The process of sci-1 ence is iterative. This means it circles back on itself so that useful ideas are built upon and used to



We believe the evidence is irrefutable. Students think science is super.








and learn first person the challenges and stigmas some people encounter, and what we can all teach each other by listening and sharing in a story.

Students graduate with a high school Co-op Education Program diploma. Entrance into this program requires the approval of an Assistant Superintendent.







Ybook just encouraged us to take more photos. Like, every day!






