A MESSAGE FROM ADMINISTRATION





To paraphrase Dickens, the end of a school year is the best of times and the worst of times, the season of light and the season of darkness. There are emotional wrenches to be endured as we say goodbye to graduates and staff members who are leaving us. We know our two hundred fifty grads are ready to go off to seek their fortunes and become productive members of society, but we will miss them. We must also bid farewell to some outstanding teachers who are retiring: Mrs. Wanda Hyde (Library), Mr. Jim Kullman (Biology), Mrs. Heather Bradshaw (English), Mrs. Yvonne Collins (World of Work), and Mr. Peter Smith (Employment Training Program).

Tempering our end-of-year sadness is the pride we feel at Glenlawn's many successes. Did you know that 75% of Glenlawn students graduate with extra credits? Or that 100 students earned excellent attendance certificates? Or that 185 students made the Honour Roll? Or that 48 were offered university entrance scholarships? Or that many World of Work students earned summer employment offers? Amazing projects are the norm at this school: authentic research, archive searches, children's books, multimedia presentations, science /engineering challenges, math field trips, geography simulation games, creation of web sites, operant conditioning experiments, French public speaking, robotics games, computer-assisted embroidery, photography, the list goes on and on. These activities complement the excellent teaching and learning that go on every day in our classrooms.

Staff and students have certainly done stellar work inside the classrooms and, importantly, outside the classroom as well—Glenlawn students enjoy a huge range of extracurriculars, the vast majority of which are run by generous staff members. For some schools, having one learn reach the provincial play-offs is noteworthy. This year, Glenlawn had:

- four volleyball teams in the provincial playoffs and a Freshmen Boys' Provincial Championship,
- three basketball teams in the provincial play-offs, a Varsity Girls' Provincial Championship, and a Freshmen girls' Provincial Championship
- · a girls' soccer leam that lost the Provincial Final in overtime
- · a girls' rugby leam that won the 10's Provincial Championship
- · a boys' curling team that made the Provincial quarter finals
- · ten athletes in the Provincial Track and Field Meet
- · five athletes in the Badminton Provincials

The competition is extremely tough at this level, so the number and variety of these achievements is staggering.

The same drive for excellence is apparent everywhere in this school. In the Fine Arts we had several professional drama productions, including some written by students, a rocking production of *Grease*, improv games winners, art displays in important venues like the Legislature and Portage & Main, sold-out concerts, Optimist Festival medals, and Banff honours. In Practical Arts we had students winning robotics competitions, repairing their own and staff members' cars, building furniture, sewing professional gaments, and catering meals. Our Student Council reached out to the community as never before, raising both money and awareness of social issues beyond the confines of our school. It seems that whatever our students attempt can be achieved, with hard work and, of course, the support of teachers, coaches, advocates, parents, and peers.

While not everyone can win scholarships or trophies, we submit that every student of Glenlawn is a winner, having shown the initiative and exertion it takes to participate, to earn credits, and to demonstrate team work, problem solving and lifelong learning. Initiative, exertion, finishing...these are skills that will continue to serve our lions very well. As you look through this wonderful yearbook in the years to come, revel in the achievements of 2000-2001, never taking excellence for granted, and resolve to strive just as mightly next year and always.










Agatha Christies Appointment With Death

























Grease

ROBOTICS GLORY!!!
















Junior Varsity ...


















































































































































































VALEDICTORIAN ADDRESS

The poet John Donne said, "No man is an island, entire of itself; every man is a piece of a continent, a part of the main". Although the language he used is now dated, I believe this holds relevance not only for the memories of our time at Glenlawn, but also for the reality of the world we

are going into.

Think back to our first day at Glenlawn. Some of us arrived glowing with confidence from the first day, adapting quickly to the opportunities in our new surroundings. Others, like myself, were more timid and took awhile to find our place. But the great thing about Glenlawn is that there is a place where everyone can feel comfortable. We may have found our acceptance in the classroom or the cafeteria, in the arts wing or the gym, or in the drama room or in the halls. We may have gained our inspiration in a book or from a teacher. We may have attained stardom in a play, in a musical or on the court. Everyone became a part of Glenlawn, making it the diverse community it is.

Each of us will have special memories: perhaps bus trips to Banff, playoffs, leadership camp, being lost orienteering in Birds Hill Park, or sneaking past teachers' doors because we had skipped their class. And no one will forget just how close we, the grade twelves, came to losing Spirit Week. Today, we add a very significant event to our list of memories – our graduation! We've worked hard to get here. We know how hard it is to write an English paper or to write four exams in two days. Some of us had to work harder than others, but we all made it here and today we celebrate our achievements.

At times the hard work was a real grind. Sometimes it felt lonely cramming at 2 AM or typing a final copy at 5 AM. But in fact we weren't alone. We have achieved graduation with the support of those around us and we appreciate the commitment of our friends, teachers, and parents.

Our friends, new and old, have always been willing to listen and agree with our complaints, to give us comedic relief, and to be there when we needed them. Although the paths we take will be very different for each of us we must try our very best to not lose touch.

Our teachers, whether we looked up to them or ran away from them, helped us steer the course. At first, teachers like Mr. Kullman may have scared us into learning, but we soon learned that they were more bark than bite. Madame Belenki offered bon bons as an incentive for learning French and by playing devil's advocate, teachers like Mr. Humphrey, challenged us to express and defend our opinions. Enthusiastic teachers like Ms. Jones earned our respect with their insight and by showing us how hard we could work. Countless others deserve just as much thanks and recognition. They often expected more from us than we expected from ourselves and they worked us hard because they knew we could do it. We may not remember the exact details of what they taught us, but they have opened us up to a world of information and possibilities. In our continuing quest for answers and knowledge, we will, thanks to our teachers, know where to look and who to ask.

Of course we are also grateful to our parents. They are the ones who hauled us out of bed in the morning, gave us money (usually never enough), and sometimes bailed us out of trouble at the last minute. As we have begun to explore the world they have given us their wisdom, but ultimately they have also let us learn from our own mistakes. They have always offered us unconditional love and support even when we thought we didn't need it. And as we start building our own lives, we can be assured that they will continue to be there when we need them – for comfort and advice, but probably not the money.

Just when many of us were settling in, we find ourselves leaving Glenlawn for an ever-changing world filled with possibilities. It has been said that everything changes except change itself. This is increasingly true in our information-based society. The internet has connected us with a wealth of knowledge; the human genome is being mapped; our city is experiencing renewal, and it seems that there is nothing that can't be achieved. Not all of us are going to be rich and famous, and not all of us are going to develop the vaccine for AIDS. Whatever our occupation, we will all have the chance to make our mark and hopefully find fulfilment. But happiness will forever elude us if we measure it only in terms of financial and material wealth. Happiness and fulfilment are to be found in honest work, in sharing our ideas with others and in knowing that our efforts have helped. As David Suzuki has said, "Family, friends, community – these are the sources of the greatest love and joy we experience as humans...we undertake difficult projects to help others...and in the process discover extreme satisfaction."

For many, a highlight of our Glenlawn community will be our memories of Spirit Week. The cliques disappeared and we celebrated our individual talents as we worked towards a common goal and shared the glory. The sense of strength and happiness we felt as a united group is something special about Glenlawn. We can all remember back to the Pan Am Games when for a few short weeks Winnipeg was united with the same kind of spirit, but generally the real world isn't nearly as united.

The world we are going into is filled with opportunities for education and employment and in that sense, our futures appear bright. But we can now develop and fulfil our social consciousness by turning our collective spirit towards all kinds of other issues – defending the environment, eliminating poverty and discrimination, and fighting the spread of AIDS. One of my favourite quotes states, "ask not what your country can do for you—ask what you can do for your country." No doubt all of us see things that we would like changed. Indeed, if you have taken courses in social studies at Glenlawn, solutions appear self-evident and it seems amazing that nothing is being done. Our generation has been accused of being apathetic and cynical, but I don't believe this. When something affects us we do take notice. What we should remember is that when others suffer we all do. We do not exist in isolation, but rather as members of a world community.

Along with a healthy dose of scepticism we also have the hope and energy to change the world. The past few years have seen people from all walks of life, including many young people, come together in cities like Seattle and Quebec City to protest injustices. In the sixties, some of our parents once had the same hope for change. In some cases passionate protest has disintegrated into conflict with the authorities. However, Martin Luther King reminds us, "We must not allow our creative protest to degenerate into physical violence." Our scepticism should not prevent us from engaging in politics to make real change possible. It is healthy to protest and question authority, but if we are not willing to offer or support alternatives then nothing will get done and we will have no right to complain.

With our diplomas we have earned the opportunity to go out and affect constructive change. And just as we found our places here together, eventually we will find our place in our communities and the world. When everyone unites behind a worthy cause the power of the human spirit can be limitless.

It is my privilege, to present to you Glenlawn's graduating class of 2001. Thank you.


