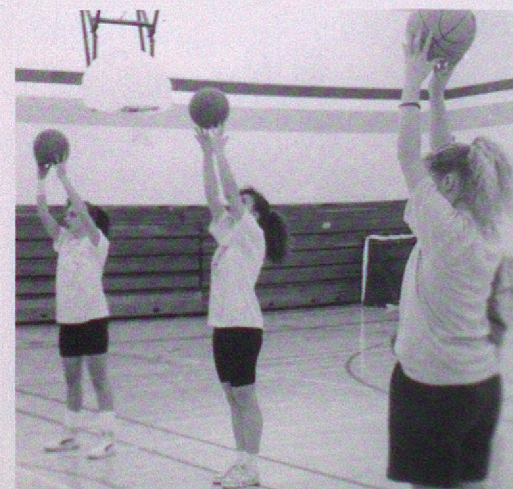
Varsity Boys' Basketball

This last year has been a year of global change - the opening of the Berlin Wall, the fall of communism, the release of Mandela, the increasing consciousness of the

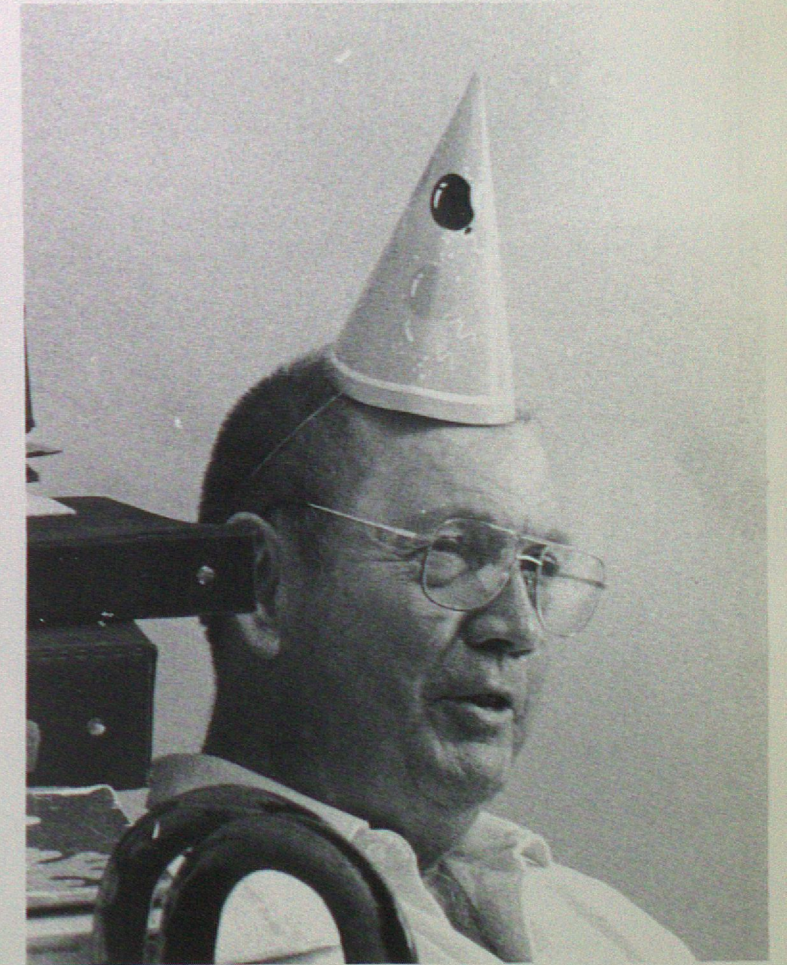

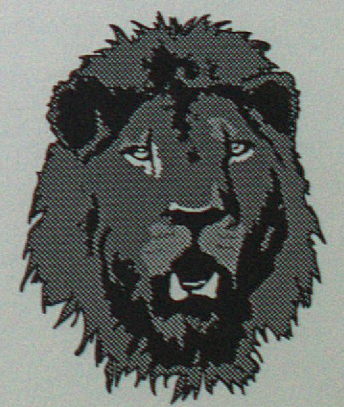
