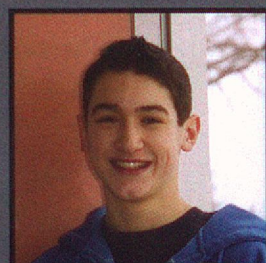

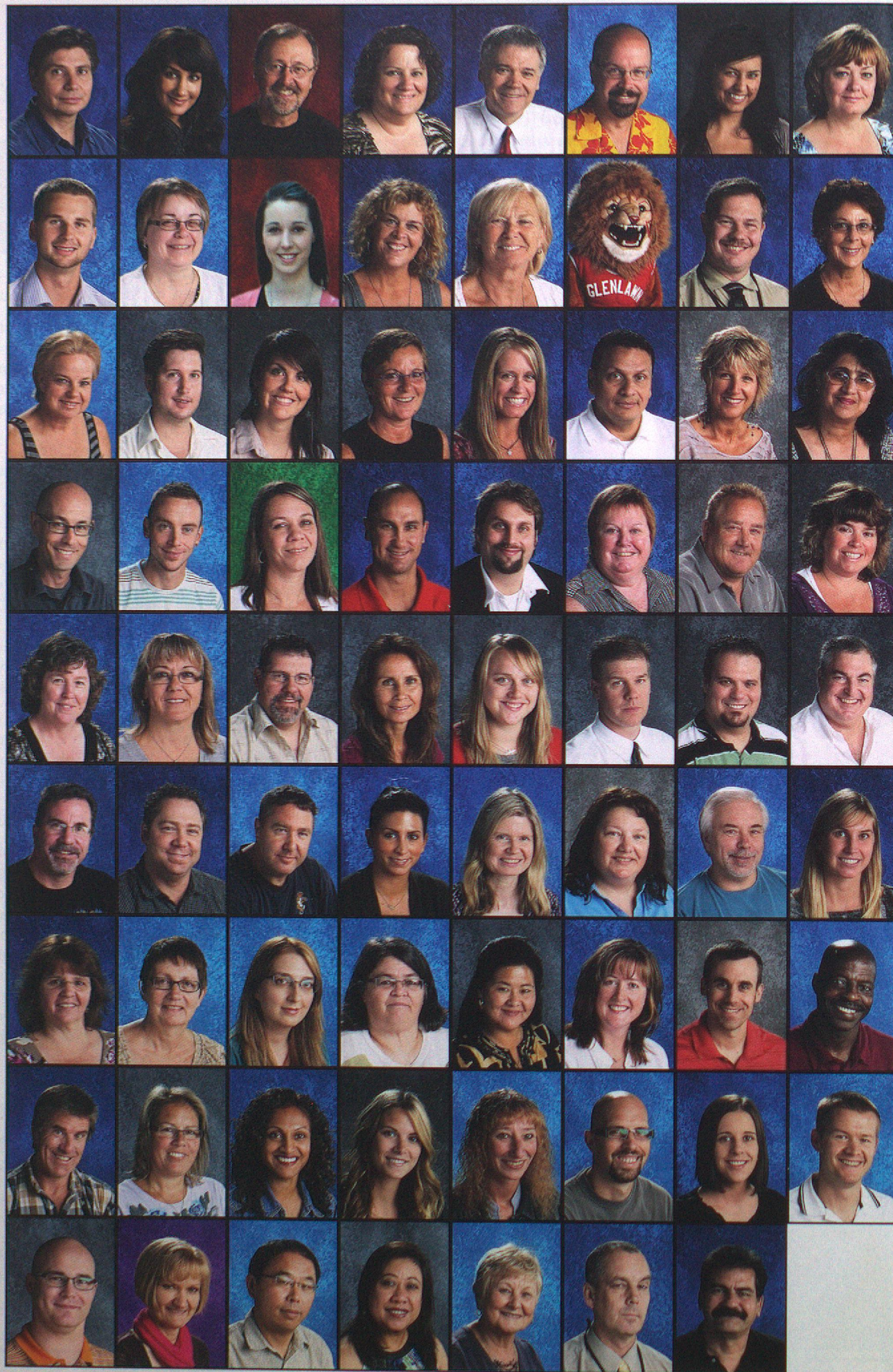
Mr. Heilmann left us for a job at the Board Office just before Christmas and was sadly missed by both Staff and Students alike.

What follows are excerpts from two of many letters of support for Irene Nordheim's nomination for Principal of the Year and though she'd rather we didn't, it is time to recognize her extraordinary achievements.

We wish to add our voices to those who whole-heartedly support Irene Nordheim as one of Canada's great principals. This is because she is the principal teacher in our school and because of the principles and integrity she constantly displays in the execution of that role.

In her powerful vision for our school, Irene is concerned with the greatest possible development of everyone. Student learning is paramount. For her a school is a place of learning for everyone. When teachers are learning and growing, their example is a powerful model expressed to the children in our trust. In her quest to fulfill this vision, she has introduced the notion of Professional Learning Communities (PLC's) to our school. The notion of PLC's is not new, but Irene has the tenacity to stay the course when others give up, the next day. Her capacity to maintain over the long term in spite of the surrounding circumstances and attitudes shows the exceptional level of her moral courage. Her vision of what can be, and her efforts to help and encourage us along that path are sterling examples of how she is our principal teacher.

Her boundless good humor and energy are in the service of learning for every person, and through her, this service is becoming our prime and focused mission. Irene cares for all facets of the child's life and anticipates that staff will do the same. Her vision of the school for students is a safe and uplifting environment where achievement can occur. This vision is realized through

her actions. Her positive and caring acts are of such depth that they encompass with grace what are always difficult but necessary parts of a principal's job. She doesn't defend the indefensible. Serious breaches receive serious attention. Every person is expected to give respect, not in order to enforce some hierarchical power structure, but to draw forth the dignity that is within us. Through her care for the dignity of all, our school is safe, relaxing and conducive to having every child get the best possible education.

She leads by showing true respect herself. She demonstrates deep respect for the capacities and potential of others by the way she shares power and encourages others. Distributed leadership is more than an ideal with Irene. Staff is now in the position of forming the school plan and implementing it. The role of administration is never abrogated at Glenlawn; it is extended.

Her respect is not contingent, and this provides a safe and stable foundation that allows others to experiment reflectively. She encourages and supports true growth, recognizing that this process is messy, non-linear and not guaranteed. However, the very support she gives and the importance she places on this growth make it virtually impossible for a person not to grow profes-

sionally and personally.

Irene is Glenlawn's umbrella. Her energy and respect reach out over everyone, and she deflects the worst of the storms from above, sometimes at cost to herself. These costs are never mentioned – it would detract from the service to students – but they are there. Her selfless and humble approach brings us all together to work hard for professional growth, for our colleagues and for kids.

When a person will suffer so that others don't, when they hold others to account tactfully in the name of dignity for all, when her whole being is about ministering to the growth of others, and when all that is done with humor, knowledge and a light touch, then you have a principal. Irene Nordheim is an exceptional one.

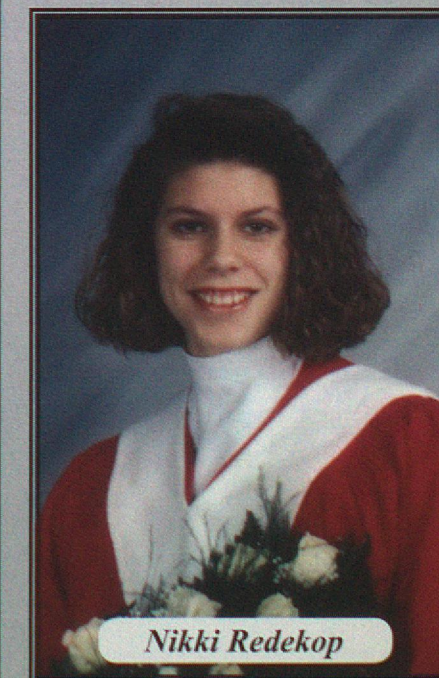


This year we made a sinifi-

that is the late Nikki Redekop.

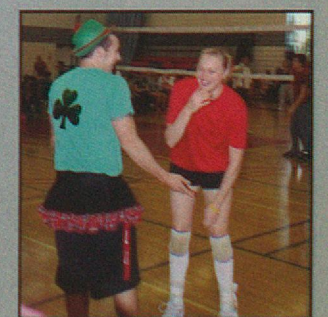
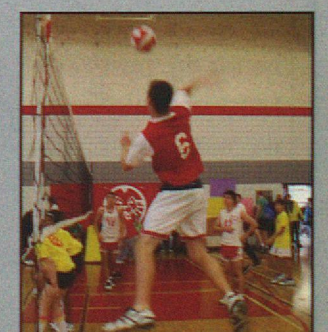
During her lifetime, Nikki

tivities, Andie uses a speech generating device, called a 'Maestro'.

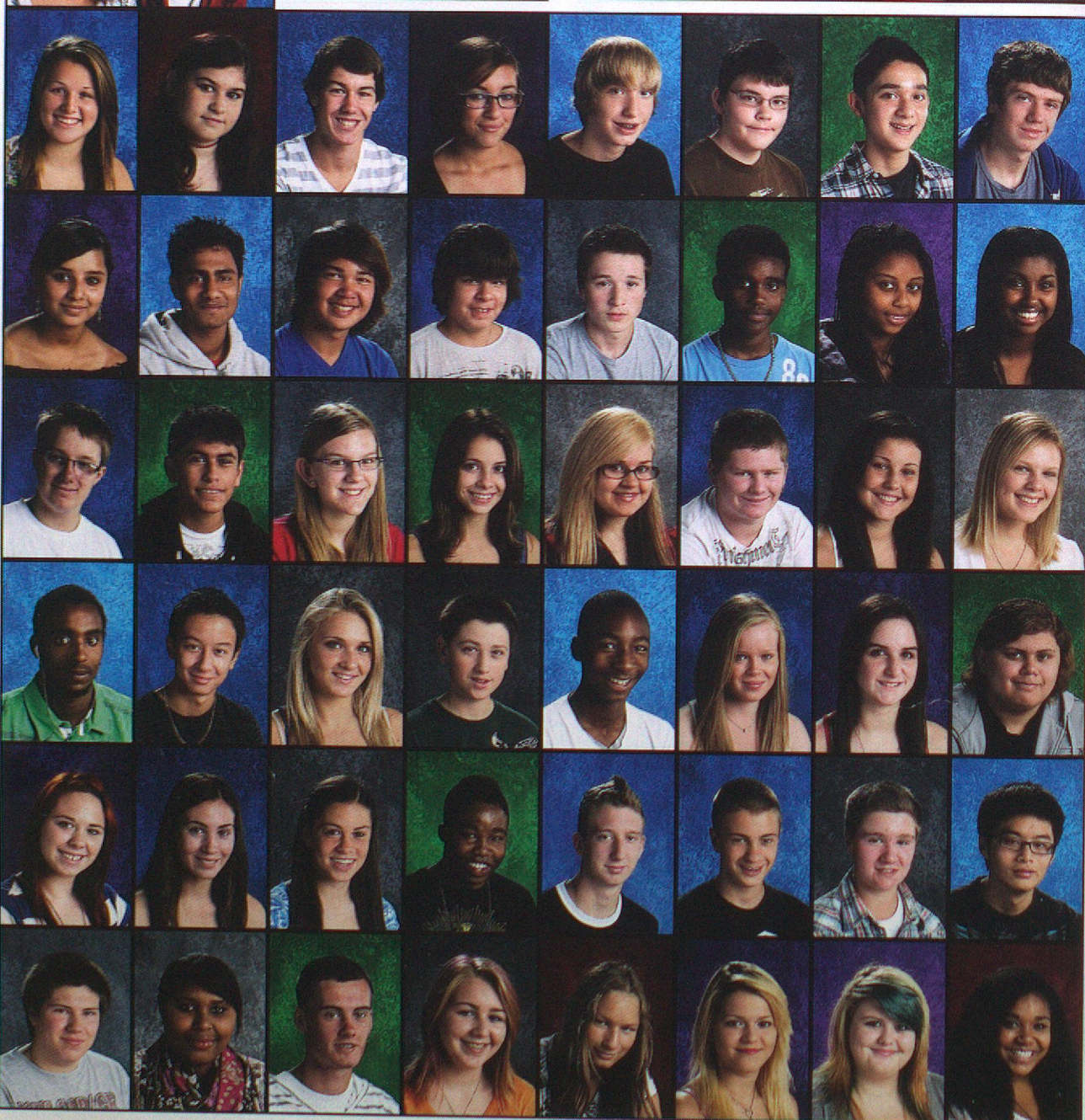

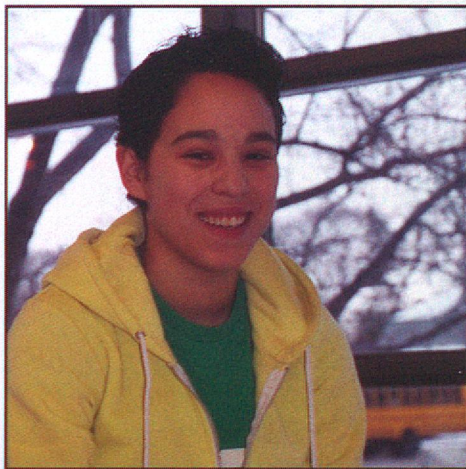

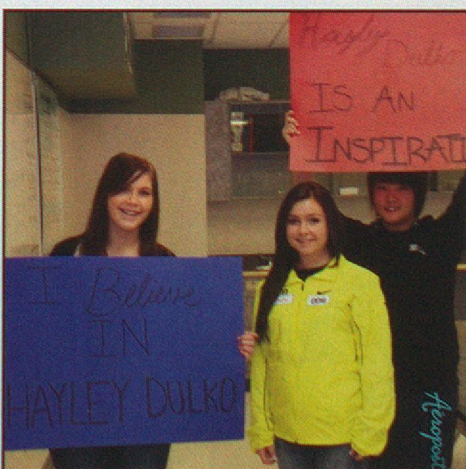

teams.

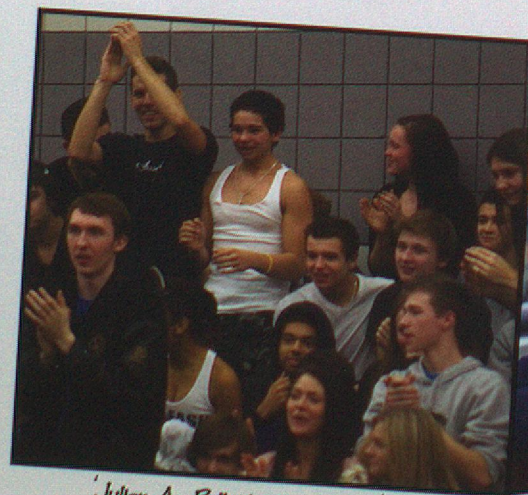

Courageous

*I'm so tired of the fear that
Weighs us down with wrong assumptions
Of broken hearts and natural function. ~Amanda Marshall*

My name means "faith." I am 18 years old and I was born in a small town called Mega in Ethiopia. I come from a large family of 15 brothers and 15 sisters. My dad has 30 children and my mother has 10 children; 8 girls and 2 boys. I am the youngest child of my mother's children. My father used to be a teacher and a pastor. Later on, he became a farmer. Life was harder for my father as a farmer, but he did his best to send us all to school and to take care of us.

I began School when I was 8. Ethiopian school is much harder than school in Canada. Most of the classes were lectures with lots of homework and many class activities. In Canada, school is easier. There is not as much homework, kinder teachers, and computers are available for student use. There is also a freedom of speech; in Ethiopia, there is no freedom of speech. To speak your mind is considered rude. Another difference is that in Ethiopia, most families do not send their girls to school. School is for boys. But in Canada, everyone is treated the same. In Ethiopia, girls are expected to stay at

home and help their mothers with chores like fetching water, cooking and collecting firewood.

When I was 11 years old, I went to Kenya to visit my brother and his family, and I will never go back to Ethiopia again. My brother had a business where he sold goats and he wanted me to stay with him and help take care of his family. I lived in Kenya for about 6 years before coming to Canada. Kenya isn't a safe country like Canada. People steal things from each other and fight a lot. I was so scared because every night I would hear guns shooting. I once saw a woman stab another with a knife with my own eyes. She stabbed a man too. There was no one looking after me when this happened, and it was just me and my little brother.

About two years after, my brother closed his shop as business was not going well. It was then I began to go to Islamic school. It was February 2, 2007 at 6 in the evening. I was coming home from my sister's house. There were men hiding and waiting for me on

the street I was walking. They kidnapped me and tied a cloth over my eyes so I could not see where they were taking me. I had no idea where they took me. Three of them left, but one of them remained with me. He told me he wanted me to be his wife. I refused him but then everything turned upside down. In my culture, it is normal for the man to choose the woman he wants to marry, but I don't agree with this idea. My brother had accepted an offer for my sister, but my sister said no. After 3 days, he brought me to his house to be his wife. We stayed there for about 10 days, and then to my surprise, my sister showed up with 2 police officers. The police arrested the men who had captured me. That moment in my life made me worried and depressed. My sister took me to her house and I stayed with her. She took me to the Human Rights Centre to make a statement, and once they understood what had happened to me, they took us to the Centre to stay. We stayed there for about 2 years. The organization that helped us is called I.O.M. (International

Organization for Migration). They helped us a lot. They first talked to the U.S. Embassy, then they talked to the Canadian Embassy, and it finally got us accepted to leave Kenya. My life changed after that.

I was happy to know I was coming to Canada, but I was sad that the rest of my family was fighting because of me. I came to Canada on December 17th, 2009. Everything was so different that day. It was the first time I traveled across the ocean and the first time on a plane. I came to a different culture, people and language. Here in Canada everyone has equal rights, no matter who you are.

In the future, I want to become a Social Worker. I believe in equal rights for all: men, women, Christian, Muslim, people with disabilities, or people of different races. I want to fight for people. I believe that in Canada I have the opportunities to go far with my goals.

And this is where Mr. K. and Pythagoras part company, because whether it is in eating black bean soup or in demonstrating his zest for life, Mr. K. is full of beans.

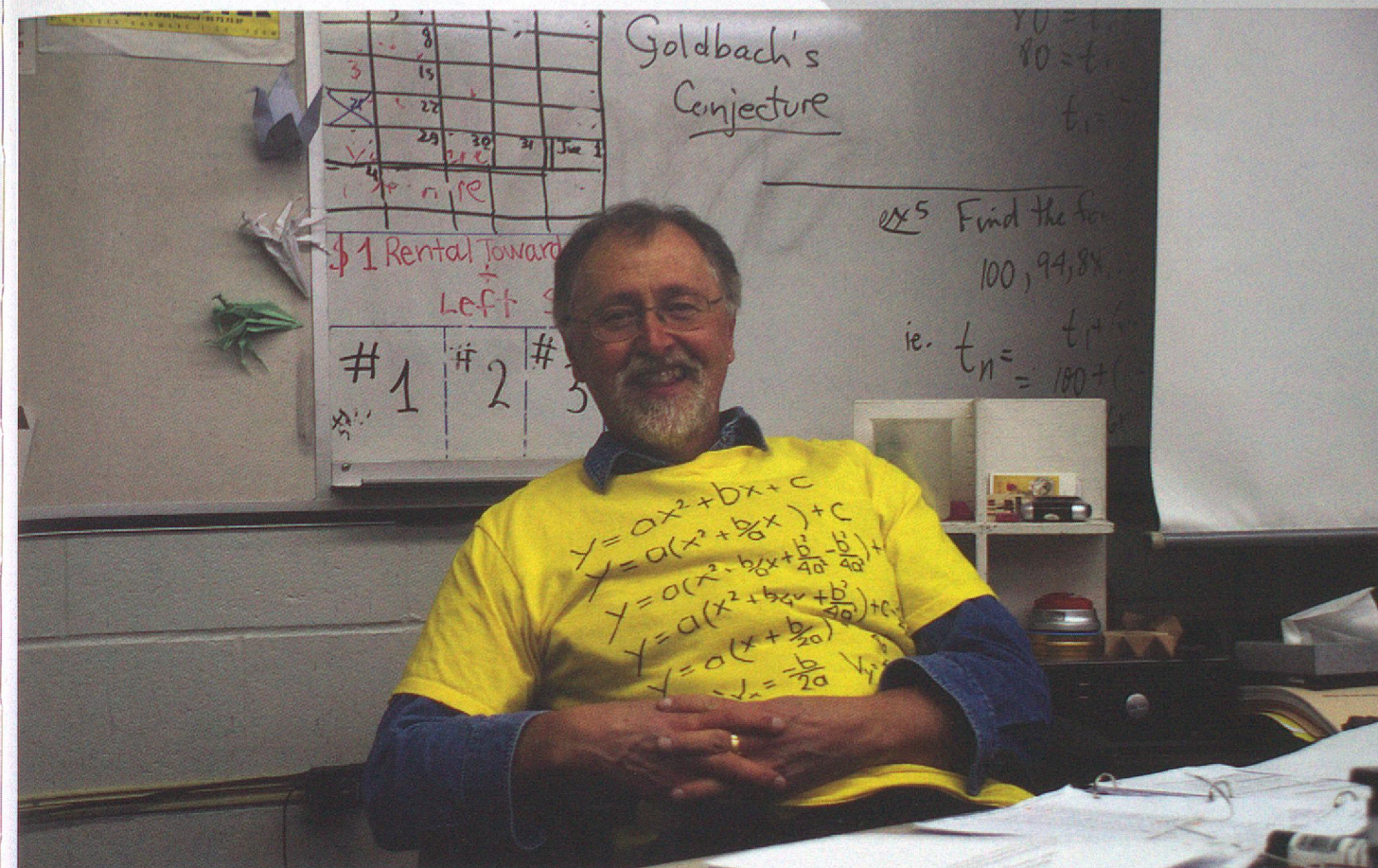

Free the Children through a Vow of Silence



The Vow of Silence is the Free The Children's annual fund-raising and awareness-raising campaign that engages tens of thousands of participants to stand up for children whose rights are not being upheld. Young people will go silent for 24 hours in solidarity with children who are being silenced by poverty and exploitation.

For Vow participants, being silent can mean refraining from speaking. It can also mean not using email, Facebook, Twitter or text messaging. It can even mean not using hand gestures, note writing or any communication at all. Many students, and staff at Glenlawn were silent in solidarity with children who are denied their human rights and denied their voice.

Project Love - raised awareness and money to send 30 school supply kits to students in Africa. The kits include pencils, paper, and oth-

er basic education utilities.

Walk for Water - over 500 Glenlawn students walked to show awareness for people that are less fortunate and don't have a supply of clean drinking water. G.R.O.W. raised a grand total of \$5800 to build a well in India. \$5000 of that was donated by the Keg Spirit Foundation.

G.R.O.W. visits feeder schools to raise awareness to younger grades with the message: "You can still make a difference... even if it's a small one." -Ms. Kuziw.



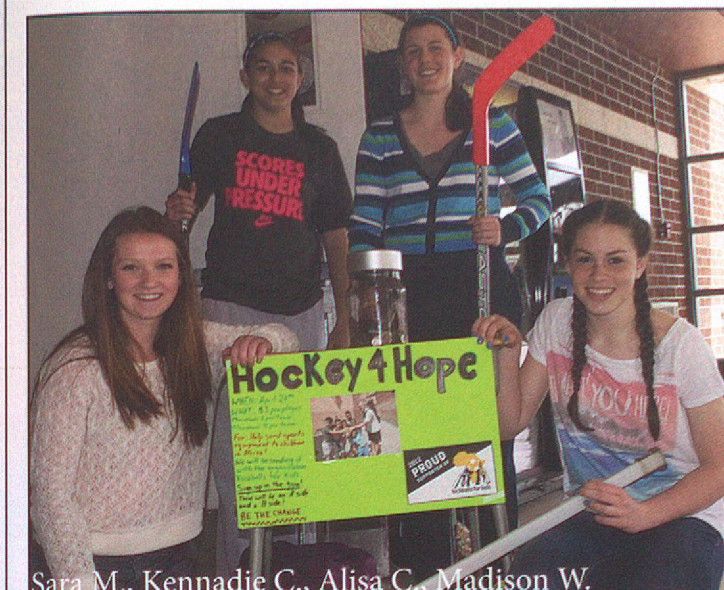

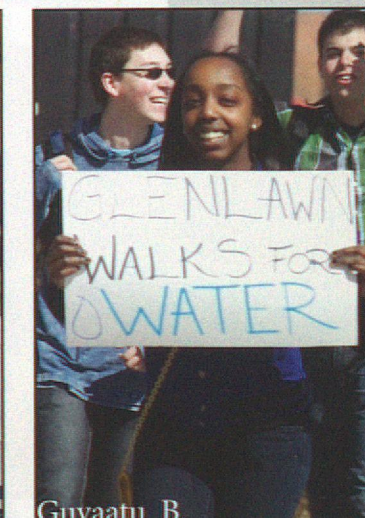
Hockey For Hope

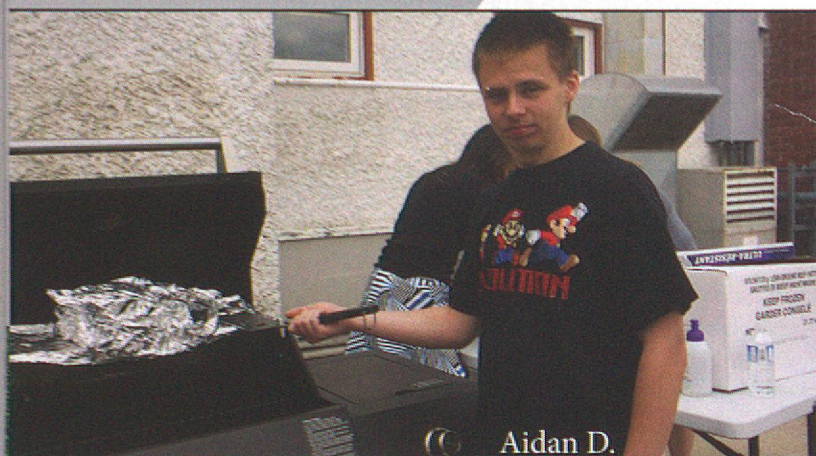
For a nominal fee staff and students could partake in Nan bread, samosa and a heavenly hummus. Students were lined up three deep, ea-

In 1973, at the age of 15, Rick Hansen's life changed forever. He was involved in an accident that paralyzed him from the waist down. Coming to terms with his new life, he found inspiration from teachers, coaches and family, and set new goals from new dreams. Rick went on to become one of Canada's most decorated Paralympic athletes.

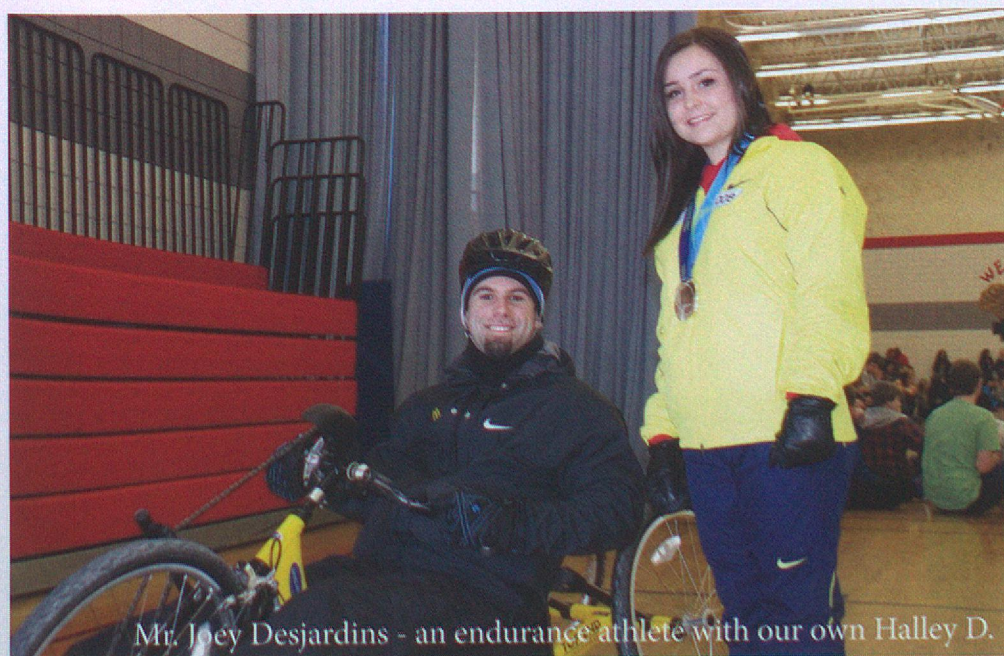
In March 1985, Rick set off from Vancouver to wheel 40,000 kilometres through 34 countries on the Man In Motion World Tour to prove the potential of people with disabilities. His 26-month journey inspired an entire nation to believe anything is possible and moved thousands to make a difference.

Since 1988, the Foundation has leveraged the \$26 million raised during the Tour into \$252 million in investments towards spinal cord research, accessibility projects and quality of life initiatives.

From August 24, 2011 to May 22, 2012, the cross-Canada Rick Hansen Relay travelled 12,000 kilometres through 600 communities from coast to coast, recognizing 7,000 Canadian difference makers who are having an impact in their communities.

Two of these extra-ordinary Canadians are Glenlawn's very own Halley D. and Richard Y.

Insights from the Director

Q1: Were your expectations met by the cast and crew for the musical?

GC: "Well my expectations weren't met, they were exceeded and if I could have changed anything I probably would have started a bit earlier or used the time more wisely in the last three weeks."

Q2: What made you decide to put on this show?

GC: "We decided on Les Mis-erables because of great group of leaders coming in, and we had an awful lot of strong singers. So

Q3: Were there any other choices instead of Les Miserable?

I find that to be very interesting and when I read the novel it was very apparent that Javert was the most intriguing character out of a lot of them."

Q5: What was your favorite scene in the play?

GC: My favorite scene was the final scene, it was very powerful for me. The play is very bleak

and at the end you get the moment of victory, and it feels pretty good."

Q6: What was the most difficult aspect of producing the play?

GC: I don't know if this is the right answer, but it is the one that strikes me right away. Time management, making sure every piece has adequate amount of time to be rehearsed."

Q7: Do you have any current plans for next year?

GC: Yes we do, the musical we have chosen will be the Sound of Music."

Les mis' the musical was based on the novel made by Victor Hugo. In which was considered to be one of the greatest novels in the nineteenth century.

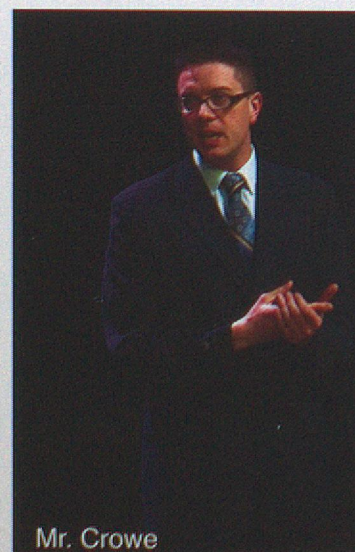

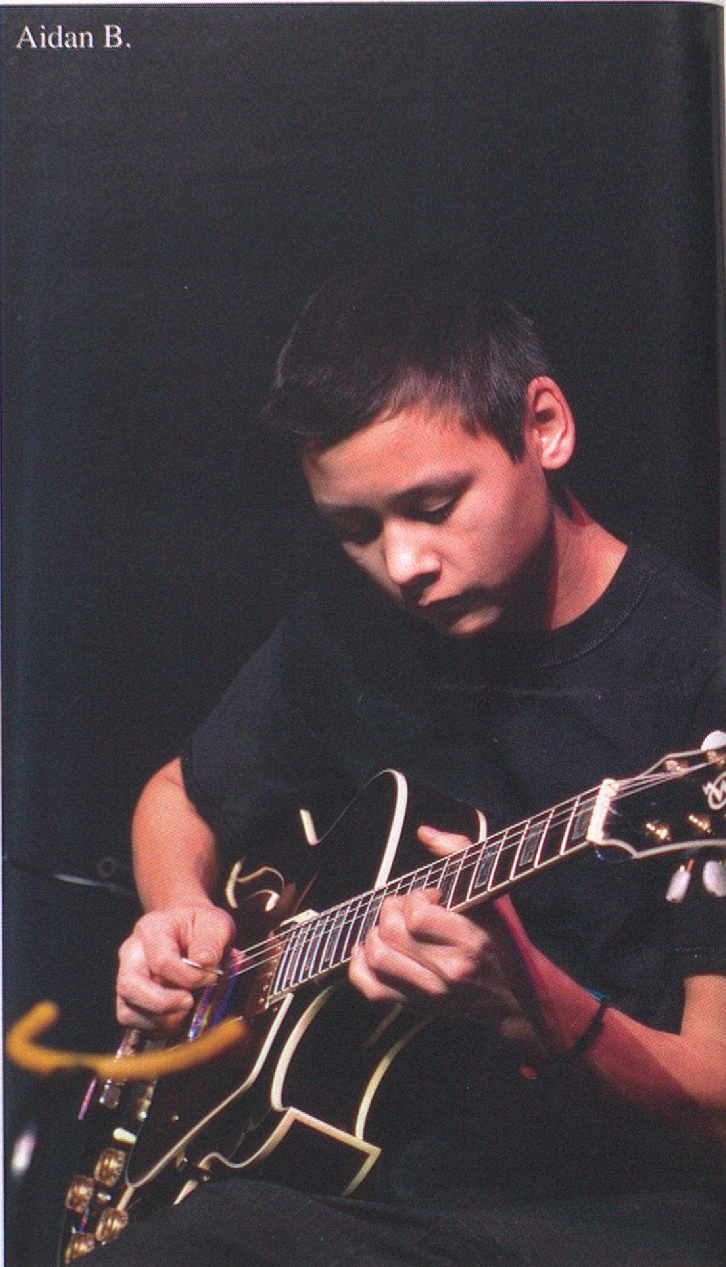
No Need To Fret.

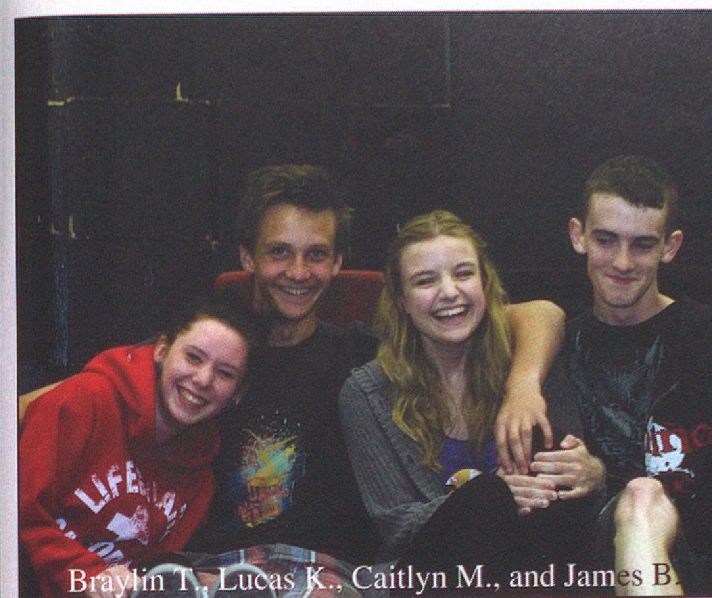

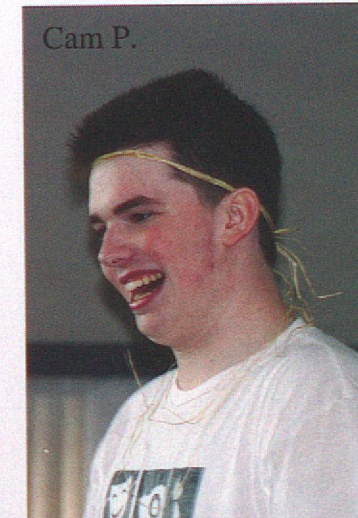

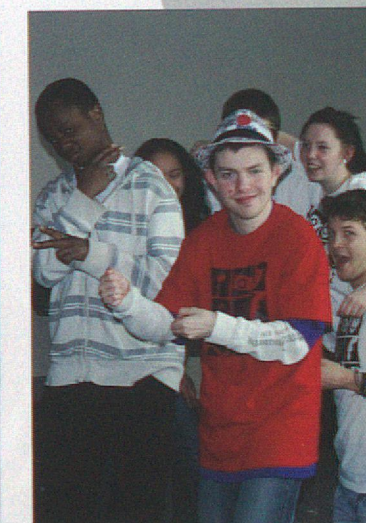

Students also helped the YMCA celebrate I Love to Read week and were a huge hit as guest instructors at the LRSD Co-op Ed Arts Festival.

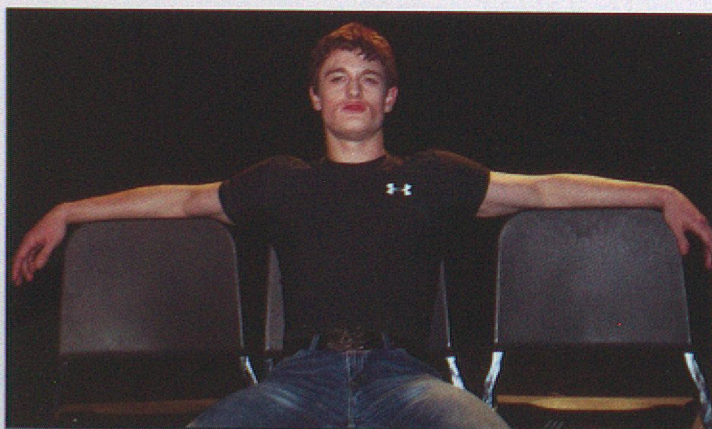


Drama

game. The girls showed tremendous sportsmanship, great heart, and terrific clutch play as they came from the #4 ranking to win it all.

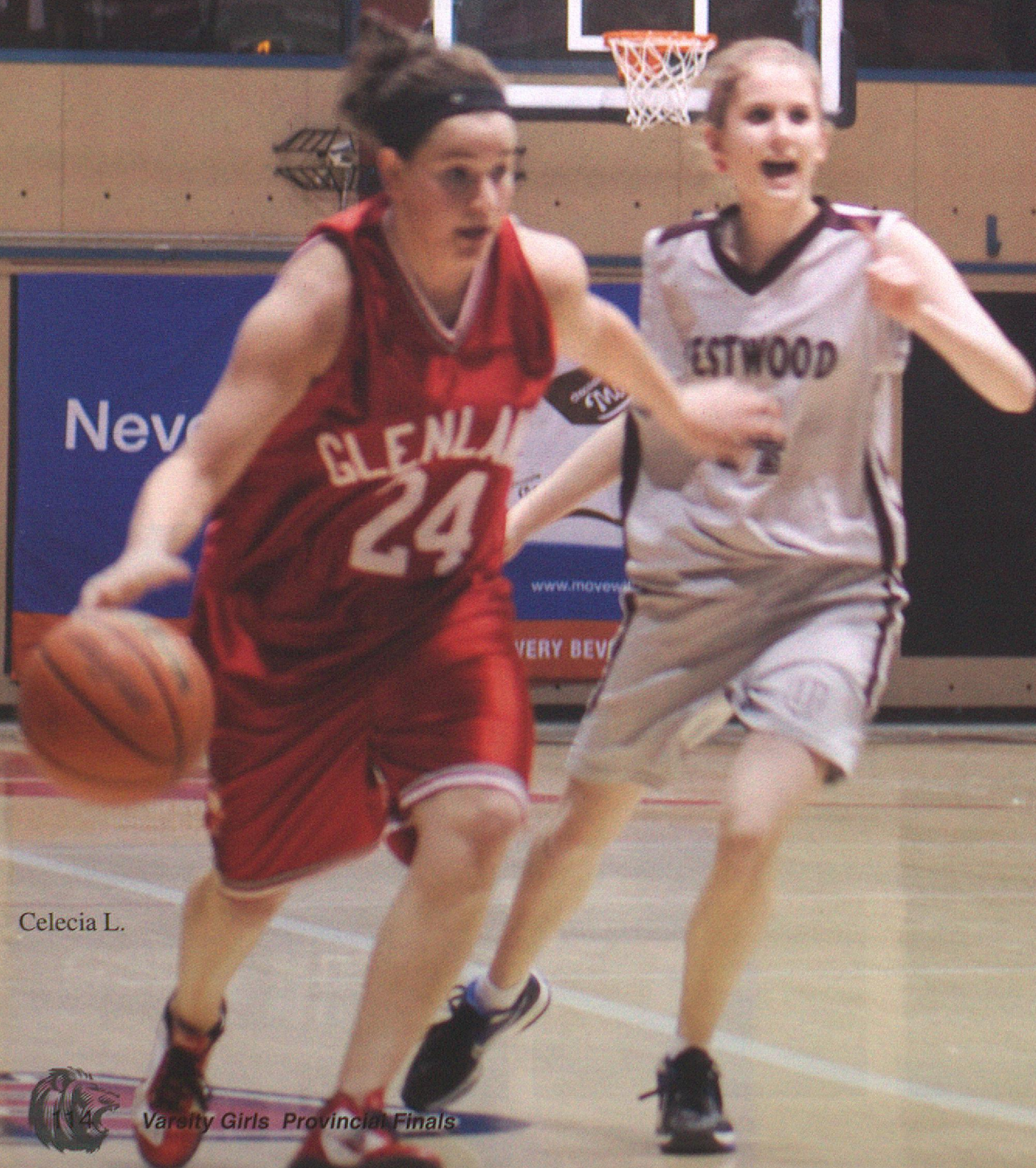

sessions. This inspired full time program is one of the most comprehensive and professional training programs across the country.



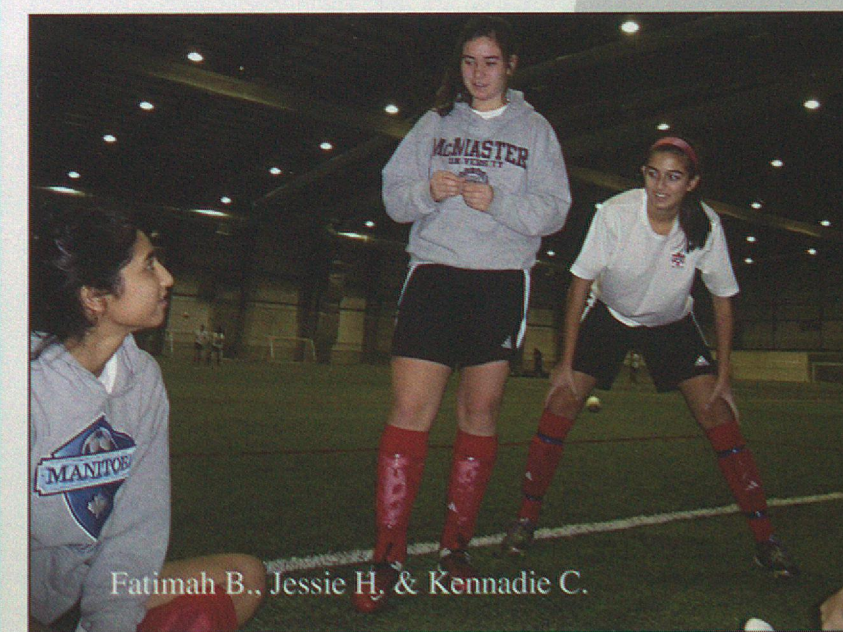

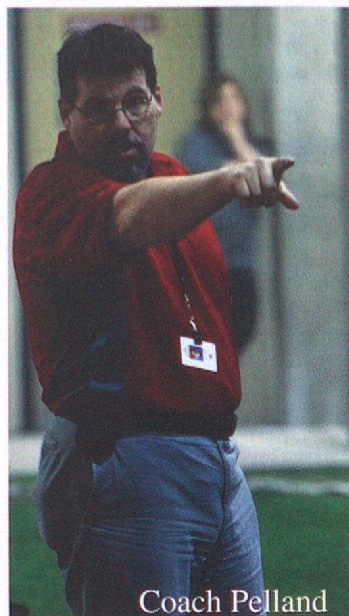

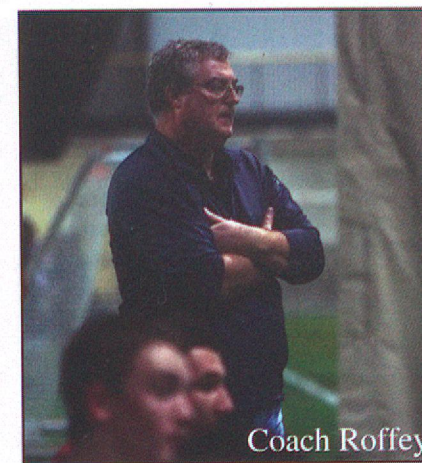
numerous outstanding efforts by the rest of the team. Special thanks to Assistant Coach Amanda Henry for being here to assist the team throughout the season.

This year, the boy's indoor soccer team was young and inexperienced but was led by some very determined young men who showed strong leadership.

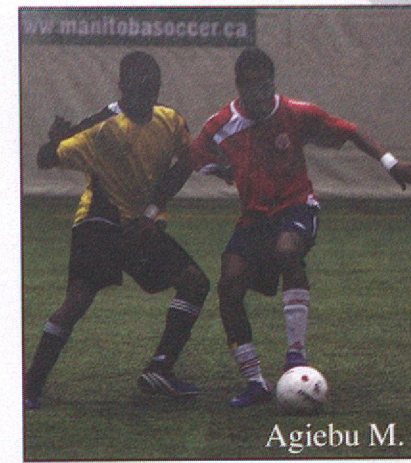

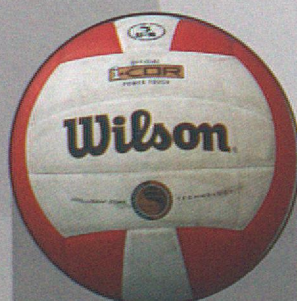


Volleyball

Take the Arab Spring for instance; nothing would have been accomplished if not for the many individuals who worked together to meet their goals.

My personal experience at Glenlawn has been filled with times when teamwork was essential. This past year I was fortunate to be a part of the Varsity basketball team who took home the Provincial title. Our team was clearly talented, but even now when I reflect back on the experience, I know that our success can be largely attributed to our outstanding fan support. Glenlawn Nation, as they are known, is just as much a part of our team as the exceptional people on our roster and bench.

Your positive cheering and constant support were what gained all of Winnipeg's attention. You

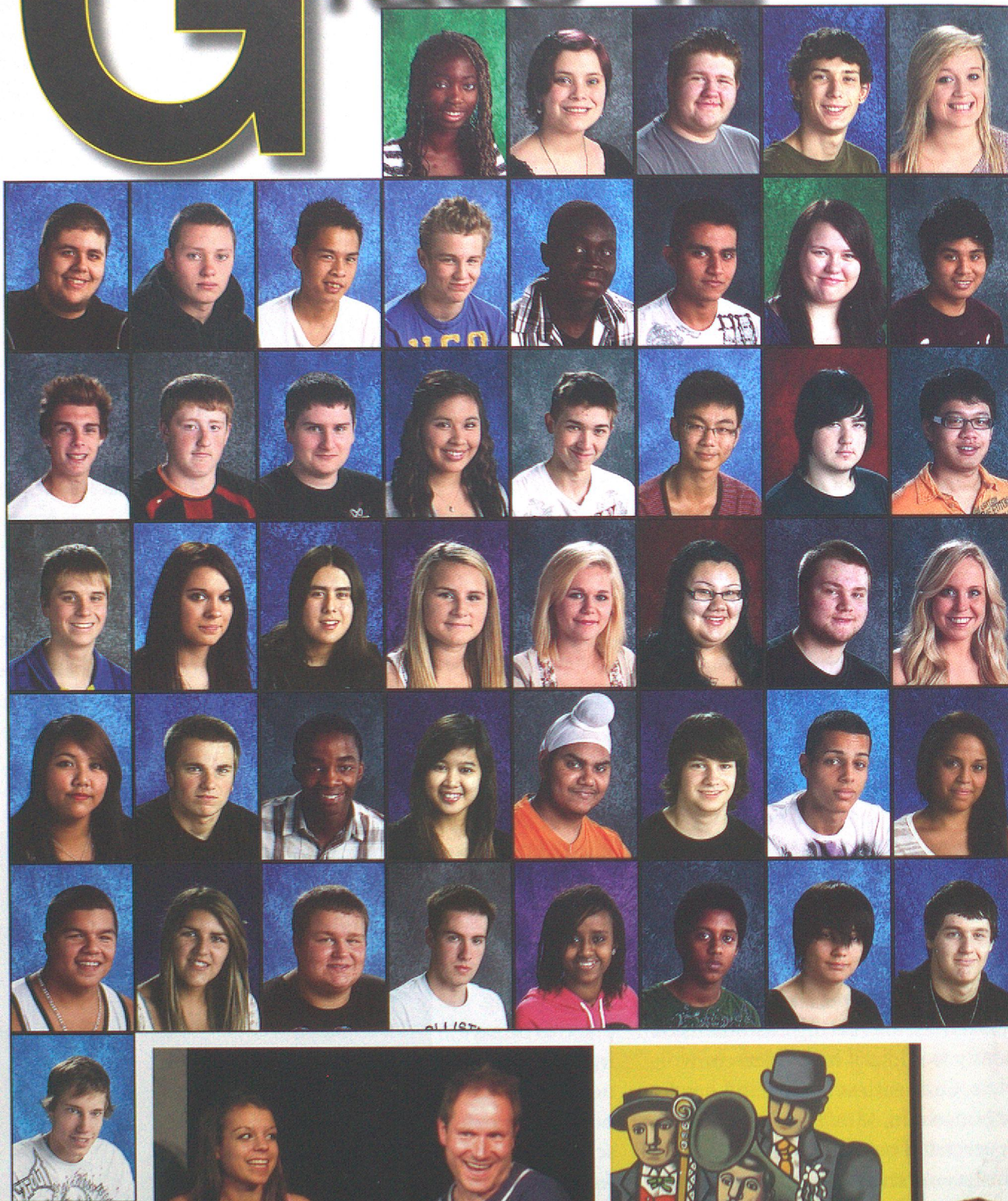

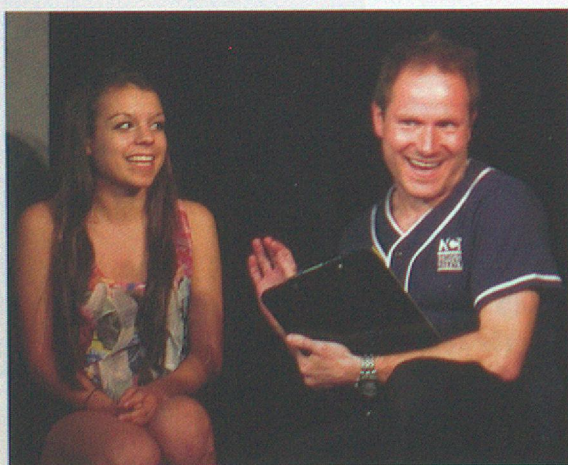

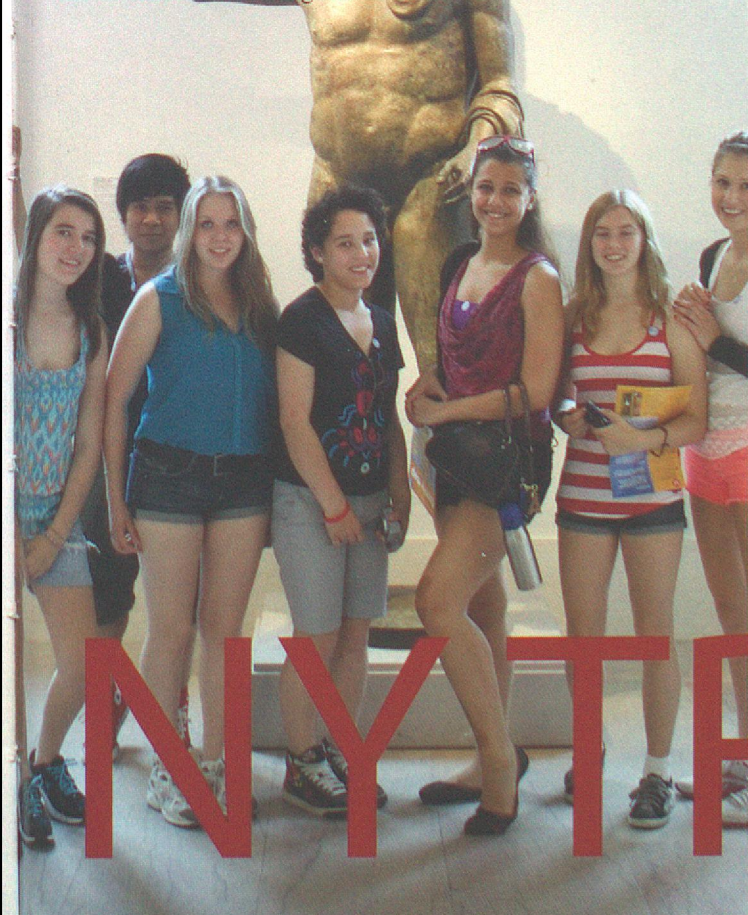

Special thanks goes out to all our travellers who represented Glenlawn in the highest of standards.



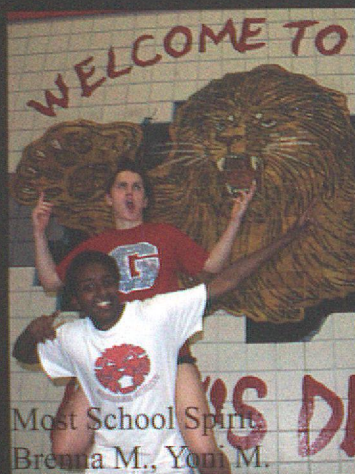
