This scholarship and bursary program is dedicated to developing the next generation of Aboriginal leaders. By encouraging Aboriginal youth to stay in school, FAAY bridges the gap

between the reality which the kids confront in their communities and the opportunities available to those with higher education. It awarded 130 bursaries and scholarships, worth an estimated \$250 000 on behalf of corporate partners. Successful candidates must demonstrate a willingness to learn and to persevere. They demonstrate a willingness to give of their time to their communities. Though FAAY students come from all over Canada, they all share a burning desire to make a better life for themselves, their families and their communities. One of these successful candidates was our very own Jimmy Lee Smith. Jimmy Lee is a kind and caring individual that never seems to tire of helping his family or friends. 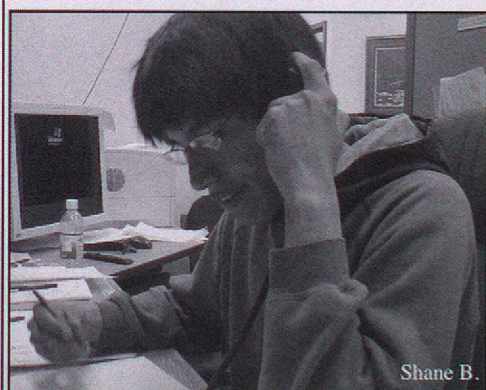
Internship Programs

The Internship Program of 2003/04, at Glenlawn was another roaring success. This innovative program sees our students partnered with such employers as Manitoba Hydro, Assembly of Manitoba Chiefs, Winnipeg Regional Health Authority and Manitoba Choral Association.

Accepted candidates get a taste of the corporate world and see what could be waiting for them once they graduate.

Students from Glenlawn were interviewed for positions with businesses as part of an Internship Program through the Manitoba Youth Career Awareness Committee and the Black Educator's Association of Manitoba. 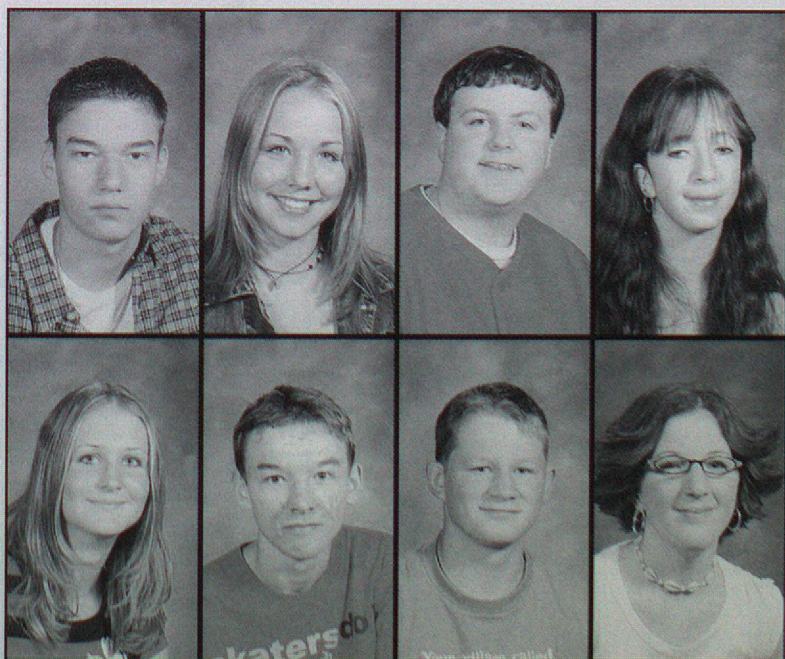

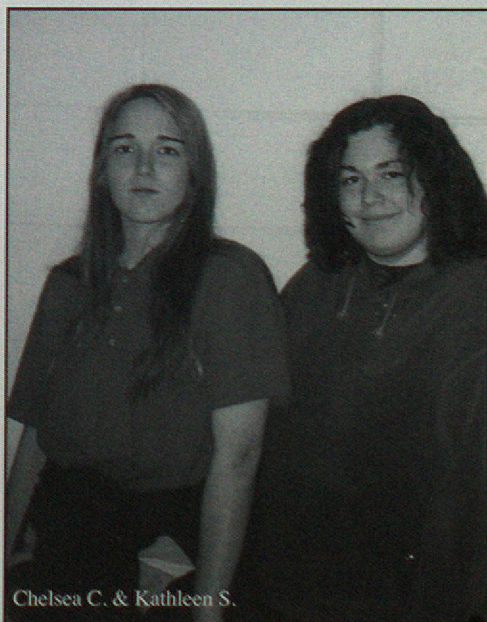

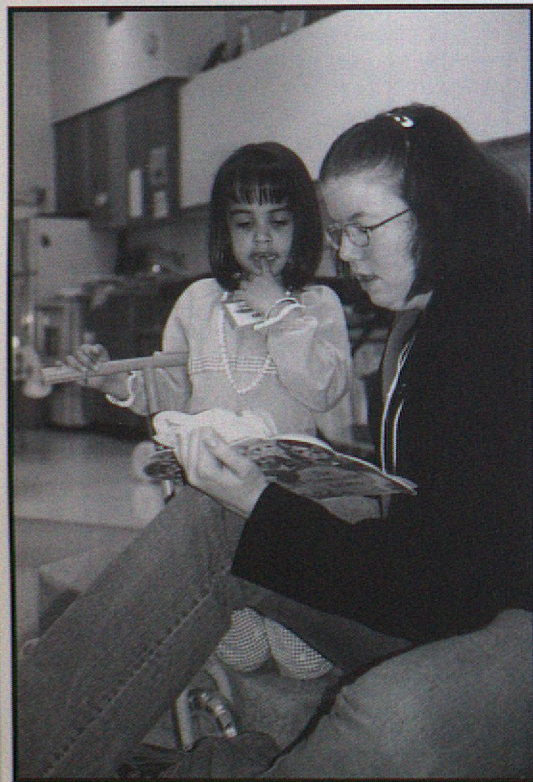


Pitter-patter of Little Paws

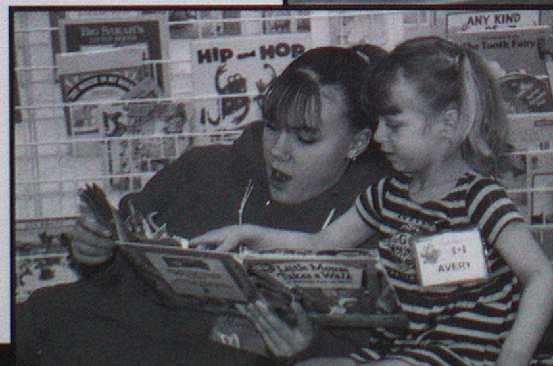
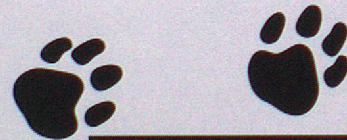
As part of their course work they study the needs and development of children from the pre-natal stage to the pre-school years. This course is great for preparation for parenting or careers involving children.

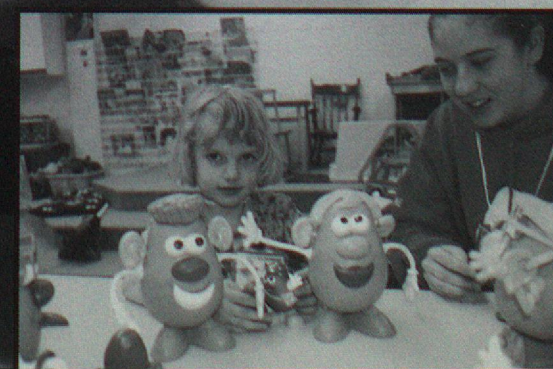

...this is the bestest book anyone ever made for me.

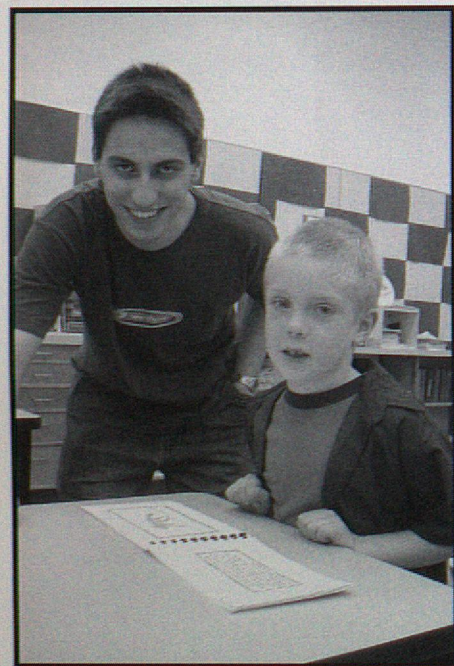

Sounds like fun, right? Well, after spending many days trying to come up with a captivating storyline, the students are confronted with the

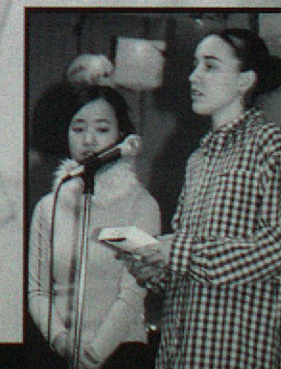
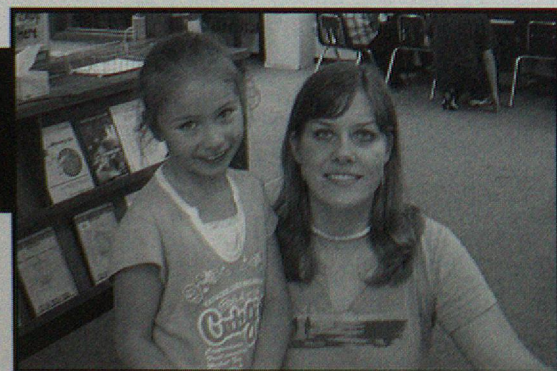

Clothing Part of our Fabric. & Design Part of our Pride. Community Spirit Roars.

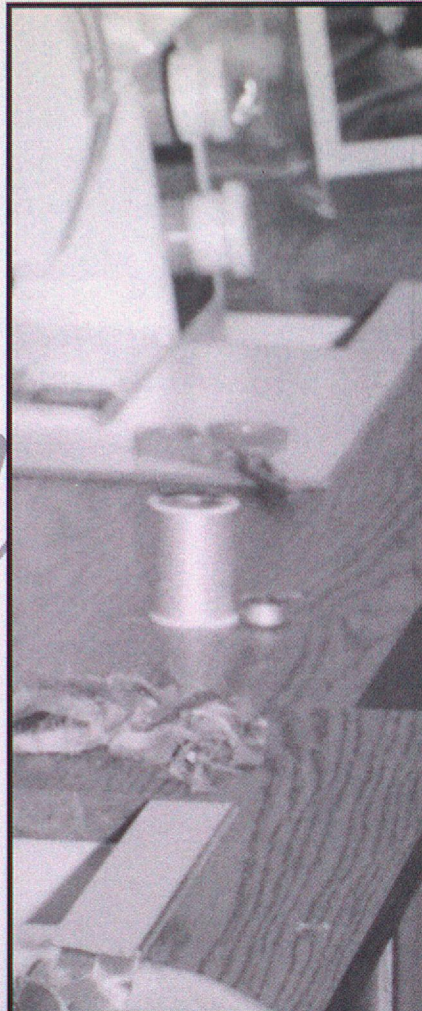

Thanks to the efforts of Miss Dutka, Human Ecology classes in Glenlawn

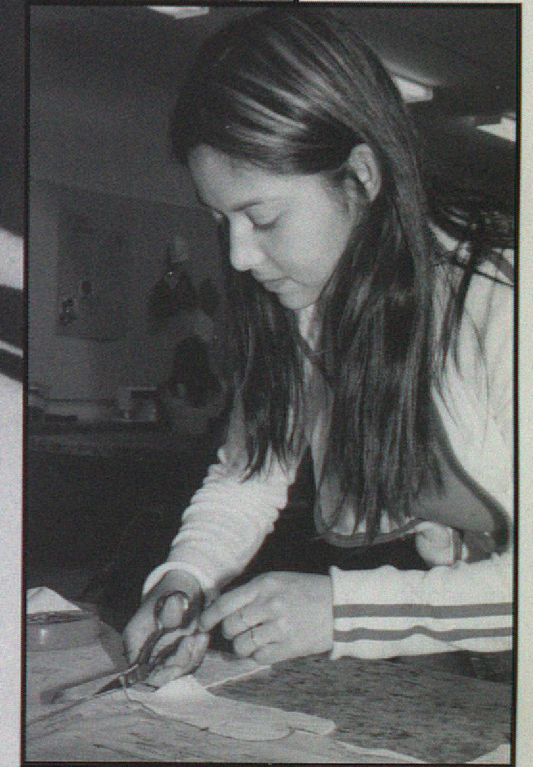
were successful in an application for a Canadian Home Economics Association sponsored "Home Economics - A Resource of Youth" grant of five hundred dollars.

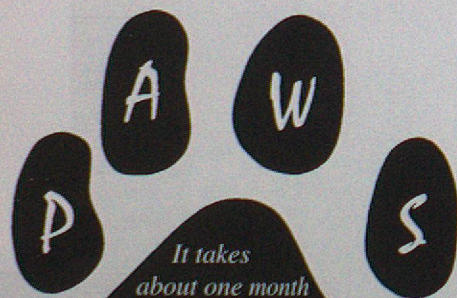

It takes about one month for students to knit their first cancer cap. With finger cramps and dropped stitches it certainly is difficult, but students leave with a life skill and good feelings.



Global Challenge

Global Change Game

The Global Change Game is an award-winning program which educates people about global issues and empowers them to make decisions on these issues. Students didn't know exactly what to expect and were a wee bit worried by the sight of 'lightening-bolt clad 'Gaians' supervising the game.

This game encourages creative problem-solving, critical thinking, teamwork, negotiation, and leadership. We learned how people and resources are distributed in the world, how and why peoples' priorities differ, and how global decisions are — or can be — made. We did all this with our rival school mates from Dakota.

The game is played on a world map the size of a basketball court and requires 70 students to represent the world's entire population. Some student players take on the roles of business and others as government leaders.

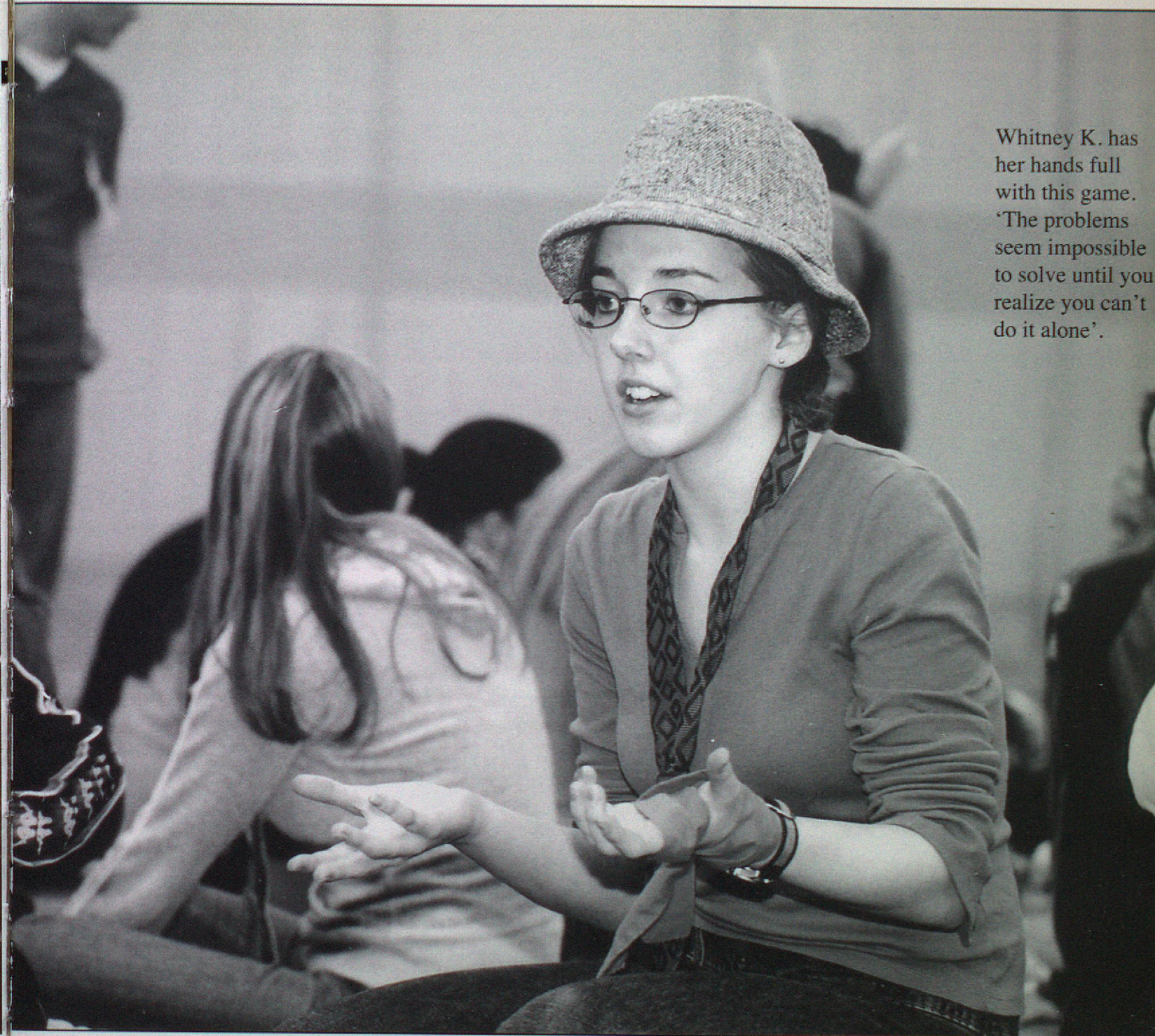
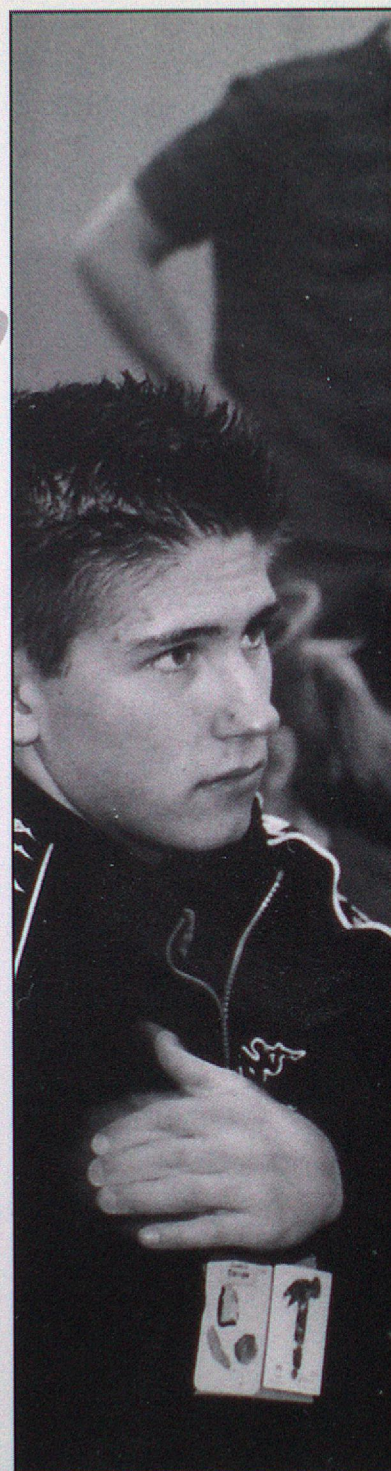
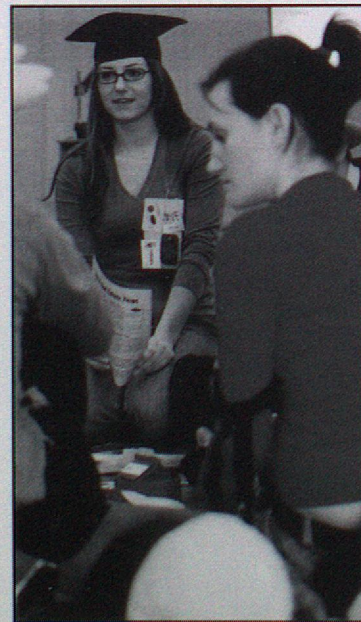
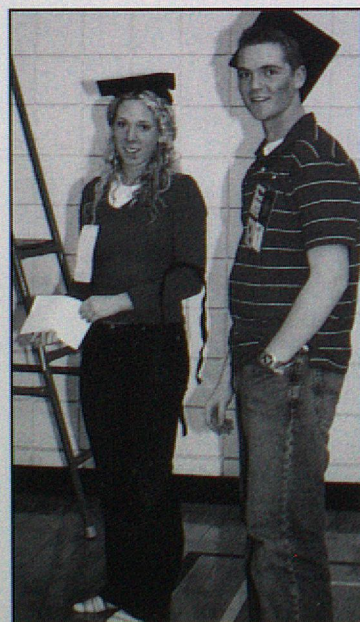
As the game progressed, each country had to deal with different challenges, such as flooding, pollution problems, over-population and poverty.

Each country is given tokens to represent the real world resources of that section of the planet. They also inherit the problems of that continent. Every number of years, a census

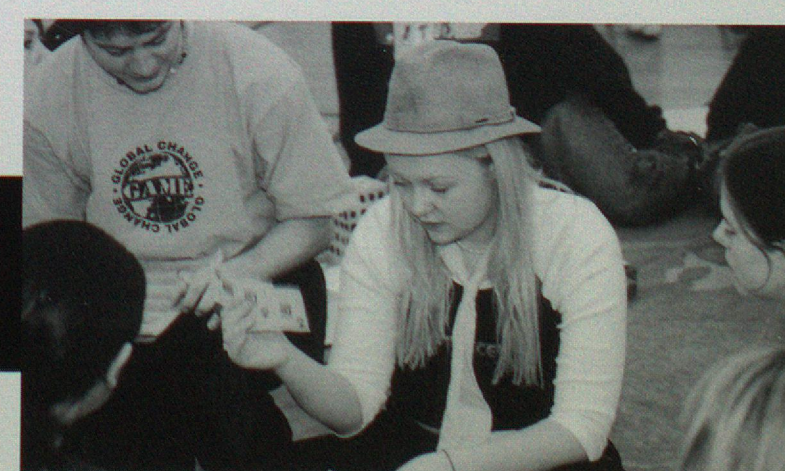
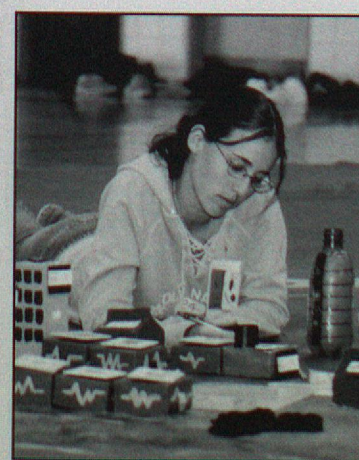

The players select what their priorities will be, and worked with their groups and their neighbours to achieve the goals which they have set. By the end of the Game, many years in the future, the players have explored, understood, and even solved, in their own ways, some of the most difficult challenges facing the modern world. Problems like population growth, war and pollution.

deal with real problems facing people all over the world. Real problem solving and teamwork in action and fun at the same time.

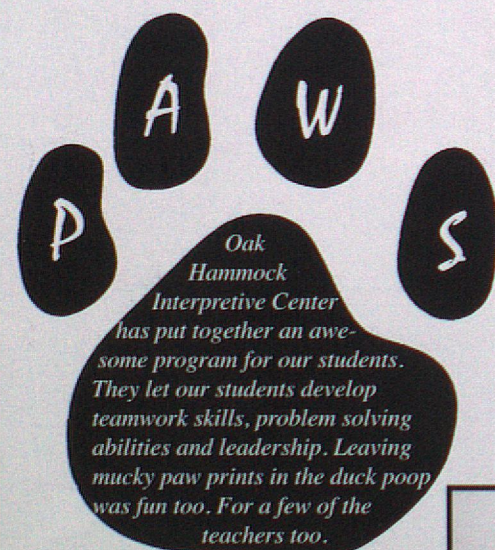
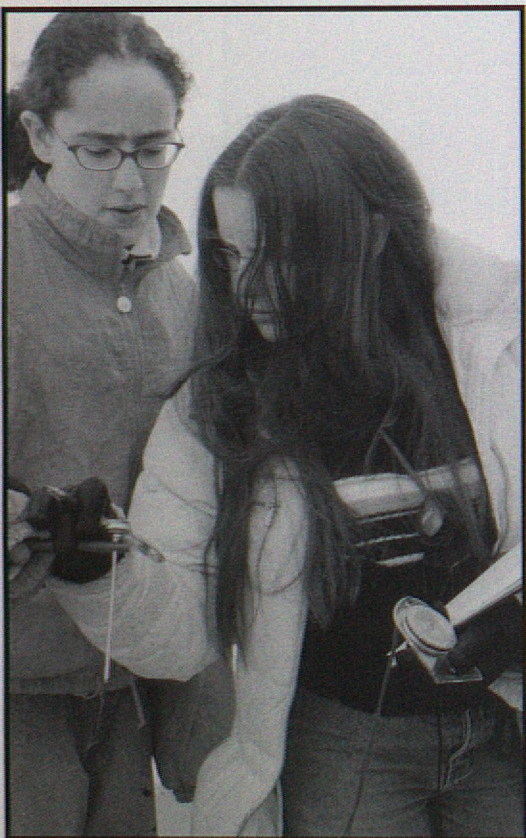


Field Oak Hammock Marsh Study

Can you make it warmer next year?

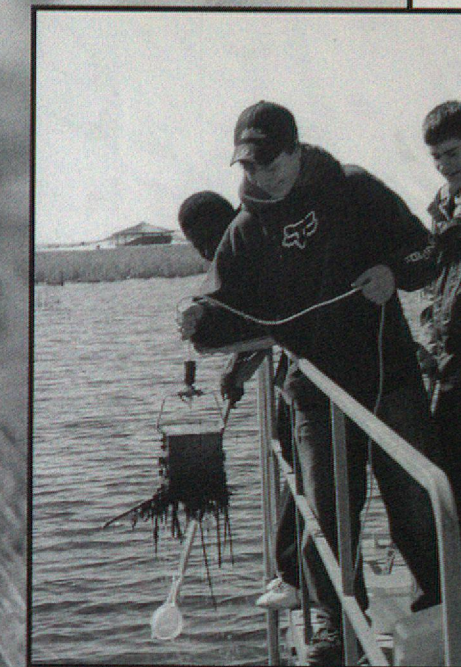

World of Work

In education, one size does not fit all! Glenlawn's World of Work program is noteworthy because it meets the needs of students who are eager to join in the work force upon graduation and who want to be well prepared to get an interesting and fulfilling job. W.O.W. consists of three blocks of compulsory work experience during the school year. Each block is three weeks long.

During the three week work block, the students experience the responsibility and demands of a "real" job, a first for many of the students. Students are evaluated by both the employer and W.O.W. teaching staff. Students are encouraged to choose different work experiences over the course of the year. Their many options might include retail sales, the restaurant/hospitality industry, child care, personal care homes, office work, automotive businesses and construction.

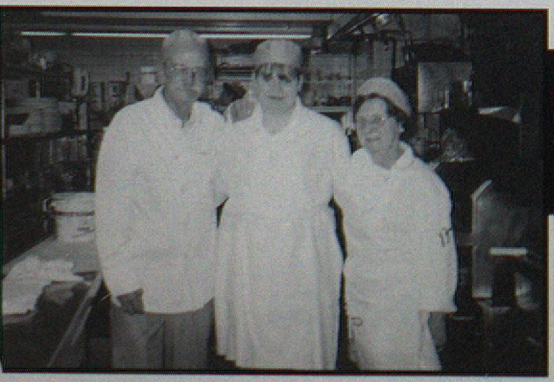

We had been through so much as group and we did all the little things right to reach our team goal.

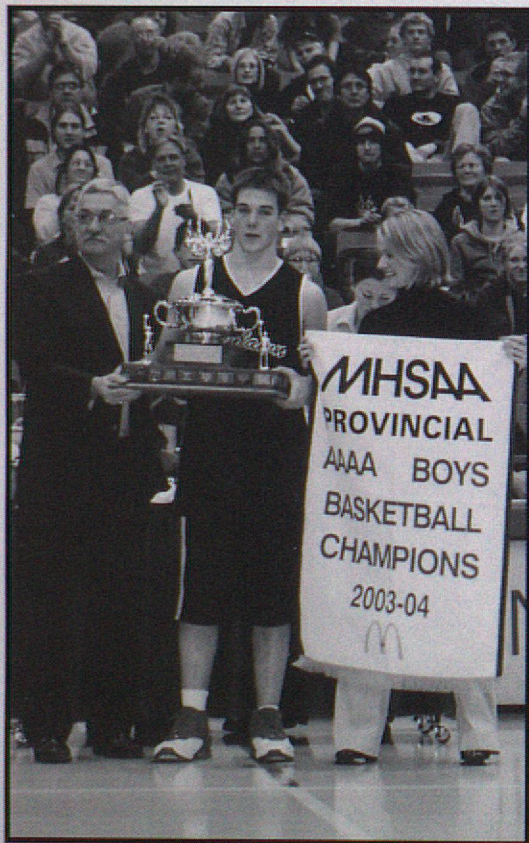

they congratulated us for ending the 37 year drought. We just wanted to know who would be our next opponent. These past 4 months have been an experience that will bond us together for the rest of our lives.

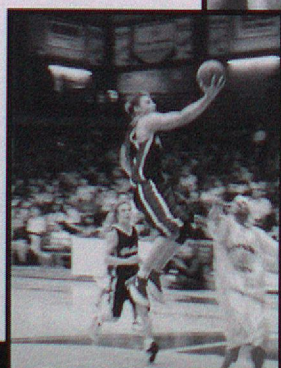

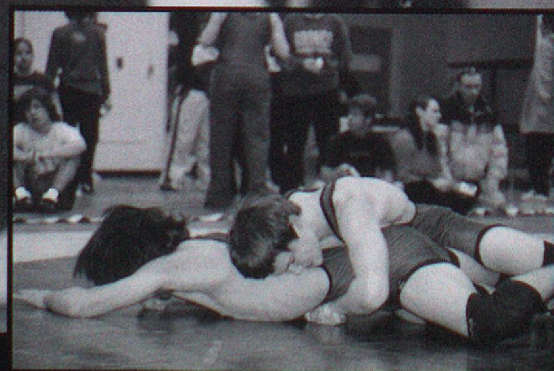
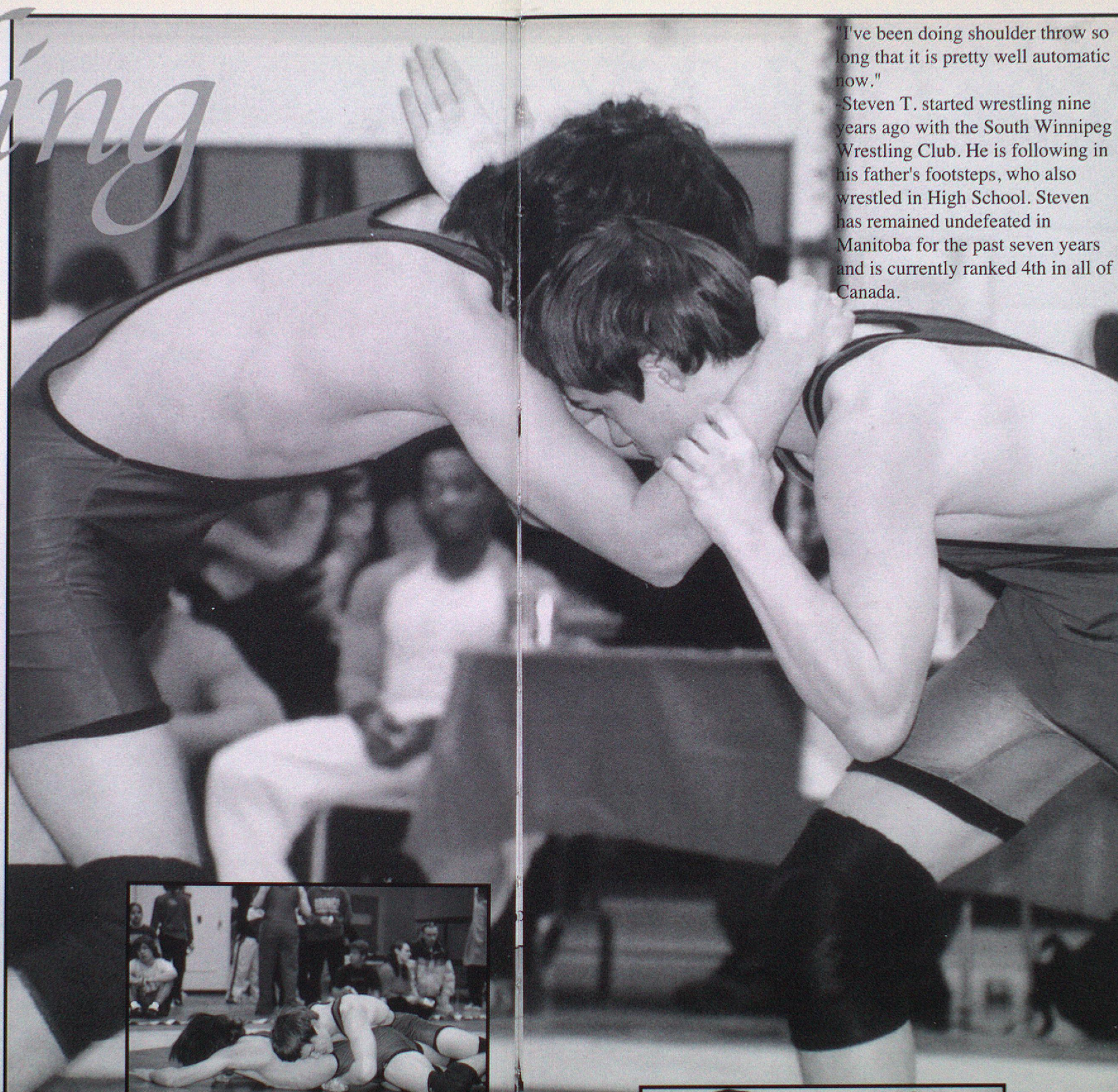


Wrestling

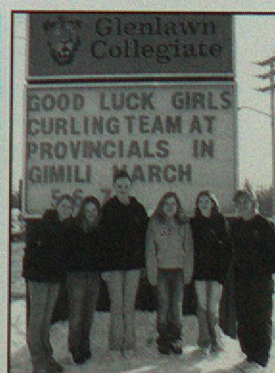
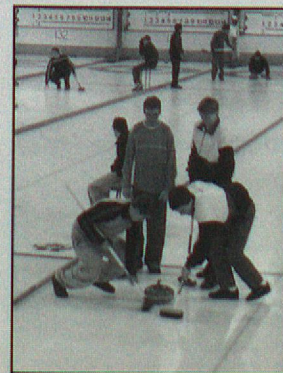
X-Country

Friends, Romans, Countrymen! Lend me your ears! I come to praise the class of 2004, not bury it.

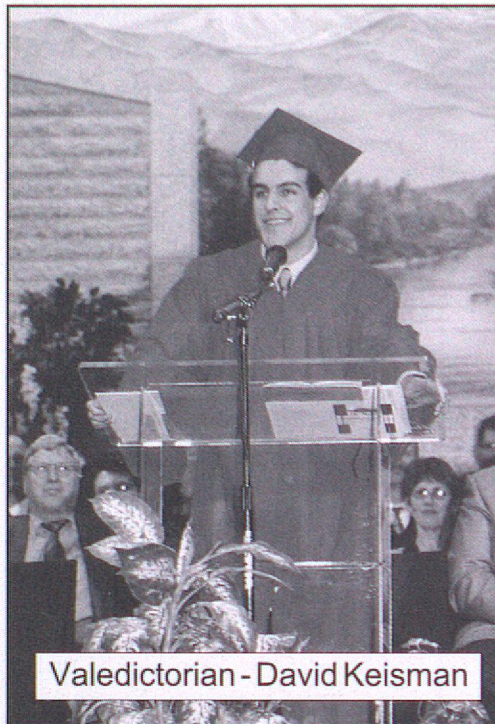
