We are proud of our graduates and wish them well as they face their journey of discovery.












The great thing about a vice-principal writing a brief "message" for a high school year-book is that one can say practically anything and get away with it - nobody ever reads the






The varsity boys' basketball team had a very challenging 1989-90 season. Although the team did not fair well in league competition, they did show well in several tournaments.
