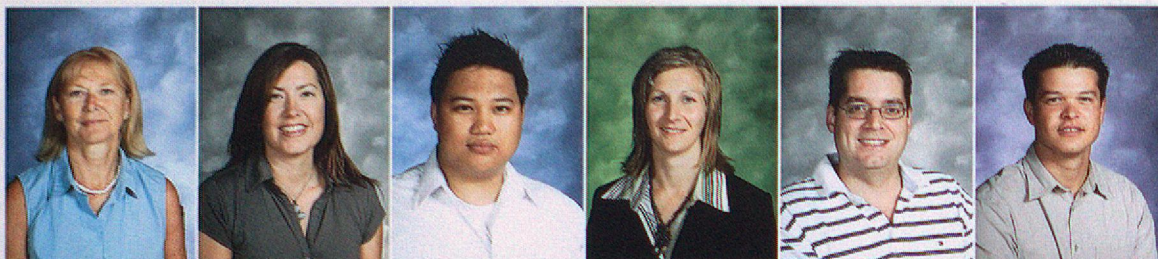
STAFF

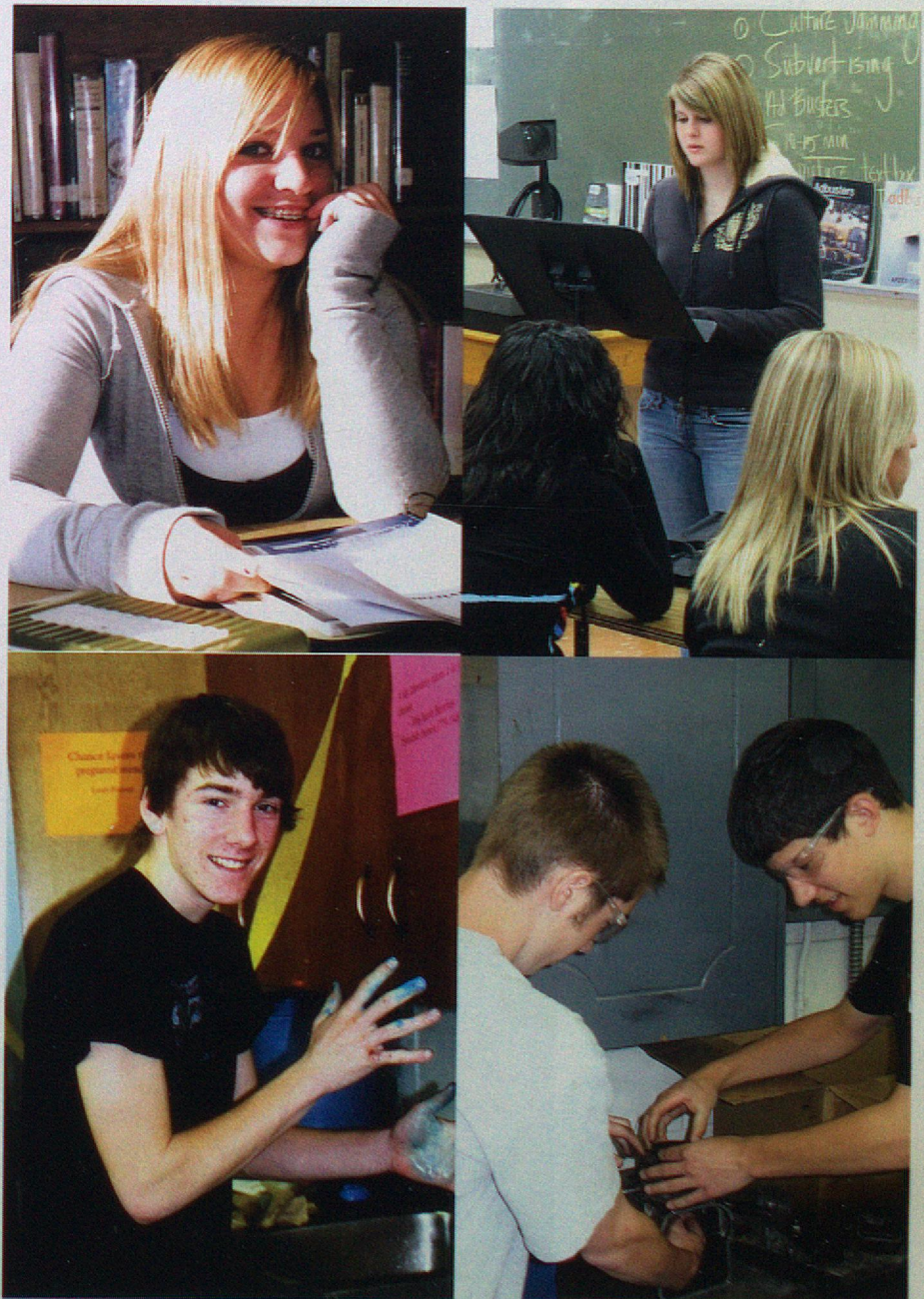
GRADE TEN

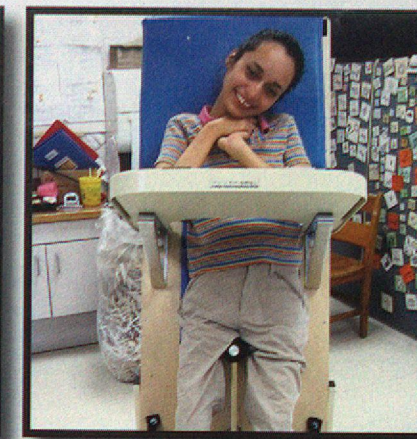


The Co-op Ed class had many things to celebrate this year.

"Within These Walls"

"Brevity is the soul of wit", so just for today I am going to be a little less than witty as our time together in high school was anything but brief.

At this moment in our lives I think we can all agree that "only the educated are free". However, I find it ironic in the sense that for three years we thought we have been confined within the walls of Glenlawn when in fact we have been liberating our minds. The more we learned, the more opportunities seemed to arise, truly setting us free from the confines of our own thoughts.

How did this learning start? Well, initially Glenlawn had failed to meet all my expectations, which turned out to be a good thing. Before coming to Glenlawn, my only exposure to high school life had been through various films such as "The Breakfast Club", and more recently "Mean Girls". I had envisioned walking through the lion's den and seeing the cohorts of jocks pumping iron, the plastics with their faces in the mirror, the preps with their polo tee's and khaki pants, and the geniuses with their pocket protectors and TI-83's in hand. In reality I found Glenlawn to be a welcoming and friendly environment and the students were just ordinary, down to earth people who seemed like individuals I could befriend. From that moment I knew that everything was going to be okay.

This comfort level in my school was underscored during my first experience with Spirit Week. The first day of Spirit Week I wore a red t-shirt because that was what was expected of me. When I arrived to school that day I can remember filing into the gym with the rest of the grade tens and being caught off guard by the enormous amount of energy resonating through the gym. As I peered to the right at the other grades, I have to admit I was a little scared; nothing could have prepared me for what I had witnessed. The grade elevens were screaming their mantra at the top of their lungs and madly flailing their arms, back and forth, back and forth. Next to them were the grade twelves, who were cheering to the accompaniment of a drum and decorated head to toe in blue. The spirit was contagious as each grade was feeding off of each other's enthusiasm. I then realized that Spirit Week was not just about remembering to throw on a red t-shirt, but something more. Spirit Week was the very embodiment of school spirit and the mutual respect amongst the student population. A fond memory I have was during the grade eleven Spirit Week when Jill Ng was breaking down with dancing Gabe, she was just giving it all she had, pulling off the sickest moves; you could tell that that girl had talent. By our grade twelve Spirit Week we had mastered most of the events and challenges. I remember weeks before the tug of war challenge, some of the participants who will remain anonymous, were practicing for the event by pulling a truck across the school parking lot with a rope to ensure a win against the opposing grades. Or, when one of

the participants of the relay race challenge, who again, will remain nameless because of liability purposes, wiped out in front of the entire school, making better acquaintances with the gym floor. Even though we lost, we were still cheering and supportive of their peculiar attempt. And every year we could always count on the dance-off competitors as they popped and locked their way to number one. With having spoken with my peers from other schools, these characteristics of high school life are rare and we should feel blessed to have been able to take advantage of everything Glenlawn had to offer. Nevertheless, "no man was ever wise by chance" and I realized that we do not just leave high school with an academic education but we take away the impenetrable friendships and bonds created amongst our peers and staff, and the invaluable memories and experiences that shape us as individuals and make us the people that we are today. I don't know anyone else other than a good friend who would let you borrow their car to go home and pick up a project that you forgot to bring to school. Or lend you a calculator before a big math test. Or a locker partner who would go through all the trouble of making a birthday poster with all the most embarrassing pictures of you on it. Thanks.

Enough about those darn friendships, what about our nurturing? I cannot even begin to point out our successes without mentioning the people who have nurtured us daily and have had a significant impact on our lives. From our coaches and teaching staff to our loving parents, these were the people who were by our sides throughout our voyage and supported us through our endeavors. For most of our parents, it probably seemed like just yesterday when they were sticking a pacifier in our mouth so that we would stop crying or laying out our clothes before we went off to preschool. Before we part I have one request for all of you before me and that is, "if you can imagine it, you can achieve it, if you can dream it, you can become it. Go confidently in the direction of your dreams and live the life you have imagined." It has been an honor having known most of you and being associated with all you. 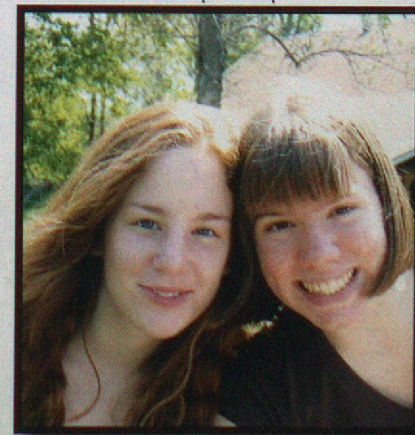
Student Council
