


Presidents' Message

unior Achievement is a nonprofit organization that teaches students about starting and running their own business company.



And make you to shine like the Sun And hold you in the palm Of His hand . . .





































Valedictorian Address

once read that, every today well lived, makes every yesterday a dream of happi ness and every tomorrow a vision of hope. Today, we look upon that vision of tomorrow, some of us with eager anticipation, most of us with total dread, and we think to ourselves, "my God, where do we go from here?"

Some of us will do nothing and then we will use the shortness of life as our excuse for never getting anything done. I have learned that there are some people who will be bothered by a broken pinky nail than by the millions of starving children in the world. There are some who will choose to walk forever wearing a blindfold simply because they are afraid to really see. Yet, I truly believe that there are some of us who will do such great things in our lives, that despite the violence, atrocities and suffering we are surrounded by, we will be able to say that life indeed is beautiful and that we helped to make it that way.

The best advice I have ever heard was to never underestimate the power and potential of the human spirit and as I look out at all of you, I see raw talent. I see future doctors and writers and teachers. Among us, I see the next Jim Carrey, Mr. Nic Ouellette, and an amazingly talented musician, Miss Jolene Fisher. Between the height that Sean Town can jump and Pam Nowell's ability to do as much good work on the court as she did around the school, I see two rising sports all stars. Perhaps I can even see the next Van Gar, I mean Van Gogh. The end of all our exploring will be to arrive where we started, and to know the place for the first time."

If there is one thing I do know, it is that everyone has their own way. Whether our goal is to become the next winner on Who Wants to be a Millionaire?, or you find your wealth instead lies in helping others, whether you choose to get by on your good looks, or to get by on your beautiful brains, whether you write the words that make a difference or you simply read those words, we will all inevitably find our own way. So, then, the only advice that I can give



is that whether the way is right or wrong, is not for any of us to know, but is for all of us to discover. For, as Ophelia once reminded us, "we know what we are, but not what we may be."

Education is only half of it, hope is the other. Separately both are strong, but it is only when they are put together that any difference in the world is made. School loosened our blindfolds, and introduced us to events that were great and to those that were grotesque.

We have learned of the hatred of Hitler and of the dropping of the first atomic bomb. We have witnessed a princess die at the hands of the public, students shooting students at school, hate crimes and ethnic cleansing. We have been introduced to Mansons and Dahmer. Education has given us nightmares. But we have also learned of the survivors of the Holocaust, of women getting the vote and the end of slavery. We have witnessed new technologies that cure diseases such as cancer. We have been introduced to the most beautiful lives of Ghandi and Mother Theresa. Thus, education has also given us hope. I believe that we must take this knowledge and use it to prevent future generations from having to learn the things that we wish we had not

Inside each of us is a voice, one that we will all eventually discover. Finding one's voice is the easy part. The difficulty comes in deciding what that voice will say. Voices that are beautiful and honest will echo forever, long after facts and figures, dates and equations have been lost. A wise person once observed that pure wisdom is what survives after school has been forgotten.

Every today well lived makes every yesterday a dream of happiness and every tomorrow a vision of hope. Today, we look upon that vision of tomorrow, and maybe for the first time, we remove our blindfolds to see things scare us and delight us and sadden us, but most importantly, continue to teach us. Today is the day that we gather together the pieces of everything that others have given us along our way, and use them to make something beautiful we can call our own.

And so with the deepest honor I present to the world, Glenlawn's graduating class of 2000.



















