
Vice - Principal's Message

To students and staff, I offer my congratulations for another productive, educationally sound (and "fun") year at Glenlawn.



Well, it's true-it is a great school. I am going to miss not being able to see it become even greater.



VALEDICTORIAN ADDRESS



Good Afternoon honoured guests, staff, parents, friends, and most especially, my fellow graduates.












































































Pinner and Dance
