

"Why do we have to learn this?" Students pose this question regularly, and the answer lies in the pages of this yearbook. Yes, there is evidence that a formal education, including reading, writing and arithmetic, serves as a foundation upon which each student's adult life is built. That is why a high school diploma has come to be such a valued symbol of achievement in our society. There is also clear evidence that a well-rounded education is created by students themselves as they delve into the arts, technology, athletics, as they organize successful student government, volunteer for community outreach, and run dances and shows. Glenlawn teachers know this truth, which explains their willingness to coach and to direct and to facilitate extra-curriculars of a staggering range, and to supplement the standard curricula with experiential learning opportunities such as labs, camps, field trips, guest speakers, mentoring, and contests in everything

from robotics to math to French speaking. Our hope is that you will forever learn by doing. 2002 - 2003 was in many ways an education in dealing with change. The amalgamation of the St. Vital and St. Boniface School Divisions into the new Louis Riel School Division brought many challenges. Our students, staff and parents rallied to protect the unique character of this school within the realities of the new Louis Riel Common Framework by presenting to the Board, meeting with the Superintendent, and collaborating on a new timetable that retained our non-semestered advantages. As well, expansion plans announced by the YMCA threatened our access to green space and outdoor athletic training grounds for several key sports. Again, through community activism of the best sort by our Youth For Social Justice and Leadership students, our Glenlawn concerns were acknowledged, and a steering committee, which now includes us, has been struck to begin a collaborative, respectful and inclusive review of the development of Memorial Park.

Another inevitable aspect of change is the "moving on" of important people. That of course includes our 250 graduates, who are off to change the world with their many talents and their well-documented mastery of teamwork, problem solving, lifelong learning, communication and technology. Grads of 2003, your portfolios will be a lasting reminder of Glenlawn, and as you add pages to these portfolios in the future, remember to silently thank your teachers for pushing you to develop skills valued in every walk of life. Also moving on this year are several valued teachers, including Mrs. Briggs who is retiring, and Mr. Kristjanson, Mrs. Quniton, Ms. Jones, Ms. Spelchak, Ms. Yamada, Ms. Leighton, and Mrs. Keller who will be sharing their gifts with new colleagues, new schools next year. Two very significant changes have occurred in the Administrative Office. Mr. Parsons has been promoted to the Principalship of Nelson McIntyre Collegiate, and Mrs. Bulow, the quintessential Glenlawn Lion, is taking a leave after 30 years of service to this school. It would be difficult to find two more principled, demanding, caring, humble, yet gifted high school administrators, and we will miss them. The Glenlawn community wishes our departing students, staff and administrators well, thanks them for their legacies to Glenlawn, and vows to live up to the high standards they have set.

Lions, as you look through these pages in the years to come, it is our hope that your mature vantage point will enable you to appreciate the wonders of your Glenlawn years, to remember with appreciation the community of learners of which you were a part. We also fervently hope that you will be able to say, "I am still learning, I am still growing. I have made the most of the basic skills, the fine examples, the human connections, and the interests and talents awakened and nurtured at Glenlawn Collegiate."




Terry Fox Volleyball
