B. Thorarinson Principal My message to Glenlawn students is clear and simple: Be grateful for the privilege of living in a country like Canada.





#### Damage set at \$7 million to St. Vital high school

A \$7 million fire gutted part of Glenlawn Collegiate yesterday aftenoon, sending 1,050 students and staff into the street.

Smoke was so thick at times the school could not be seen from across the street, 90 meters away. There were three minor injuries in the four hour blazein the St. Vital school, at St. Mary's road and Fermor Avenue.


The fire reduced the auditorium and old wing to a blackened ruin. Walls partially collapsed and the roof fell in on the 48-year old structure.


The school's newer wing suffered only minor damage.


About 1,050 students and teachers left the building quickly when alarms rang at 11:27 a.m., principle Brian Thorarinson said.

Deputy fire chief Frank Cielen said the fire started in the boiler room.



#### Big Macs to the Rescue!





Mr Taxiera and the McDonald's crew made a fun day festival, out of the two-day fundraiser.























#### Glenlawn Project Breaks New Ground

A ceremony at Glenlawn Collegiate on Friday, May 20th marked the start of construction of the Glenlawn Collegiate Community Athletics and Performing Arts Facility less than one year after a large section of the school was destroyed by a fire.

The ground-breaking ceremony represents one of the first major projects to begin construction with funding from the Canada-Manitoba Infrastructure Works Agreement. The federal government, the provincial government and the St. Vital School Division Number 6 each contributed \$367 000 toward the project for a total of \$1.1 million. The total project cost of \$3.1 million includes \$2 million covered by fire insurance.

The facility includes a 30 000 square foot addition and renovations to 7 500 square feet of the Collegiate. The Community Athletics and Performing Arts Facility will provide continuing education and distance education programs in computer technology, industrial technology and other academic studies. It will also accommodate community groups related to the creative arts, athletics, recreation and technology.





































#### Trip to France


Everyone had a wonderful time and learned many new things. We hope that future French students will have the same opportunity.









suffering.


