I hope that both statements have some profound meaning to you as you embark upon your journey into post secondary life.

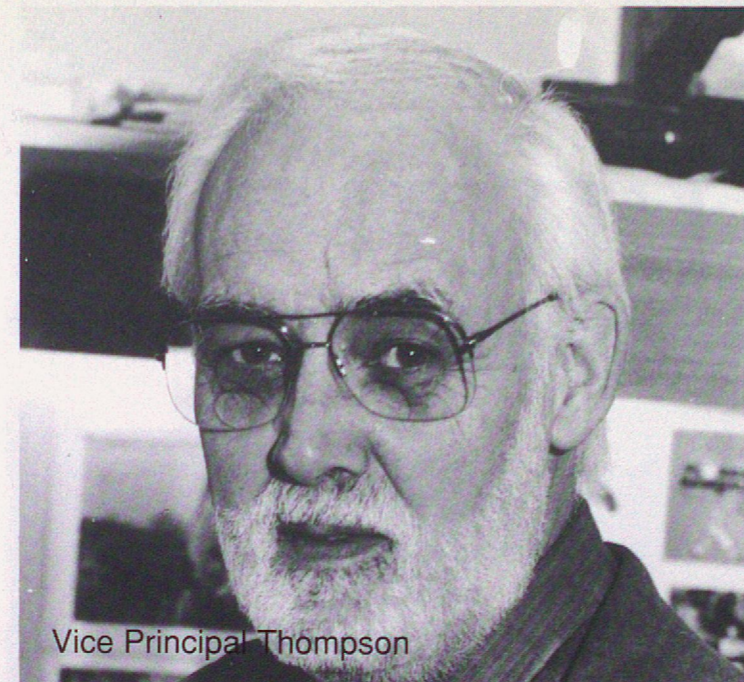
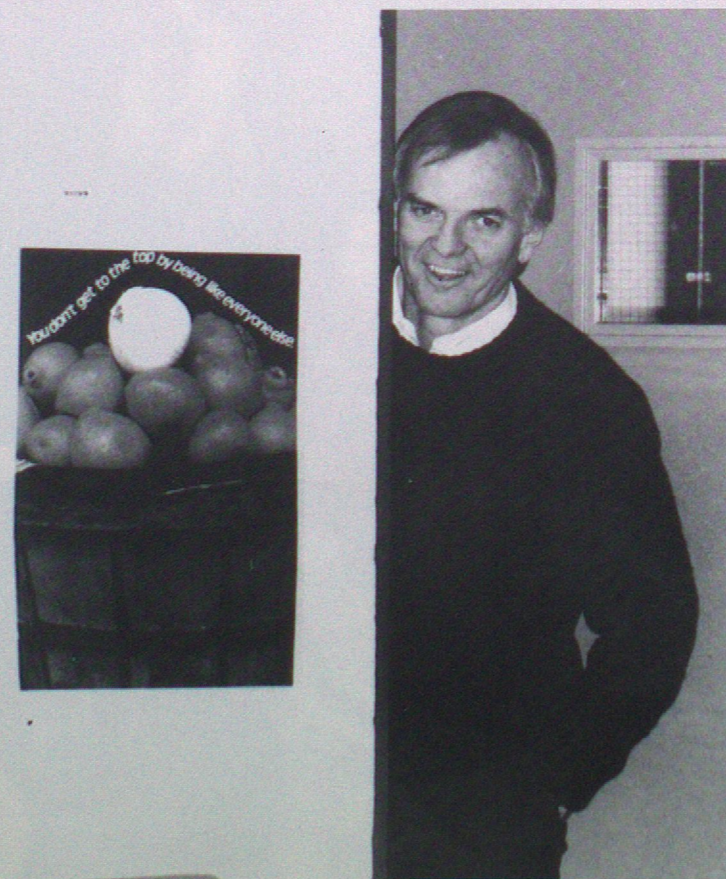

Choir

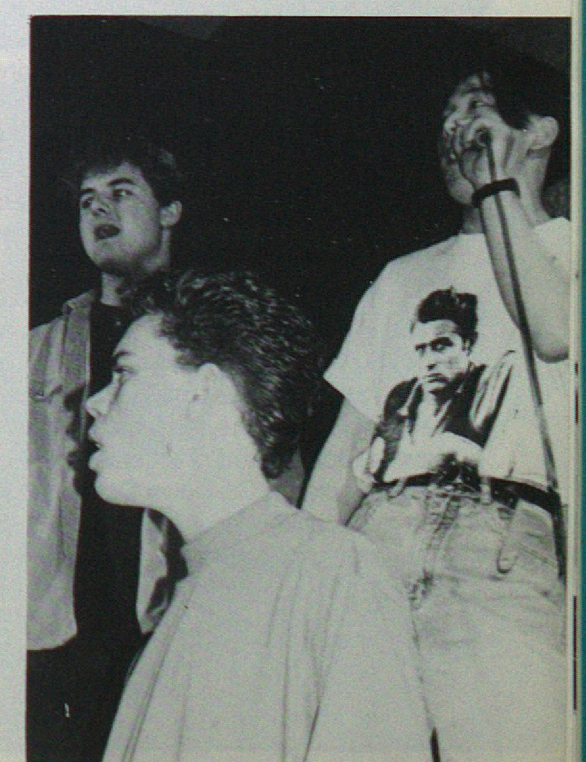

Events included the "UniFest" festival in Saskatoon, the provincial SAG conference, the Manitoba Music Festival, the MBA Fall Festival, the Brandon Jazz Festival, ChoralFest Manitoba, the MBA Solo and Ensemble Festival, the MBA Provincial Honour Band, the Burland Band Day, the Syrinx Flute Festival, the Optimist Band Festival, and others.

Participation was high and so was quality, with adjudicators looking favorably on our performances. Out of a possible fifteen grades at the Optimist Band Festival, thirteen of them were "A"s. Nine groups from Glenlawn were invited to "MusicFest", a national music festival, and we were able to take seven of the nine groups there this May. More important than awards and adjudications however was that the students became more knowledgeable, perceptive musicians. They heightened their own sensitivity to the possibilities of music and communicated effectively with the listeners.

The St. Vital School Division, the staff and administration of Glenlawn Collegiate, the Band Boosters Association and the students themselves have all contributed practically and to the positive spirit at Glenlawn Collegiate which has made all this possible. "If one advances confidently in the direction of his dreams, and endeavors to live the life which he has imagined, he will meet with a success unexpected in common hours."


