

MESSAGE FROM ADMIN



This year attests to Glenlawn's success in fostering prodigious learning of an amazing variety and depth. It has been a year of excellence in academics, in fine arts, in practical arts, in athletics, in technology, in volunteerism, in work experience. The pages of this yearbook capture some of the highlights, and, we hope, some of the joy associated with learning.

"To learn" is an action verb at Glenlawn. Our teachers pride themselves on enlivening the curricula with dynamic lessons, demanding open-ended projects, stimulating field trips, and guest speakers galore. Students have been challenged to use map and compass at Birds Hill and Carberry, to test environmental health at Oak Hammock Marsh, to research genealogy, to write and publish children's books, to cook gourmet meals, to gain valuable work experience at job sites, to produce entertaining and relevant drama, to learn CPR and First Aid, to enter French

public speaking competitions, to build powerful robots, to use technology to improve the teaching of history, to learn first-hand about child development, to reflect on relationships through mock marriages, to create beautiful stained glass windows, to play and sing music of all kinds, to learn from experts about everything from Manitoba Hydro to abnormal psychology to the Holocaust, and to give their expert advice to educational researchers from Manitoba School Improvement Program, University of Toronto and Waterloo University. Innumerable opportunities for teamwork, problem solving and lifelong learning; this has become the norm in our classrooms, where students cooperatively learn and hone skills valued in every walk of life.

Leadership is a "growth industry" at Glenlawn. Our Student Council, led by Janice Fyfe and Kyle Harden, was exceptional. They not only facilitated the traditional activities such as dances, assemblies, and a wildly entertaining Spirit Week, but they helped the student body raise hundreds of dollars and collect thousands of pounds of food, clothing, and drink tabs for local charities. Our Leadership students also reached out into the community, working with Take Pride Winnipeg, Boo at the Zoo and the Teddy Bears' Picnic to name a few, and planning exciting assemblies that celebrated every aspect of school life. Forty-three Glenlawn students were chosen to participate in Encounters with Canada at the Terry Fox Center in Ottawa, an experience that gave them a chance to meet other upstanding young citizens and to learn about how our democracy works. After the terrible events of September 11, students took it upon themselves to organize a benefit concert that raised over \$4,000 for the Red Cross. Glenlawn lions demonstrated over and over again the strength of character that reassures us that Canada's future is in good hands.

Glenlawn is the home of high performance. Naturally, the myriad of sports offered at GCI (most coached by talented and generous staff members) gave students a chance to stretch the limits of their physical and mental strength. Our student athletes excelled, with high league standings in every sport, Cloverleaf Championships in Girls' Soccer, JV Boys' Volleyball, and Varsity Girls Basketball, and Provincial titles in Varsity Girls Basketball (their third consecutive provincial championship!), Girls' Soccer, Boys Rugby and Girls' Rugby and Provincial medals in Wrestling and Track and Field. Several of our most talented and hardworking athletes are heading off to post-secondary education with athletic scholarships. We had fine participation in everything from badminton to track to rugby to golf to war canoe to curling — a sports niche for anyone with an urge to compete.

In the Fine Arts, there were performances that rivaled those of professionals. A poignant Remembrance Day ceremony brought home the realities of war and sacrifice. Blockbuster productions of *Pan* and *Footloose* and a Variety Show involved scores of actors, dancers, musicians, crew, and technicians. Our bands wowed the adjudicators at the Optimist Festival, winning triple gold all round. Our choirs entertained at many gigs here and throughout the city. Wonderful student artwork beautified the environs of GCI, the Board Office, The United Church at Meadowood, and the Assiniboine Park Pavilion.

To again borrow the words of educator Roland Barth, "Those who will thrive in the years ahead...will be those who have become – during their school experience – active, voracious, independent, lifelong learners." We are proud of the school experience provided at Glenlawn, and of a culture that is hospitable to learning of all kinds. As you flip the pages of this yearbook, may you take pride and pleasure in the great year of active, voracious learning it captures.

The greatest purpose of school is to unlock, release and foster this wonderful capability."









This page is dedicated to the men, women, and children who lost their lives during the events of September 11th.

Words From the Director

This year's theatre production was one of the largest project ever presented in the Glenlawn theatre. One hundred staff and students were involved in creating a Neverland not many people will forget. The lost boys entertained the audiences with breakdancing, rollerblading and attitude. The dangerous pirates and Hook sent shivers down our spines with blood curdling sword fights and the mermaids and women Amazon warriors moved the audience with their beauty and grace. The Peter Pan role was played alternately by Galen Johnson and Morgan Adams who both swept the beautiful Wendy (Rachel Dolynchuk) off her feet and out through the attic window. The set crew of 40 people worked for 3 months to construct a 40 foot pirate ship, under ground hideout, the Darling's attic bedroom and the Neverland jungle complete with hollow tree and moving sea. The lighting effects (flying gobo) custom recorded sound track; fog and bubble machines, flash pots, tinkerbell's light, exploding bombs, dummies and chickens falling out of the sky, as well as the children flying out the attic window, all contributed to a very special and exciting evening of entertainment.
